SUBJECT: HIGHLIGHTS OF HANDOVER FROM UNITAF TO UNOSOM

II

1. IN A TWENTY-MINUTE CEREMONY UNDER A BLAZING SUN, THE FORMAL MILITARY HANDOFF FROM LT GEN ROBERT JOHNSTON, USMC, COMMANDER UNITAF FORCES TO LT GEN CEVIC BIR, COMMANDER OF UNOSOM II MILITARY FORCES, TOOK PLACE AT 1125Z (1425L) ON 4 MAY 1993. BEFORE AN ASSEMBLY OF MOSTLY FOREIGN MILITARY OFFICERS, MOGADISHU'S TINY DIPLOMATIC CORPS AND A GROUP OF SOMALI POLICE COMMANDERS AND JUDGES, AS WELL AS COMPANY MADE UP OF MEN AND WOMEN SOLDIERS REPRESENTING THE MANY COUNTRIES THAT MADE UP UNITAF FORCES, GENERAL JOHNSTON CONTRASTED THE SOMALI SITUATION OF 9 DECEMBER 1992 WITH THE SOMALIA OF 4 MAY: STARVATION, MISERY AND INSECURITY THEN, A CITY WITH MARKETS OPENING, PEOPLE CIRCULATING FREELY, AND PEOPLE PATCHING UP THEIR HOMES AND SHOPS TODAY. HE PAID SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO FORMER AMBASSADOR OAKLEY AND FORMER DCM JOHN HIRSCH FOR THEIR EFFORTS COMBINING THEIR DIPLOMACY WITH UNITAF MILITARY FORCE EFFECTIVELY IN THE EARLY DAYS OF THE DEPLOYMENT. NO "WARLORDS" WERE INVITED TO THE TURNOVER CEREMONIES.

2. AFTER GENERAL JOHNSTON'S PERSONAL THREE STAR FLAG AND THE STARS AND STRIPES WERE LOWERED OVER THE FORMER U.S. EMBASSY CHANCERY BUILDING, GENERAL BIR'S THREE STAR PERSONAL FLAG, AND THE BLUE UN FLAG WERE RAISED, WHILE PAKISTANI MILITARY BAGPIPERS AND DRUMMERS MADE APPROPRIATE MUSIC. BOTH GENERALS JOHNSTON AND BIR PAID SPECIAL TRIBUTE TO THE

PAKISTANIS, WHO PROVIDED THE FIRST UN TROOP DETACHMENT THAT OCCUPIED THE AIRFIELD, UNDER FIRE FOR SEVERAL WEEKS, BEFORE THE ARRIVAL OF THE UNITAF FORCE. GENERAL BIR WARMLY THANKED GENERAL JOHNSTON AND THE UNITAF COMMAND FOR THEIR ASSISTANCE IN THE TURNOVER PROCESS DURING THE LAST SEVERAL WEEKS. BIR CONCLUDED HIS REMARKS WITH AN EXHORTATION TO THE SOMALI PEOPLE OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITY TO WORK WITH THE UNITED NATIONS SO THAT THE TRANSITION TO A STABLE SOCIETY MAY BE ATTAINED QUICKLY.

3. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SECRETARY-GENERAL, ADMIRAL JONATHAN HOWE, BEGAN HIS PRESENTATION WITH A REQUEST FOR A MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR THOSE SERVICEMEN OF ALL NATIONS, AS WELL AS SOMALIS, WHO DIED IN THE SERVICE OF OPERATION RESTORE HOPE. HE THEN DELIVERED A BRIEF STATEMENT IN WHICH HE LAUDED THE EFFORTS OF GENERAL JOHNSTON IN FULFILLING THE MANDATE OF OPERATION RESTORE HOPE AND EXPRESSED ENTHUSIASM FOR THE WORK BEFORE "OPERATION CONTINUE HOPE," THE SUCCESSOR OPERATION TO RESTORE HOPE. A SEPARATE STATEMENT TO THE PEOPLE OF SOMALIA, FROM SECRETARY-GENERAL BOUTROS-GHALI, ASSURING THEM OF CONTINUITY OF EFFORT FROM UNITAF TO UNOSOM AND CALLING UPON THEM TO WORK WITH THE UNITED NATIONS IN RESTORING THEIR COUNTRY, WAS DISTRIBUTED TO THE PRESS.

