I am pleased to suggest the following questions/topics for discussion which can be posed to Mrs. Clinton:

- 1) She can be asked to speak about the administration's emphasis on school-to-work training - which is the exact philosophy of ORT.
- 2) She can be asked about the administration's efforts to promote literacy among both children and adults.
- 3) She can be asked to comment on training women for high-tech fields - ORT has a much higher than average enrollment of women in its technological and scientific programs
- 4) She can be asked to pinpoint three major accomplishments of the administration in promoting quality education in America.
- 5) She can be asked to comment on the need for high-tech training for all Americans - again drawing a connection to the work of ORT.
- 6) She can be asked to comment on the role ORT is playing in Russia and Eastern Europe - the need to bring sophisticated technological training to this part of the world, as well as Jewish history, culture and education to the local communities.

I think if the interview covers these six broad topics, plus anything else you may want to suggest, we will have a wonderful article for *The Reporter*.
