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SPECIAL REPORT

FORTHCOMING BOOKS

This Special Report is based on two upcoming books by the United States Institute of Peace Press by three distinguished diplomats who had critical roles in efforts by the United States and the United Nations to rescue Somalia from humanitarian tragedy and political chaos.

In *Somalia: The Missed Opportunities* (USIP Press: September 1994), Mohamed Sahnoun, who served as special representative for the UN Secretary General in 1992, considers the actions which might have prevented the escalation of the famine and the political unrest in Somalia into a humanitarian and political nightmare.

In *Somalia and Operation Restore Hope: Reflections on Peacemaking and Peacekeeping* (USIP Press: 1995), Robert Oakley and John Hirsch examine the U.S. intervention in Somalia and the knotty relationship between the U.S. and UN during the operation. Oakley was special envoy to Somalia for Presidents Clinton and Bush and Hirsch was political adviser to the United Task Force. The book contains a foreword by Chester A. Crocker, former assistant secretary of state for African affairs and chairman of the Institute's board of directors.

Restoring Hope: The Real Lessons of Somalia for the Future of Intervention

Key Points

Public reaction to U.S. intervention in Somalia has been overwhelmingly negative. "Somalia" has become a symbol for the unacceptable costs of humanitarian intervention and for the type of foreign involvement the United States should avoid in the future. In contrast, however, those who were involved directly with events conclude that substantial good was done, although there were problems and missteps. In their view, U.S. involvement meant that countless lives were saved; and violence and disorder were reduced to the extent that steps toward political reconciliation could begin. There are, in addition, positive lessons from Somalia that would make any such future humanitarian interventions more effective:

- **Preventive diplomacy.** Preventive diplomacy must come into wider and more expert use. Greater use of preventive diplomacy will require careful attention to threats of conflict, thoughtful analysis of political developments, and attentiveness to warnings and requests for help. It is important not only to notice such openings, but to imagine the shape of appropriate forms of early intervention—negotiation, mediation, formal or informal diplomacy, etc.—for each. Considerable thought needs to be given, as well, to the question of how to secure the services of the best qualified personnel to undertake preventive diplomacy missions.
- **Non-UN multilateral intervention.** Possibilities for non-UN multilateral action by regional and other coalitions, whether or not it entails actual intervention, should be developed. Fostering regional means of conflict resolution may also help avoid the echo of colonialism that some hear when large Western countries intervene.
- **Need for UN reform.** The UN's unwieldy bureaucracy must be streamlined and its efforts better organized if it is going to respond effectively to the swiftly changing, highly volatile situations created by the new spate of ethnic and regional conflicts. If its efforts continue to dissipate because of the bureaucratic separation of humanitarian, military, political, and financial activities, the UN will fail to become an effective instrument of humanitarian intervention.

Marty is also an active District Democrat who feels that, albeit a small claim, the facts of General Jama's predicament may open a closed foreign policy chapter and cause embarrassment to the Administration. He wants to avoid that.

After reviewing the enclosed, I am asking you to consider giving Marty a bit of your time. He feels that a directive from the NSC to "resolve this" is sufficient to make the Department of Defense and State Department do the right thing so that this will go away.

Dear Senator Kempthorne:

Thank you for your March 8 letter to Secretary Christopher regarding the presence of U.S. military and diplomatic personnel in Somalia after March 31. The Secretary has asked me to reply.

In announcing the decision to withdraw the bulk of American combat troops from Somalia on March 31, President Clinton made clear that American support for the U.N. effort in Somalia would continue beyond that date. Congress made specific provision for such support in the Defense Department appropriations bill passed last December. This measure allows for the continued presence in Somalia of a limited number of U.S. troops for the protection of Americans and our diplomatic facilities and to advise the U.N. military commander.

The President outlined our policy in his October 7 address to the nation on Somalia and in a report to Congress issued one week later. In his speech, the President said that the U.S. will "help the U.N. maintain a secure environment" while pursuing "new diplomatic efforts to help the Somalis find a political solution to their problems ... the only kind of outcome that can endure." To implement this policy, the President explained that "All American troops will be out of Somalia no later than March 31, except for a few hundred support personnel in noncombat roles." In his report to Congress, issued on October 13, the President discussed the issue further. The report notes that, "After March 31, 1994, there will be no US military units in Somalia, with the possible exception of approximately 200 to 300 military personnel providing assistance and protection to the US Liaison Office." The report also indicates that a limited number of American troops "may remain in the UN Force Command headquarters ..." These actions will help us to meet the central goal articulated by the President, giving the Somalis "a reasonable chance" to resolve their own problems.

To help carry out the mission outlined by the President last October, we intend to maintain a small presence of 25-30 officials assigned to Mogadishu after March 31. The U.S.

Liaison Office (USLO) has responsibility for an assistance program of over \$100 million, including our part of efforts to help rebuild the Somalia police force. USLO also provides official on-the-ground liaison to UNOSOM. As agreed with the Congress, under two dozen American civilian and military personnel will be assigned to assist the U.N. in areas where they have specific expertise.

Like you, we are concerned about the security situation in Somalia. Let me assure you that we are keeping it under continuous review and that we will structure our presence in the country in light of the situation. In recognition of the situation, approximately 50 F.A.S.T. Marines will remain in Somalia to provide security for several months beyond March 31. We have planned and conducted exercises against the possibility of an emergency evacuation involving American citizens. We will keep these plans up-to-date in the months ahead.

Thank you for expressing your concern about the situation in Somalia. I can assure you that we are alert to security considerations and that all elements of the U.S. government are working to assure the continued safety of our personnel after March 31.

We hope you will find this information helpful. Please do not hesitate to contact us for additional information.

Dear Secretary Christopher:

I am writing to express my concern regarding the proposal to leave U.S. diplomatic personnel, and a security detachment of Marines, in Mogadishu, Somalia after March 31.

In January, I visited Mogadishu and saw first-hand the difficult conditions in which our diplomatic and military personnel are asked to serve. When I returned to the U.S., I sent a letter to Senators Nunn and Thurmond expressing concern that, given the President's statements, the American people expect all U.S. military personnel to be withdrawn from Somalia by March 31. I fear that if Americans are injured in Somalia after March 31, the American people may feel deceived.

Over the last few weeks, I have discussed this issue with Secretary Perry, General Shalikashvili and General Hoar. I remain concerned that the deteriorating security environment in Somalia may place the Americans at risk after March 31.

Before the United States decides to leave American diplomatic and military personnel in Somalia after March 31, I believe we must carefully weigh the benefits of maintaining a diplomatic presence against the possible risks to our people. While weighing these risks, the U.S. should recognize that the UNOSOM commander, General Bir, openly acknowledges that the foreign troops that remain in Somalia after the U.S. withdrawal will be very reluctant to fight. I firmly believe the U.S. should consider all of the alternatives, such as basing our diplomats in Kenya, to maintaining a diplomatic mission in Somalia.

Thank you for considering these important issues and I look forward to your response.