4. FOLLOWING THE HANDOVER CEREMONY, GENERAL JOHNSTON AND HIS COMMAND STAFF IMMEDIATELY SET OFF FOR THE AIRPORT AND THE LONG TRIP HOME TO CAMP PENDLETON. WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THEIR INSTRUCTIONS, THEY DID A SUPERLATIVE JOB. UNDER THEIR CONTROL, ACUTE STARVATION WAS ERADICATED, AND THE PEOPLE OF SOMALIA HAD A RESPITE FROM THE CONTINUING CYCLE OF WAR AND INSECURITY. MORE COMMENTS ON THE HANDOVER SEPTTEL.

2. THIS IS AN ACTION MESSAGE: SEE PARA. 4.

3. AS THE UNITED NATIONS LEADERSHIP REVIEWS ITS OPTIONS FOR RESPONDING TO THE JUNE 5 ATTACKS ON UNOSOM II, IT IS CLEAR THAT UN ACTION AGAINST AIDEED'S FORCES WOULD ALSO SEND A STRONG MESSAGE BEYOND SOMALIA. DEALING EFFECTIVELY WITH AIDEED WOULD ESTABLISH A POSITIVE PRECEDENT FOR UN EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY. THERE WILL BE INTENSE MEDIA ATTENTION TO THE UN'S RESPONSE, AND IT WILL BE IMPORTANT TO EMPHASIZE THE LEADERSHIP ROLE OF THE UN.

4. MISSION SHOULD COORDINATE WITH APPROPRIATE SECRETARIAT OFFICIALS A UN PUBLIC AFFAIRS APPROACH TO ACTIONS IN SOMALIA. FOLLOWING ARE THEMES THE UN MAY WISH TO DRAW UPON IN A STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY GENERAL OR OTHER UN SPOKESMAN. U.S. BELIEVES IT WILL BE IMPORTANT TO MAKE SUCH A STATEMENT PROMPTLY.

A. THE ACTION IS PRECEDENT-SETTING

-- THE UN RECOGNIZES THE GRAVITY OF THE SITUATION IN TAKING SUCH ACTION.

-- THE UN WILL NOT ALLOW A FACTIONAL LEADER TO CHALLENGE THE AUTHORITY OF THE WORLD BODY, AS EXPRESSED THROUGH SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS.

-- THE UN STANDS READY TO BACK UP CHAPTER VII SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS, AS REQUIRED.

B. UN LEADERSHIP SEEN IN A POSITIVE ROLE

-- THE UN ACTED ON BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF SOMALIA, WHO HAD BEEN SUBJECT TO THE ARBITRARY POWER OF WARLORDS.

-- UNOSOM II AT NO TIME DEVIATED FROM ITS MANDATE FROM THE SECURITY COUNCIL.

-- THE UN MAKES NO CLAIM TO AND HAS NO DESIRE TO EXERCISE SOVEREIGN POWER IN SOMALIA; IN THE ABSENCE OF A SOMALI-DESIGNATED AUTHORITY, IT MUST PROTECT ITS OWN PEOPLE FROM ATTACK.

C. ACTION ESSENTIAL TO MAINTAIN INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY

-- THE SECURITY COUNCIL ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS NOTED THE THREAT TO PEACE AND SECURITY PRESENT IN SOMALIA.

-- SOMALI REFUGEES ARE ALREADY DISPERSED THROUGHOUT THE REGION; CONTINUED FIGHTING WOULD ONLY AGGRAVATE THAT SITUATION.

