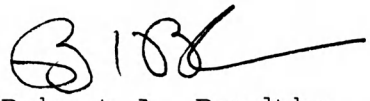

Cost Estimates for Prevention, Care and Treatment of HIV/AIDS for sub-Saharan Africa

UNAIDS and USAID have estimated the costs, as outlined below, of prevention, treatment, and orphan care in Sub-Saharan Africa. There are substantial needs in Asia and Eastern Europe as well. It must be noted that most of these activities are inter-related and funding one category requires concomitant funding of others. The rough estimates are the annual bare minimum costs in year 2000 dollars:

- **Treatment and care** **\$1.3 billion**
Assumes reaching 30 percent of those in need at \$194/yr/person. Includes treatment of HIV-related illness such as TB, but excludes treatment with anti-retrovirals. Providing Cotrimoxazole (Bactrim/Septra) would add only \$14 million, assuming treating 1.1 million per year - only those with moderately advanced disease.
- **Prevention activities** **\$1.03 billion**
Including behavior change communications, condom social marketing, STD services, and safe blood programs.
- **HIV Testing and counseling** **\$470 million**
Assumes reaching 15 percent of all adults (15-49) at \$12/person.
- **Care for orphans and vulnerable children** **\$390 million**
Assumes reaching 30 percent of affected children at \$50/yr/child. Excludes orphanage care.
- **Prevention of mother-child transmission** **\$120 million**
Based on \$4 Nevirapine, not \$80 (other) drugs. Includes administration of drugs and breast milk substitutes for 400,000 infected women/yr at \$55/person (about \$70/each if you include HIV testing). Could cost 20 times that amount.

Total needed for sub-Saharan Africa: at least \$3.0 billion/year
Total currently available from all sources: \$0.5 billion/year

- Discuss a plan-of-action to mobilize a "Global War on HIV/AIDS" requested by the last Deputies meeting on AIDS.
- Agency buy-in and contribution to a diplomatic and legislative agenda to increase domestic and international resources for AIDS.

AGENDA/DISCUSSION**I. Plan of Action.**

The last Deputies meeting called for a Strategic plan for U.S. leadership in battling the AIDS crisis, including U.S. policy priorities, costs of interventions and plans for increased burdensharing. The discussion paper, "Mobilizing a Global War on HIV/AIDS" , (Tab A) outlines the goals, costs and key US policy objectives needed for implementation. The "Mobilizing a Global War on HIV/AIDS" plan is a focused way to move the overall agenda forward by leveraging domestic and international resources. Agency-specific goals are covered in the IWG consensus document, which was circulated at the last Deputies meeting.

- Ask NSC/NEC staff to summarize the targets, goals, policy objectives and costs. Ask for comments/changes/additions from the Agencies. Leon will push for a priority emphasis on protecting the "next generation" in Africa by emphasizing treatment for prevent mother-child-transmission and care of orphans. Programs to assist in these areas are already included

in the LIFE Agreement. Additional emphasis is a good idea, but would require general agreement especially from USAID (and HHS).

- Ask if Deputies endorse the plan's approach, or would like a modification in approach.
- Ask the Deputies, especially USAID/HHS, if they would endorse the proposal to emphasize treatment for mother-child transmission.
- There is a gap between what is required and what the international community is providing of at least \$2.5 billion per year for prevention and care for AIDS in Africa alone. ONAP has suggested calling for USG endorsement of a goal to close this resource gap within 5 years (from all sources). At the same time, Leon Fuerth is interested in having us specify how resources would be applied to the various elements of the HIV/AIDS problem (mother-child transmission, prevention, care, etc.) in developing countries, and how that would be matched to the goals.
- You should ask for comment on whether we should adopt specific global or regional resource goals (with special attention to budgetary implications). If Deputies agree, you should task staff to do the analysis required in consultation with OMB, and prepare options for subsequent Deputies' approval on input and output goals that could accompany our comprehensive policy agenda.

II. Opportunities for advancing the USG plan

A. Tab B lists a calendar of major international events during which our international AIDS campaign can be highlighted, including the US-EU Summit, G-8, OAU Summit, etc., and outlines draft objectives for each meeting and proposed tactics. More specific plans and actions will be developed by the interagency for each meeting. You should note that the best opportunities to move the ball forward are at the G-8 and possibly the UN Millennium Summit; the US-EU Summit will provide some opportunity to press for increased funding (Joint Statement says the right things but does not reference specific resource levels).

Ask all present to routinely add to the list of important contacts and opportunities for moving our agenda (bilateral meetings of Department principals, meetings, commissions etc not

currently listed. (Additional dates should be sent to NSC for circulation within the IWG).

