Talking Points on Bosnia Joint Action Program

- The Joint Action Program on Bosnia adopted on Saturday by the United States, Russia, Great Britain, France, and Spain is an important step forward.
- It reinforces our determination to **end the violence and ethnic cleansing**, prevent the spread of the conflict to other areas in the region, and ensure a **coordinated plan of action** among the United States, our European allies, and Russia.
- The 13-point program includes a wide-range of measures achieve these goals, including humanitarian assistance, enhanced enforcement of existing sanctions and the threat of additional sanctions, new security measures for neighboring areas of Kosovo and Macedonia, protection for "safe havens" and a U.N. War Crimes Tribunal.
- The creation of safe havens does not "legitimate genocide."
- In fact, the Joint Action Program firmly reasserts the **refusal of the Western allies to accept territorial gains in Bosnia through aggression**.
- For example, it clearly states that economic sanctions will remain in place until the withdrawal of Bosnian Serb troops from territories occupied by force.
- It **leaves open options for new and tougher measures** proposed by the United States, including the lifting of the arms embargo on the Bosnians and the threat of air strikes to allow the rearming to take place.
- The joint program adopted Saturday in Washington is a direct result of **American leadership** on the Bosnian issue.
- It is an outgrowth of Secretary Christopher's determined efforts to move the Western allies into a more active policy towards the Bosnian crisis.
- The important role played by the Russian Foreign Minister stems in part from President Clinton's leadership in Vancouver in supporting President Yeltsin at a crucial moment.
- The United States will continue to play its **appropriate role** in a coordinated effort to resolve the Bosnian situation.
- This role includes enforcing the "No Fly" zone, provision of humanitarian assistance, assisting UNPROFOR troops if they come under attack, and possibly providing troops in Macedonia.
- We will **not put U.S. groundtroops into Bosnia** except to support a comprehensive political settlement.

Statements by on Bosnia During Campaign and Transition

(April 1, 1992)

Bush still has not recognized Croatia and Slovenia despite prodding from European allies.

(June 19, 1992)

I was an early advocate of recognition of Croatia and Slovenia. I would not rule out the U.S. acting as part of a peace keeping force to bring about a cease fire in Bosnia and to enforce it. But I do think we have to be guided, to some extent, by what our European allies think is appropriate action, as well as what we can get through the UN.

Last month, I called for tough sanctions against the Milosevic regime, including freezing assets, an oil embargo, and the suspension or expulsion of Yugoslavia from the key international organizations.

If diplomatic efforts are unsuccessful at achieving a cease-fire and delivering urgent humanitarian assistance, I would support a multilateral military effort to open the airport and ensure that relief supplies reach their destination.

In response to a question on whether he would be ready to participate in a multilateral military operation that could conceivably have to go into Sarajevo to open the airport, to shoot its way in, BC replied Yes.

(July 26, 1992)

Tighten the economic blockage against Serbia, not only on weapons but also on oil and other supplies to Serbia.

European and U.S. Naval forces in the Adriatic should be given authority by the UN to stop and search ships violating the embargo.

The international community should take steps to charge the Milosevic regime and those responsible for the slaughter of innocent civilians with crimes against humanity under international law.

If the Serbs persist in violating the terms the current ceasefire agreement, the U.S. should take the lead in seeking UN Security Council authorization for air strikes against those who are attacking the relief effort. The United States should be prepared to lend appropriate military support to that operation. Air and naval forces adequate to carry out these operations should be visibly in position.

(August 4, 1992)

The United States should take the lead in calling on the UN Security Council to convene immediately in emergency session to call for access by the ICRC to all detention camps and to initiate a relief effort. The UN should demand the release of all non-combatants into the custody of the ICRC and the immediate closing of any detention centers. The UN demands should be backed up by collective action, including the use of force if necessary. The U.S. should be prepared to lend appropriate support, including military, to such an operation.

(August 9, 1992)

I'm not calling for a lifting of the embargo now but I do think it is an issue that has to be debated. The comments I have made about the sue of force are confined to the two issues which the U.S. is confronting today which are opening those camps and protecting the relief effort.

Last July, I called for the U.S. to take the lead in seeking U.S. Security Council authorization to ensure the delivery of the urgently needed humanitarian assistance, and said that the U.S. should be prepared to lend air and naval support to ensure the success of that operation. Following the revelations of concentration camps in Bosnia, I urged the U.S. take the lead in calling on the UNSC to convene immediately in emergency session, call for access by the ICRC to all detention camps and initiate a relief effort.

(October 11, 1992)

I agree that we cannot commit ground forces to become involved in the quagmire of Bosnia...I applaud the no-fly zone, and I know that [the President] is going back to the UN to try to get authority to enforce it. I think we should stiffen the embargo on the Belgrade government, and I think we have to consider whether or not we should lift the arms embargo now on the Bosnians, since they are in no way in a fair fight with a heavily armed opponent bent on "ethnic cleansing."

(December 8, 1992)

I understand entirely why President Bush, General Powell and others do not wish to make a commitment of ground forces of the U.S.

Yugoslavia under Security Council Resolutions

As a result of Serb action in Bosnia, the issue arises as to whether the United States has authority, alone or within the NATO framework, to employ air power to support UNPROFOR in the execution of its mandate, to prevent the strangulation of Sarajevo and other Moslem areas within Bosnia, or to promote the achievement of a viable political settlement at the Geneva negotiations. Following is a brief analysis of the relevant United Nations Security Council resolutions (UNSCRs) bearing on this and related issues concerning the use of force in the former Yugoslavia. This analysis demonstrates the relevance of Security Council resolutions to any proposed actions by States, unilaterally or multilaterally, in Bosnia or other parts of the former Yugoslavia.