-- ACTION IS CLEARLY REQUIRED TO DEFEND THOSE TROOPS REPRESENTING THE UNITED NATIONS AND TO BRING ABOUT NATIONAL RECONCILIATION IN SOMALIA.

D. ACTION IN DEFENSE OF HUMANITARIAN GOALS

-- WORLD OPINION KNOWS WELL THE HORRIFIC CONDITIONS OF FAMINE AND STARVATION THAT BROUGHT THE UNITED NATIONS TO ENDORSE MILITARY ACTION IN SOMALIA LAST YEAR.

-- THE UN CANNOT LET THE GAINS ACHIEVED AT GREAT COST BE LOST TO THE ACTIVITIES OF INTRANSIGENT FACTION LEADERS WHO

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REFUSE TO ABANDON MILITARY POWER AS AN INSTRUMENT FOR POLITICAL ADVANTAGE.

-- THE UN WILL CONTINUE TO FULFILL ITS MANDATE OF PROVIDING SECURITY FOR HUMANITARIAN OPERATIONS; AS POSSIBLE, IT WILL ENCOURAGE POLITICAL RECONCILIATION AMONG THOSE WILLING TO USE PEACEFUL MEANS.

E. SPECIFICS WILL DEPEND ON THE OUTCOME; THE UN SHOULD BE READY TO GET THE MESSAGE OUT EXPEDITIOUSLY.

-- THE UNITED NATIONS SHOULD BE PREPARED FOR MASSIVE PRESS INQUIRIES AND FOR CRITICAL COMMENTARY.

-- TO THE DEGREE POSSIBLE, MATERIAL SHOULD BE READY IN ADVANCE OF INQUIRIES, ILLUSTRATING A PRO-ACTIVE RATHER THAN REACTIVE CAMPAIGN.

-- PROMPT AND ACCURATE REPORTING FROM UNOSOM SOURCES IN SOMALIA TO UN HEADQUARTERS WILL BE THE MOST EFFECTIVE MEANS FOR THE SECRETARIAT TO COUNTER THE EXPECTED ALTERNATIVE SOURCES OF INFORMATION AND MISINFORMATION THAT MAY BE DISTRIBUTED AT THE SAME TIME.

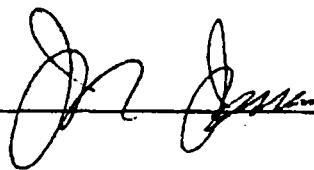

STATEMENT TO THE PEOPLE OF SOMALIA

JONATHAN T. HOWE

SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
FOR SOMALIA

JUNE 12, 1993

I want to report to you today on actions taken by the United Nations to restore safety to the streets of Mogadishu. Re-establishment of public order is the goal most often expressed to me by Somalis in every region -- community leaders and faction leaders alike. All of us understand that without law and order, the rebuilding of normal life in the country cannot continue, international relief workers cannot operate, and feeding stations will be forced to close. The world community wishes to help Somalia's recovery, reconstruction and future development; however, donors will not be able to provide assistance unless there is peace and stability in the country. Most Somalis understand these facts, reject violence and wish to move towards reconciliation.

Regrettably, certain elements in south Mogadishu have deliberately disrupted the safety and security of Somali citizens and of United Nations personnel. On June 5 -- a time of holy rejoicing for Muslims -- twenty-three gallant soldiers of the Pakistan brigade of UNOSOM II were murdered as they sought to serve the neediest people in the city. Twelve of the soldiers were helping unload food at a

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feeding station when they were foully attacked by cowards who placed women and children in front of armed men. The world's outrage at these unprovoked attacks is represented by Resolution 837, which was passed unanimously by the UN Security Council.

Since June 5, one faction, the USC/sna, has deliberately raised tension in the city by using Radio Mogadishu to incite Somalis against the international community. Snipers have destabilized the streets and frightened law-abiding citizens; relief workers, trying to take food to the needy, have been forced to stop their operations.

