SUBJECT: UK/Ireland Guests

I've reviewed the list for guests for the President's trip to the UK and Ireland and overall think it is a good list. There are several issues that I wanted to flag, however, and suggest we sit down to discuss on Monday.

I'm concerned over the lack of a strong business group -- we'd originally thought of having the list mostly business to help fend off charges of a political trip. While I don't feel that strongly about cutting the list to 6, I do think we might want to try and bring some business leaders who have a direct interest in investing or trading in Ireland. As the list is currently configured, I understand only one of the six invests in Ireland. One of the President's main goals in Ireland is to promote trade and investment. While Ron Brown has taken the lead, it might be strange to have almost no business leaders with an Ireland focus on the trip (three are active in the American Irish community, two are major business leaders with no Ireland focus and one invests in Ireland).

I think the VP's office is going to want us to take the Mayor of Nashville since his town is donating the Christmas tree the President will light. We'll check with him but we might have to delete one from the current list.

I think it is strange to bring the DNC fundraiser -- serves to highlight the issue of a political trip.

Ray Flynn has made it clear that he thinks he is going on the trip. We think it is inappropriate but need to get the POTUS' decision. If Flynn goes, you can also expect Elizabeth Bagley to ask to join.

We'll run the list by the Irish and British Embassy.

UNITED KINGDOM / IRELAND TRIP

Purpose

To approve a list of recommended individuals to be invited to travel to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland as *Presidential Guests* during your upcoming trip to this region.

Background

We plan to include a group of *Presidential Guests* in your trip to the United Kingdom and Ireland. By including these individuals, we seek to help advance the goals of the trip abroad and highlight your role and commitment to the Irish peace process back home. The individuals will bring with them political, economic, and community development knowledge and experience as well as their commitment to peace in the region. As witnesses to your trip, they will be in an enhanced position to help support and communicate the importance of this peace process in key American communities.

We will invite 42 individuals to travel to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. Invited guests will travel on a single aircraft and join you for certain elements of the trip. All guests will be asked to cover the cost of airfare and expenses. Numbers are limited due to aircraft size. We feel strongly that no more than one aircraft be dedicated for the transport of *Presidential Guests*.

Although this message of peace is one that reaches beyond a single ethnic group, our focus with these *Presidential Guests* is to maximize our efforts to reach Irish America with the message. Irish Americans are the second largest ethnic group in the country. On average, 16% of the American population claims Irish heritage; ranging from 18.5% in the Northeast to 13% in the West. Although Irish Americans are scattered throughout the country, the highest concentrations remain in the Northeast and Midwest states of Massachusetts (26% of population), Pennsylvania (19%), New Jersey (18.3%), Ohio (17.5%), Illinois (16.3%), and New York (15.6%).

The list of recommended *Presidential Guests* for your review is representative of a commitment to peace in the region, with a strong emphasis on Irish America in key geographic areas of the country mentioned above. We attempted to strike a balance from an Irish political perspective and from a religious perspective. The list is broken down into the following eight categories:

1.	Administration Officials	6 individuals
2.	Business	6 individuals
3.	Labor	4 individuals
4.	Elected Officials	6 individuals
5.	Organizations	6 individuals
6.	Religious	6 individuals
7.	Irish America	6 individuals
8.	The Arts	2 individuals

On the list attached, you will see that the religious category has only one Catholic. This is for the purpose of balance, since so many of the individuals in other categories are lay Catholics.

It also should be noted that in choosing individuals for the business category, our criteria included a commitment to peace in Ireland and/or Irish roots of the individual business person. Because this is not a trade mission, we were careful to make sure that individuals were included for a broader purpose than their interest in doing business in the region.

The recommendation process included input from all White House outreach offices, the NSC, as well as the Department of Commerce and Department of State. In the past week or so, a working group of representatives of these offices was put together to review and prioritize recommendations. The attached list has been agreed upon by that working group.