III. Legislative Goals and Calendar (Tab C)

There are a number of issues related to ensuring the 4 approps subcommittees fund the \$100 million increase in AIDS funding in the President's budget, the Leach/Lee bill (\$500 million/5 year World Bank Trust Fund for AIDS) and its potential impact on the President's request, the funding of the GAVI, and finding a legislative vehicle for the \$1 billion tax credit for vaccine research.

- Ask WH Leg and OMB to summarize approach.
- (depending on sensitivities, you may want to ask DOD to comment on where we are in the \$10 million administration request for mil-mil AIDS training.)

Objectives:

1. Issue a joint statement calling for increased resources and strong leadership to combat HIV/AIDS and other infectious diseases in Africa.
2. Reach agreement with E.U. to increase bilateral EC assistance to Africa for HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and care years, and to urge its member states to do the same.
3. Reach agreement with E.U. to increase its research budget for HIV/AIDS, and urge its member state to do the same.
4. Reach agreement on a joint public diplomacy strategy.
5. Obtain commitment from E.U. to support Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI) or other innovative new partnerships, such as WHO's Stop TB or Roll Back Malaria.
6. Obtain agreement with E.U. to call on its member states to support U.S. proposal to increase MDB concessional lending for health programs at June 7-8 IDA Deputies Meeting.

Proposed Tactics:

1. Continue using State Dept. diplomatic channels.
2. POTUS letter to Prodi/Guterres.

June 7-8 IDA Deputies Meeting, Lisbon

Objectives:

1. Reach agreement with IDA Deputies to support an increase in concessional lending of \$400-\$900 million per year by the World Bank for health programs, particularly related to HIV/AIDS.
2. Call on World Bank to provide necessary technical assistance to ensure that developing countries have access to existing resources.

Proposed Tactics:

1. Use Health, Finance, Development Assistance, and Foreign Ministry channels to push USG proposal.
2. Use U.S.-E.U. Summit and G-8 Sherpa process to urge key IDA members to support USG proposal.
3. Treasury continue to work with the World Bank to shape its proposal to the IDA Deputies.
4. Circulate USG proposal to all IDA members by demarche.

July - 1st wk OAU Summit, Togo

Objectives:

1. Leaders demonstrate serious and visible commitment to combating HIV/AIDS. Commitments should include:
 - Speaking out frequently about HIV/AIDS and directing all government officials to do the same;
 - Creating national AIDS plans;
 - Creating inter-ministerial commissions on AIDS, to include ministries of finance and defense;
 - Increasing national AIDS budgets for prevention and care and redirecting debt-relief funding into HIV and AIDS activities;
 - Launching major AIDS public awareness/education campaigns.
2. Leaders demonstrate commitment to programs to empower women and girls, including basic education and microfinance.
3. Possible resolution from African leaders to give fight against AIDS highest priority - (to present to Durban conference)?

Proposed Tactics:

1. Use Mbeki State Visit to urge President Mbeki to lead African efforts;
2. Identify other key African leaders, such as Museveni, and use diplomatic channels (POTUS or VPOTUS letters?) to discuss USG strategy;

3. Use June trip to Africa of Summers, Thurman and Smith to advance USG strategy to key African leaders.

July 9-14 International AIDS Conference, Durban, S.A.

Objectives:

1. Resolve controversy surrounding Mbeki concerning his questioning of whether HIV causes AIDS in advance of conference.
2. Establish Mbeki as African leader in fight against AIDS.
3. Develop consensus statement on basic care and treatment in resource-poor countries, especially in sub-Saharan Africa.
4. Launch global campaign to close resource gap (?) *Could potentially preempt G-8 announcements.*

Proposed Tactics:

1. Use Mbeki meetings with POTUS and VPOTUS to resolve controversy and urge Mbeki to lead African efforts;
2. Use June visit to South Africa of Summers, Thurman and Smith to advance USG strategy to key African leaders and propose new HIV-prevention/poverty-reduction measures, such as a microfinance initiative that includes an HIV component.
3. Use May 25-26 UNAIDS Board Meeting to begin developing consensus statement on basic care and treatment, in advance of special UNAIDS/US-led meeting on care and treatment in Durban.
4. Determine whether to launch USG strategy for closing resource gap in advance of G-8 Summit.
5. Consider announcing the Presidential Envoy for AIDS Coordination concept (if approved and adequately vetted with developed and developing countries in advance.)

July 21-23 G-8 Summit, Okinawa

1. Issue a Communique calling for increased resources and strong leadership to combat HIV/AIDS and other infectious diseases worldwide.

