DRAFT**Statement of the Secretary of Defense
on the Situation in Somalia**

We will hold any persons who detain U.S. military personnel responsible for their proper treatment, including receiving medical attention and visitation by the International Red Cross.

We are consulting with the United Nations, under whose control U.S. soldiers are operating, regarding necessary steps to insure proper treatment and prompt return of any detainees.

The United States Government reserves the right to take appropriate action to insure that international standards for treatment of these personnel are being met, and to respond if we have indications they are not.

We will respond forcefully if any harm comes to those who are detained.

Developments in the past few days require that we send some additional capabilities to support and defend our forces in Somalia. These include:

- one mechanized company with an armored platoon to increase our forces' capability to move through Mogadishu (4 M-1/A-1 tanks and 14 Bradley fighting vehicles);**
- air gun ships to provide a rapid response and night-fighting capability (2 AC-130s);**
- replacement helicopters;**
- approximately 200 personnel for rotation.**

We will continue to work with the UN and the two dozen nations that have troops in Somalia to create conditions of security that can prevent the return of anarchy and famine while drawing down the American presence in the coming months.

We are currently reviewing possible options in support of that policy.