These disruptions of public order are not acceptable to the vast majority of Somalis or to the international community. They should likewise be unacceptable to each one of the fifteen faction leaders who at Addis Ababa committed their organizations to ceasefire and disarmament. These disruptions are not acceptable to the United Nations Security Council, which has authorized the Secretary General to take "all necessary measures against all those responsible for the armed attacks," including "against those responsible for publicly inciting such attacks."

In accordance with UN Security Council Resolution 837, UNOSOM acted this morning to remove Radio Mogadishu -- which is the property of all the people of Somalia -- from the control of the single faction which has been using this state property for private factional

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ends. The United Nations will return custody of all station facilities to the Somali people.

At the Addis Ababa talks, all signatories agreed to disarm. It is clear to me that this agreement represents the genuine wish of the Somali people. In Mogadishu, however, far too many weapons exist, both inside and outside authorized storage areas. The USC/sna has shown no inclination to undertake a program of disarmament. Instead, it has continued to increase its stockpiles of weapons and ammunition, and has moved arms and vehicles out of authorized weapons storage sites -- in direct violation of agreements. To reduce the threat to public safety posed by these activities, UNOSOM today began a program of disarmament in Mogadishu by destroying and immobilizing arms in two USC/sna weapons storage sites.

United Nations forces intend vigorously to enforce disarmament everywhere in the city, against any faction or individual who chooses to defy the will of the majority of Somalis, expressed at Addis Ababa, and to defy the will of the international community, expressed by the United Nations Security Council in Resolutions 814 and 837. We call on all Somalis to cooperate in ridding Mogadishu of weapons that have caused so much grief and tragedy. We must work together to ensure the safety of all Somalis.

I want to emphasize that the Security Council insists on the

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"crucial importance of the early implementation of the disarmament of all Somali parties" and of "neutralizing radio broadcasting systems that contribute to the violence and attacks directed against UNOSOM II." We will not tolerate further risk to Somali citizens from the selfish ambitions of armed bandits.

UN forces, led by LTG Cevik Bir, represent the world's pledge to the Somali people that UNOSOM II will responsibly and resolutely defend the rights of all Somalis. Today's actions were taken in a careful way that minimizes danger to civilians.

Our forces are strong; already the troops of 20 nations have gathered here, and many thousands more are scheduled to arrive soon from additional UN member states.

UNOSOM II is impartial and takes no sides in disputes among factions or clans. There are already sixty-six nations represented on the UNOSOM II civilian staff. The United Nations will never impose a trusteeship on Somalia. UNOSOM II's goal is to allow representative government to emerge in the country and to return the Somali nation to the hands of the Somali people as soon as possible.

All UNOSOM military and civilian personnel are dedicated to helping Somalis unite to heal the wounds of civil war. UNOSOM will not permit one faction to prevent the distribution of food supplies, or

to slow the rebuilding of schools, clinics, and roads. Investigations of cease-fire and disarmament violations will be conducted expeditiously. I will report to the Somali people and to the Security Council the results of the current UNOSOM II review of the events of June 5 as the investigation progresses.

During the last month, Somalia's recovery has been showing great promise. Many people have begun to produce goods and services and are developing new businesses. Tens of thousands of children have been able to return to school. On the day before the June 5 ambushes of UNOSOM II troops, I visited several villages outside Baidoa and saw the new crops rising from the earth. Animals are being exported from the country's ports. Signs of normalcy have begun returning to Somalia. We must not allow this recovery to be jeopardized.

I call today on all Somalis to put aside factional ambition, and to respect the agreement signed at Addis Ababa. Cooperate with UNOSOM II. Turn in your weapons. Report arms caches and storage sites. Turn your attention from destruction to the reconstruction of your city and your country. UNOSOM II is here for only one purpose -- to work with you for the rebirth of Somalia. With your cooperation, there can be peace in the country, there can be recovery, there can be hope. Let us resolve today to work together for Somalia's future.