2. Announce G-8 commitment to doubling bilateral assistance for HIV/AIDS prevention, treatment and care within two (three?) years.
3. Announce G-8 commitment to doubling research budgets for HIV/AIDS and other diseases of the poor.
4. Announce G-8 commitment to enhance incentives for privately funded research into HIV/AIDS, for example through incentives and contributions to purchase funds, including the Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI).
5. Announce G-8 support for an increase in concessional lending for HIV/AIDS and other priority diseases by the MDBs on the order of \$400-\$900 million per year.

Proposed Tactics:

1. Use G-8 Sherpa, Sous-Sherpa, and Health Experts channels to push USG proposals.
2. Raise USG G-8 proposals at all high-level health, finance, foreign ministry, and development assistance bilaterals prior to Okinawa.
3. Engage high-level nongovernmental and industry leaders in efforts, such as WHO Director-General Brundtland and Bill Gates in effort to raise visibility of issues with other G-8 leaders.
4. Use U.S.-E.U. Summit to push USG proposals with European members of G-8.
5. Use Clinton-Putin discussions to engage Russia in global AIDS campaign.
6. Write POTUS letters to key G-8 leaders to push USG proposal, particularly doubling of bilateral assistance. (POTUS already indicated willingness to write G-8 letters regarding vaccines.)

Sept. 6-8 UNGA Millennium Summit, New York

Objective:

1. Clinton and Mbeki stand together as leaders of global campaign to combat AIDS and call for worldwide effort to close resources gap.

2. Leaders from North and South jointly commit to global AIDS campaign as part of effort to close the poverty gap.

Proposed tactics:

1. All of above.

Sept. 24-28 World Bank/IMF Annual Meeting, Prague

Objectives:

1. If not already agreed, call on World Bank to support an increase in concessional lending of \$400-\$900 million per year by the World Bank for health programs, particularly related to HIV/AIDS.
2. Call on World Bank to provide necessary technical assistance to ensure that developing countries have access to existing resources.

Proposed Tactics:

1. Use Health, Finance, Development Assistance, and Foreign Ministry channels to push USG proposal.
2. Use UNGA Millennium Summit to highlight call to World Bank.

Nov. 15-16 APEC Leaders Summit, Brunei

Objectives:

1. Include call for political and resources commitments to global AIDS in APEC agenda.
2. Develop special AIDS initiative for APEC members, focusing on southeast Asia.
3. Create APEC Health Working Group of Experts Group as a means of obtaining APEC funds for HIV/AIDS programs.

Proposed Tactics:

1. Urge U.S. APEC Ambassador to raise HIV/AIDS at June 1-3 APEC Senior Officials meeting.

2. Use established APEC channels at State and other agencies to include APEC Leaders' statement on AIDS in Communique.

Dec. 1 World AIDS Day

Objectives:

1. Leaders from North and South demonstrate commitment to fighting AIDS.
2. Announce significant progress and commitments in effort to close the resource gap.

Proposed Tactics:

1. All of above.

International AIDS Legislative Goals and Calendar

Part I: Appropriations Process

1) **Secure full funding for the President's budget request on international AIDS (including HIPC&IDA money) in Appropriations process.** Key Appropriations subcommittees are Agriculture, Foreign Operations, Defense, and Labor/HHS (to be reviewed by Martha Foley (WH Legislative Affairs), OMB, USAID first). Attached Appropriations calendar to follow.

2) **Organize interagency briefings for above subcommittees.** Also target and work with friends on the Committee (Pelosi, Leahy, Durbin, Jackson (Il), Feinstein, etc.).

Part II: Non-Appropriations Measures

1) **Secure passage of Administration proposals.** Seek legislative vehicle for our vaccine tax credit proposal (Ways & Means, Finance, Health Care revenue bills).

2) **Devise strategy for managing congressional initiatives.** Leach/Lee (H.R. 3519) passed in the House by voice vote on May 15. Need to fine-tune administration position and prepare for Senate strategy. Currently OMB, Treasury, and USAID are reviewing H.R. 3519's language and devising coordinated strategy for future negotiations with members.

Part III: General Education and Outreach to Members and Committee Education

1) **Draft and clear interagency talking points on the AIDS crisis and highlight the Administration's proposals.**

2) **Design outreach (including specific talking points) for interested congressional groups (CBC, Women's, Asian, Military Committees, etc.).**

3) **Develop and utilize existing core groups of interested members (for dear colleagues, floor debates, one minutes, "whipping" -- internal lobbying, etc.).**
