CAMP DAVID NOTES:

For all staff who will be involved in the Presidential visit to Camp David on Tuesday, July 11 and onward, please closely note the following:

ACCESS - Access to Camp David will be granted only to photo credential holders. White House passes will not be recognized. Please contact the Advance Office if you do not already have a credential. Be certain to bring your appropriate Secret Service trip pin as well. If you are traveling separately from the President or will be sleeping outside the camp perimeter, please see *transportation* note below for further access instructions.

CAMERAS and PHOTOGRAPHY- Cameras and photographs are not permitted at Camp David. If you bring a personal camera with you, **it will be confiscated** by the Marine Security Guard Detachment. There are no exceptions for any member of the White House Staff.

COMMUNICATIONS WHILE AT CAMP DAVID

Cellular phones will not function at Camp David.

White House 5-digit dial connections are present in most buildings. Calls to other Camp extensions and back to the White House can be direct dialed, however access to direct dial outside local, domestic and international calls will be blocked.

It is highly advised that you have a WHCA pager (not SkyTel). Please contact the Advance Office asap if you need to sign out one of these pagers.

Staff requiring handheld radios should also contact the Advance Office for issuance asap.

HELICOPTER ARRIVALS and DEPARTURES

The President will travel to and from Camp David via Marine One. Upon arrival, golf carts will be lined up outside the landing zone. Staff should take the appropriate golf cart marked with the name of their individual cabin for their use or may choose to walk.

MOVEMENT AROUND CAMP DAVID

Golf cart (limited availability), bicycle and on foot. All golf carts will be collected nightly for recharging. Contact Camp staff should you require a bicycle.

TRANSPORTATION TO/FROM CAMP DAVID AND ACCESS FOR THOSE TRAVELING INDEPENDENT OF THE PRESIDENT

Individuals are encouraged to car pool in private vehicles. There is no shuttle service from Thrumont, Frederick or Washington, DC to Camp David.

As of 12 noon on Monday, July 10, 2000, the following route must be followed:

MD State Route 77-West to Foxfield/Deerfield Road

Make a right on Foxfield/Deerfield Road follow until you reach Manahan Road

Make a right on Manahan Road follow along until you see a big sign on the left that reads "Round Meadow".

Make a left into Round Meadow and park your personal vehicle in the parking lot. Proceed to the Credential trailer and ask for the transportation van to Camp David. The van will either be directly on-site or called down (approx wait time 5 min). Once you arrive at Camp David, you will be dropped off at the Main Gate. You will have to walk on-foot once you get into Camp and proceed directly to Hickory. Ask the Marines at the main gate for directions. Once you arrive at Hickory, proceed inside to the library for directions to the Summit sites. It is here where you can pick up a bicycle or continue on foot. At the end of the day or upon conclusion of your business, proceed back to the library in Hickory and ask for the transportation van. Once again, it will be dispatched (wait time 5-10 min) and return you to Round Meadow where you will pick up your personal vehicle.

Directions and maps from Maryland and Washington, DC can be obtained from the Advance Office.