- Q. What is the Administration's reaction the death of 20 Somali civilian at the hands of the U.N. contingent?
- A. -- We deeply regret the loss of life in Somalia resulting from this and other recent incidents. The U.N. forces have stated that they believed they were shooting only at armed people. They believed that this was a repeat of the savage attack of June 5, when 23 of their comrades were ambushed by people hiding behind women and children.
- We support the U.N.'s announcement that they are conducting an investigation to determine what actually occurred during the demonstrations on Sunday. We will withhold any further comment until that investigation is completed.
- Q. Independent observers, such as representatives of NGO's, have described callous actions by the Pakistani peacekeepers, including killing of children and refusal to help the wounded. What action do you plan to take against the peacekeepers if these allegations are found to be true?
- A. -- It is for the United Nations to determine if peacekeepers under their authority acted within the terms of engagement defined for their mission in Somalia.
- Q. Does President Clinton have second thoughts now about approving the air strikes over the weekend?
- A. -- The air strikes in Mogadishu this weekend were carried out to minimize the risk of danger to civilians, and have considerably reduced the stocks of weapons, ammunition and military vehicles. These attacks have greatly lessened the capacity of General Aideed to wreck havoc on the people of Somalia.
- Q. Have the United States and the United Nations lost the moral high ground because of this attack? One NGO official said that the U.N. blue flag is in danger of becoming a dirty rag in the minds of the Somalis.
- A. -- We should not allow the events of the last 10 days obscure the real progress that has occurred in Somalia since the engagement of U.S. forces late last year and the introduction of the UNOSOM forces thereafter.
- As the President noted on Saturday, by the time we arrived, more than 350,000 Somalis had died in a savage civil war that had caused the disintegration of Somali society. Today, crops are being planted and harvested,

schools and hospitals are re-opening, and refugees are returning home.

- General Aideed and others are trying to divert attention from their own lawless actions by focussing on this latest incident. The truth is that it was the cold-blood ambush by Aideed's forces on U.N. peacekeepers that has caused the recent destabilization.

Q. Is the United Nations still committed to going after Aideed?

- A. -- The United Nations remains committed to following through on its Security Council resolution calling for the detention and ultimate trial of the faction leaders responsible for the killings on June 5.

Q. What are U.S. objectives in participating in this action in Somalia?

A. -- AS PRESIDENT CLINTON SAID IN HIS RADIO ADDRESS ON SATURDAY:

(OUR ACTION)"... WAS ESSENTIAL TO SEND A CLEAR MESSAGE TO THE ARMED GANGS, TO PROTECT THE VAST MAJORITY OF SOMALIS WHO LONG FOR PEACE, TO ENHANCE THE SECURITY OF OUR FORCES STILL IN SOMALIA, TO HASTEN THE DAY WHEN THEY CAN SAFELY RETURN HOME, AND TO STRENGTHEN THE EFFECTIVENESS AND CREDIBILITY OF U.N. PEACEKEEPING IN SOMALIA AND AROUND THE WORLD.

"THE U.S. MUST CONTINUE TO PLAY ITS UNIQUE ROLE OF LEADERSHIP IN THE WORLD. BUT NOW WE CAN INCREASINGLY EXPRESS THAT LEADERSHIP THROUGH MULTILATERAL MEANS SUCH AS THE UNITED NATIONS, WHICH SPREAD THE COSTS AND EXPRESSED THE UNIFIED WILL OF THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY."

-- THIS ENFORCEMENT ACTION IS IN SUPPORT OF UN SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 837 CALLING FOR AGGRESSIVE ACTION AGAINST THE PERPETRATORS OF THE JUNE 5 ATTACK ON UNOSOM II COALITION FORCES.

-- U.S. ACTION IN SOMALIA IS IN SUPPORT OF THE UN AND OF UNOSOM II.

