Q: Why are you getting this sudden surge of migrants from Haiti?

A: -- The situation in Haiti grows steadily more difficult as the military leaders continue their stubborn refusal to step down and permit the restoration of democracy and return of President Aristide.

-- The worsening human rights situation led the President to afford all interdicted Haitians the opportunity to apply for refugee status. The human rights situation continues to deteriorate.

-- Now the tighter UN and U.S. sanctions are increasing the pressure in Haiti. We have increased humanitarian assistance and are now feeding 1.4 million Haitians daily but the economic contraction obviously is an impetus to departure.

-- The military leaders bear full responsibility for the sanctions.

Under these circumstances, we anticipated that our provision of a humane arrangement for interdicted Haitians to apply for refugee status would likely lead to an increase in departures.

-- We encourage Haitians to avoid the risky sea voyage and utilize our in-country refugee processing centers, which continue to operate at full capacity. In-country processing remains the safest and most effective route available to those with refugee claims.

Q: What are you going to do about it? Can you handle these numbers?

-- The sudden increase in departures over the last couple of days clearly will test our new arrangements.

-- We will adjust our procedures as needed to cope with the flow in a manner consistent with the new policy the President announced in May.

-- [IF PRESSED] I do not want to get into specifics of new procedures we might implement. We will announce these if and when necessary.

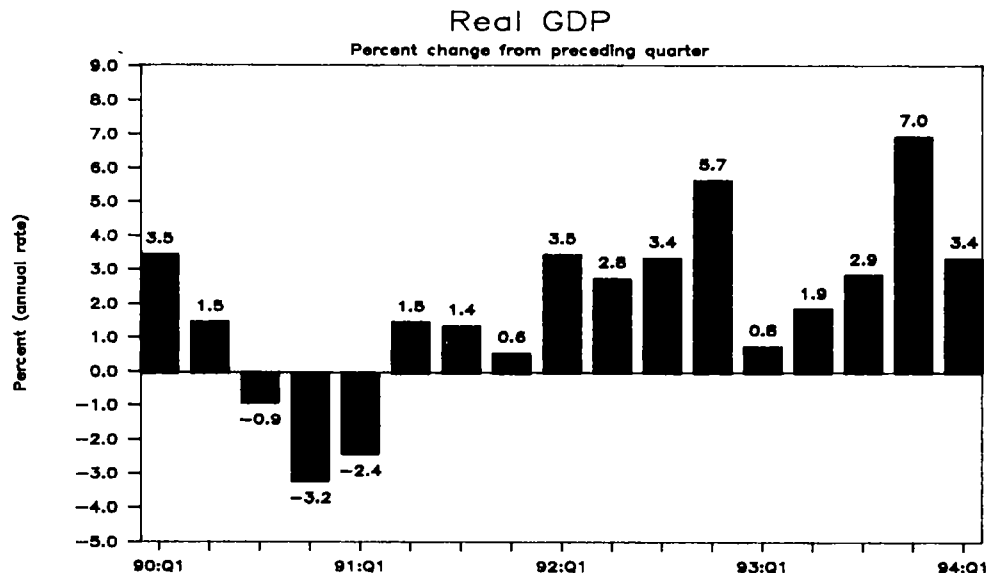

SUBJECT: Final Estimate of First-Quarter GDP, Commerce
Department Release, Wednesday, 8:30 a.m.

Real GDP growth in the first quarter of 1994 was revised upward from a 3.0 percent annual rate to a 3.4 percent rate. Market analysts expected no revision.

- o The largest upward revisions were in spending on personal consumption and fixed investment. There was also some additional inventory accumulation in the first quarter.
- o The upward revision in personal consumption expenditures was partially offset by a downward revision of exports and an upward revision of imports.
- o Inflation, as measured by the GDP deflator, remained at an annual rate of 2.6 percent for the first quarter of 1994.

TALKING POINTS ON RENEWABLE FUEL/ETHANOL

June 29, 1994

Tomorrow, June 30th, Administrator Browner is expected to announce EPA's final rule on renewable fuels and ethanol. The announcement is tentative until we receive clearance from OMB, which we expect today.

The following are talking points on renewable fuels if asked today. Later today, we will fax a separate set of talking points for use after the announcement is made by Administrator Browner.

Per Loretta Ucelli, EPA Associate Administrator, Communication, Education and Public Affairs:

- ◆ In the next day or so, EPA is expected to announce its final rulemaking on renewable fuels -- fuels that come from unlimited resources like corn, grain or garbage.
- ◆ As you know, renewable fuels, when added to gasoline, result in cleaner burning gasoline.
- ◆ President Clinton has a long standing commitment to renewable fuels made from products grown by American farmers. EPA has proposed to make these fuels part of its clean gasoline program. Obviously, the final rule will reflect these considerations.
- ◆ EPA is considering the use of renewable fuels because they are good for the environment, good for the economy and good for energy security. If they are part of the clean gasoline program, they will help reduce smog in the nation's most polluted cities and help promote home grown, American products and environmentally friendly jobs.

If asked how this rule is different from what the Bush Administration proposed:

- ◆ Unlike the Bush Administration, we are attempting to arrive at a solution that is better for the environment and public health, better for American farmers, better for refiners -- and that's what's best for America.

Notes on Final estimate of First Quarter GDP

- o The final estimate of real GDP in the First Quarter of 1994 (released this morning by Commerce) shows an increase of 3.4 percent (annual rate), up 0.4 percentage point from the "preliminary" estimate of 3.0 percent. This revision is average in size.
- o The general picture of economic activity was little changed from last month: consumer and investment spending more than accounted for the increase in real GDP; a decrease in government spending and a rise in the deficit of net exports partly offset these increases.
- o Corporate profits in the first quarter from the current production decreased \$29.9 billion. Almost all of the decrease reflected damage to private capital and net insurance losses due to the California earthquake.