RECOMMENDATION

That you review and make any adjustments to the list of recommended *Presidential Guests* attached and approve the list so that invitations can be extended beginning Tuesday, November 7, 1995.

UNITED KINGDOM / IRELAND TRIP

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To approve a list of recommended individuals to be invited to travel to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland as *Presidential Guests* during your upcoming trip to this region.

Background

We plan to include a group of *Presidential Guests* in your upcoming trip. By including these individuals, we seek to help advance the goals of the trip abroad and highlight your role and commitment to the Irish peace process back home. The individuals will bring with them political, economic, and community development knowledge and experience as well as their commitment to peace in the region. As witnesses to your trip, they will be in an enhanced position to help support and communicate the importance of this peace process in key American communities.

69 We will invite 42 individuals to travel to Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. Invited guests will travel on a single aircraft and join you for certain elements of the trip. All guests will be asked to cover the cost of airfare and expenses. Numbers are limited due to aircraft size. We feel strongly that no more than one aircraft be dedicated for the transport of *Presidential Guests*.

Although this message of peace is one that reaches beyond a single ethnic group, our focus is to maximize our efforts to reach Irish America with the message. Irish Americans are the second largest ethnic group in the country. On average, 16% of the American population claims Irish heritage; ranging from 18.5% in the Northeast to 13% in the West. Although Irish Americans are scattered throughout the country, the highest concentrations remain in the Northeast and Midwest states of Massachusetts (26% of population), Pennsylvania (19%), New Jersey (18.3%), Ohio (17.5%), Illinois (16.3%), and New York (15.6%).

The list of recommended *Presidential Guests* for your review is representative of a commitment to peace in the region, with a strong emphasis on Irish America in key areas of the country mentioned above. We attempted to strike a balance from an Irish political perspective and from a religious perspective. The list is broken down into the following eight categories:

1.	Administration Officials	6 individuals
2.	Business	6 individuals
3.	Labor	4 individuals
4.	Elected Officials	6 individuals
5.	Organizations	6 individuals
6.	Religious	6 individuals
7.	Irish America	6 individuals
8.	The Arts	2 individuals

On the list attached, you will see that the religious category has only one Catholic. This is for the purpose of balance, since so many of the individuals in other categories are lay Catholics.

It also should be noted that in choosing individuals for the business category, our criteria included a commitment to peace in Ireland and/or Irish roots of the individual business person. Because this is not a trade mission, we were careful to make sure that individuals were included for a broader purpose than their interest in doing business in the region.

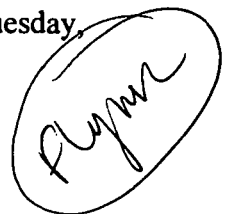
The recommendation process included input from all White House outreach offices, the NSC, as well as the Department of Commerce and Department of State. In the past week, a working group of representatives of these offices was put together to review and prioritize recommendations. The attached list has been agreed upon by that working group.

SUBJECT: Trade Missions

I urge you, at the earliest convenient time, to call a meeting to decide when, and where, Administration officials will lead trade missions to Ireland in the coming months. There are a number of plans to be made and a series of legitimate questions that have been raised. I have, for example, begun conversations with Secretary Brown about whether he will lead a trade mission prior to the President's trip, possibly in November. In my judgment, this would have a direct impact on the mission that Chuck is planning, given the closeness in time. Similarly, I have received a memorandum from Chuck today suggesting, as I read it, that more coordination is needed and a series of decisions need be made.

So I suggest this: At your next meeting, possibly next week, we need to establish a unified schedule for missions surrounding the President's trip. Carol Browner should be invited to send a representative. In the interim, I think we should all refrain from purporting to establish definite times concerning -- and certainly no invitations should be extended for -- any of the trips under discussion. I note, in this regard, the concerns that Martha expressed at the first meeting following Senator Mitchell's recent trip. The Department of Commerce would not want to be party to any action that cause similar concerns to have to be raised again in the future.