-- THE UN IS TRYING TO REESTABLISH LAW AND ORDER IN SOMALIA IN A DELIBERATE AND WELL-PLANNED FASHION.

-- UNITED NATIONS FORCES IN SOMALIA (UNOSOM II) ARE AUTHORIZED BY UN SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS 814 AND 837 TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY MEASURES TO FULFILL THE UN MANDATE IN THAT COUNTRY.

-- RESOLUTION 837 ALSO REAFFIRMS THE MANDATE OF UNOSOM II TO ESTABLISH "EFFECTIVE AUTHORITY...THROUGHOUT SOMALIA." WE SUPPORT VIGOROUS IMPLEMENTATION OF THAT MANDATE.

Q. How many people have been killed on both sides?

A. -- NEITHER UNOSOM II NOR AMERICANS INVOLVED HAVE INCURRED ANY FATALITIES.

-- WE DO NOT HAVE A FIRM NUMBER OF HOW MANY SOMALIS HAVE BEEN KILLED. NUMBERS WE HAVE SEEN IN THE PRESS RANGE FROM 6 TO 34, WITH ANYWHERE FROM 14 TO 48 WOUNDED.

Q: What military actions have been taken by UNOSOM II since Friday?

A: -- ON FRIDAY NIGHT UNOSOM AND THE US QUICK REACTION FORCE (QRF) KNOCKED OUT AIDEED'S RADIO STATION, DESTROYED AN AIDEED STRONGHOLD AND TWO ARMS STORAGE SITES AND SECURED TWO OTHER WEAPONS STORAGE FACILITIES. USAF AC-130 GUNSHIPS AND US QRF HELICOPTERS PLAYED A LEAD ROLE. THERE WAS LITTLE SOMALI OPPOSITION AND NO UNOSOM CASUALTIES. ABOUT 150 AIDEED FOLLOWERS SURRENDERED AND WERE DETAINED.

-- ON SATURDAY NIGHT AC-130'S LAUNCHED A 30-MINUTE ATTACK ON AIDEED AIDE OSMAN ATTO'S COMPOUND, THOUGHT TO CONTAIN ARMS AND HEAVY EQUIPMENT. DAMAGE WAS EXTENSIVE, WITH UNCONFIRMED REPORTS OF FOUR SOMALI DEATHS.

-- ON SUNDAY PAKISTANI TROOPS FIRED ON A CROWD OF SOMALI DEMONSTRATORS WHO WERE BELIEVED TO BE SHELTERING GUNMEN. SEVERAL PEOPLE WERE KILLED AND WOUNDED. UN UNDER SECRETARY ANANN SAID THE INCIDENT WILL BE INVESTIGATED.

-- LAST NIGHT AC-130 GUNSHIPS SPENT NINETY MINUTES HITTING TWO OF AIDEED'S WEAPONS STORAGE FACILITIES. REPORTS OF EXTENSIVE SECONDARY EXPLOSIONS SUGGEST ARMS AND MUNITIONS WERE STORED THERE. A COBRA HELICOPTER DISABLED A MULTIPLE ROCKET LAUNCHER LOCATED NEAR THE OLD USLO OFFICE ON MONDAY.

Q: What is the situation on the ground today?

A: -- THE SITUATION IS CALM BUT TENSE. 3,000 SOMALIS DEMONSTRATED IN MOGADISHU'S STADIUM AGAINST THE UNOSOM II ACTIONS. AIDEED CONTINUES TO BLAME THE US FOR ALL ACTIONS AND PLANNED TO ADDRESS THE DEMONSTRATORS.