The principal resolutions are UNSCRs 770, 816, 836 and 844. Taken together, these resolutions require the express authorization of UNPROFOR for any use of air power in Bosnia for the purpose of ensuring the delivery of humanitarian assistance under UNSCR 770 and provide that the first decision to initiate the use of air power in Bosnia for the broader purposes under UNSCR 836 is to be taken by the Secretary General in consultation with members of the Security Council. To date, NATO planning also provides for a case-by-case response to UNPROFOR requests for protective actions, although this is not expressly required by the relevant resolutions. Other resolutions may have a bearing on the issue of the particular use of air power in Bosnia or for any purposes outside of Bosnia.

UNSCR 770

UNSCR 770 authorizes States, "nationally or through regional agencies or arrangements" to use "all measures necessary to facilitate . . . the delivery of humanitarian

assistance." While the authorization under that resolution was expressly intended to include the use of force, that authorization was expressly qualified by the requirement that such measures be taken "in coordination with the United Nations." The USG had argued for "notification" or "consultation" rather than coordination which, as suggested by the Security Council debates, provides the UN with power at least to slow down if not also block action by States.

In any event, in connection with the no-fly ban established for Bosnia under resolution 781, the Council thereafter expressly required UNPROFOR authorization for "humanitarian flights and other flights consistent with relevant resolutions of the Council." Resolution 816, para. 2. Such flights would include the use of air power to ensure the delivery of humanitarian assistance under UNSCR 770. This requirement for UNPROFOR authorization does not apply to States authorized to ensure compliance with the ban. Resolution 816 authorizes States, acting nationally or through regional organizations or arrangements, to take all necessary measures to ensure compliance with the ban, provided that such measures were "subject to close coordination with the Secretary-General and UNPROFOR." Resolution 816, para. 4. In practice, this "close coordination" has, under plans developed by NATO in consultation with the UN, involved a requirement for UNPROFOR authorization for each action to enforce compliance with the ban.

UNSCR 836

Resolution 836 also provides authority both to UNPROFOR and States to use force for a variety of purposes. For example, UNPROFOR is authorized to use force, acting in self-defense, to carry out its mandate to deter attacks against safe areas and while participating in the delivery of humanitarian relief. This includes action in reply to bombardments against safe areas or to armed incursions into them or in the event of any deliberate obstruction in the safe areas to freedom of movement of UNPROFOR or protected convoys.

States, acting nationally or through regional organizations or arrangements, are expressly authorized to take "all necessary measures through the use of air power, in and around safe areas" to support UNPROFOR in the performance of its expanded mandate, notwithstanding the no-fly ban imposed under resolution 816. While this last provision may be construed to exempt this use of air power from the express

UNPROFOR authorization requirements of resolution 816, the Council simultaneously conditioned such State actions upon "close coordination with the Secretary-General and UNPROFOR." Resolution 836, paras. 5, 9, and 10. In all other respects, the requirements of UNSCR 816 continue to apply.

In UNSCR 836, the Security Council requested the Secretary-General (SYG) to report to the Council for its decision on the modalities for implementing that resolution. In that report, the SYG indicated that he had invited NATO to coordinate with him the use of air power to support UNPROFOR and specifically stated:

It is of course understood that the first decision to initiate the use of air resources in this context will be taken by the Secretary-General in consultation with the members of the Security Council."

In UNSCR 844, the Council expressly approved of this report. As the SYG stated in his recent letter to the Secretary, by this approval the Council endorsed this approach. It is also worth noting that the "close coordination" called for in the draft plans developed by NATO to implement UNSCR 836 (to which the SYG referred in his report) involves NATO responses to UNPROFOR requests for such assistance in each instance (not for NATO simply to notify UNPROFOR of action that NATO has already determined to take).

Other Resolutions

The resolutions discussed above specifically govern the use of air power in Bosnia. Resolution 770 also addresses other possible uses of force for the purpose of ensuring the delivery of humanitarian assistance in Bosnia. That resolution, however, does not address the use of air power or other uses of force outside of Bosnia.

Resolutions that may have a bearing on the use of force other than air power in Bosnia or the use of force more generally outside of Bosnia include those that call for a cease-fire and establish the Geneva framework for a negotiated settlement as well as an arms embargo.

From the outset, the Council has supported the process established by the EC, the CSCE and the Conference on Yugoslavia to reach a negotiated settlement to the disputes

resulting from the breakup of the former Yugoslavia. From the outset, the Council has endorsed various cease-fire agreements negotiated among the parties, including Bosnia, or otherwise established such cease-fires. As the hostilities wore on the Council increasingly switched from "calling upon" or "urging" the parties to observe these cease-fires to demanding that they do so. In at least some of these cases, the demands were expressly made under Chapter VII creating binding obligations on the parties. Finally, through a series of resolutions, the Council has established an arms embargo that applies throughout the territory of the former Yugoslavia. UNSCRs 713, 724, 727, 743. Notably, the Council felt the need to expressly exempt weapons and military equipment destined for the sole use of UNPROFOR forces from the arms embargo. UNSCR 743.

These provisions may affect the rights of the parties in the Bosnia conflict, or those acting in concert with them, to use force against other parties.