Q. What is the status of the international emergency relief effort in Somalia?

A. -- RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS ARE GEARED UP FOR AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONSE FOR MOGADISHU. AN ESTIMATED 18 EXPATRIATES FROM SEVERAL NGOS INCLUDING SURGICAL TEAMS ARE IN MOGADISHU WHILE OTHERS IN NAIROBI PLAN TO REENTER THE CITY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THE PLANNED DELIVERY YESTERDAY OF 180 TONS OF FOOD WAS CANCELED BECAUSE OF THE VIOLENCE IN THE CAPITAL. RELIEF ACTIVITIES IN NORTHERN MOGADISHU AND OUTSIDE MOGADISHU CONTINUE CAUTIOUSLY.

Q. What about NGO criticism of the operation?

A. -- WE UNDERSTAND THAT RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS HAVE CRITICISMS OF AND CONCERNS ABOUT THE CURRENT UN OPERATION IN SOMALIA.

-- THE RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS HAVE LEGITIMATE CONCERNS. UNOSOM IS AWARE OF THEM AND IS LISTENING TO THEM.

-- THERE ARE REGULAR BRIEFINGS FOR RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS HERE, IN MOGADISHU, AND IN NAIROBI. THERE WAS A BRIEFING FOR RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS THIS MORNING IN THE DEPARTMENT.

-- COOPERATION BETWEEN RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS AND UNOSOM II
ON HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE, REHABILITATION, AND
RECONSTRUCTION IN SOMALIA REMAINS ESSENTIAL. THIS
COOPERATION IS A FUNDAMENTAL ASPECT OF THE UN'S PROGRAM
TO HELP SOMALIS RECREATE A FUNCTIONING GOVERNMENT THAT
CAN RESTORE CIVIL SOCIETY.

Q: What are the UN's objectives in Somalia? How long will the current operation last? Is the UN trying to arrest Aided?

A: -- THE UNITED NATIONS FORCES IN SOMALIA (UNOSOM II) ARE CONTINUING TO FULFILL THEIR MANDATE OF CARRYING OUT AND PROVIDING SECURITY FOR HUMANITARIAN OPERATIONS. THE UN ACTIONS ARE IN RESPONSE TO ARMED ATTACKS THAT KILLED 23 AND WOUNDED ^{RECKLETLING} 59 TROOPS.

-- QUESTIONS ABOUT THE CURRENT OPERATION -- HOW LONG IT MAY LAST, AND WHAT ITS SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES ARE -- SHOULD BE DIRECTED TO UN HEADQUARTERS OR UN MILITARY COMMANDERS.

Q: Has the operation turned the Somali people against the UN? Has it changed the nature or character of U.S. involvement in UNOSOM II?

A: -- THE REGRETTABLE INCIDENTS OF RECENT DAYS OCCURRED IN ONE SECTOR OF MOGADISHU; THE UN CONTINUES TO CARRY OUT ITS HUMANITARIAN MISSION ^{W/OUT DISTURBANCES} IN OTHER PARTS OF THE CITY AND THE COUNTRY.

-- WE DO NOT BELIEVE THAT UN ACTIONS AGAINST A FACTION LEADER ACTING IN DEFIANCE OF SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS TURNED THE SOMALI PEOPLE AGAINST THE UN.

-- THE U.S. CONTINUES TO HAVE AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN UNOSOM II. ^{MAJOR} BRIGADIER GENERAL THOMAS MONTGOMERY (USA) CONTINUES AS DEPUTY FORCE COMMANDER, OUR LOGISTICS TROOPS REMAIN AN INTEGRAL PART OF UNOSOM II, AND THE QUICK REACTION FORCE CONTINUES IN A STRONG SUPPORT ROLE.

-- THE U.S. IS NOT INVOLVED AT THIS TIME IN AN INVESTIGATION OF THE ORIGINAL AMBUSH INCIDENT OF JUNE 5. I HAVE TO REFER YOU AGAIN TO THE UN FOR ANY DETAILS ABOUT SUCH AN INVESTIGATION.

P5 Release would disclose confidential advice between the President and his advisors, or between such advisors [(a)(5) of the PRA]
P6 Release would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy [(a)(6) of the PRA]

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
