SMalcolm X widow critically burned; young relative arrested

YONKERS, N.Y. (AP) An early morning fire left the widow of slain civil rights leader Malcolm X clinging to life Sunday with third-degree burns over 80 percent of her body, and a young relative was arrested.

Police did not release his name, but longtime family lawyer Percy Sutton said he was Betty Shabazz's 12-year-old grandson, Malcolm. The boy was charged with juvenile delinquency, police

Detective Edward Oakley said.

Ms. Shabazz, 63, was hospitalized in ``extremely critical" condition, said Dr. Bruce Greenstein of Jacobi Hospital in the Bronx.

``It does not look good for her," said police Detective Sgt. William Rinaldi.

New York Police Commissioner Howard Safir said an accelerant was used in the fire in a back hallway Safir said the apartment door had been forced open.

Ms. Shabazz was conscious and talking when firefighters arrived at about 1:40 a.m., said fire Battalion Chief Anthony Troia.

``She didn't have clothes on ... although one of the neighbors had wrapped a sheet around her," he said.

Ms. Shabazz told firefighters her young grandson was in the three-bedroom apartment. Police could not immediately find him, but later said a male relative was located. Oakley declined to say whether the youth arrested was the same male relative.

Sutton said he had seen Ms. Shabazz and her grandson Malcolm on Saturday, and that the boy had been having difficulties.

``There were problems there with that child. He's a bright young man, but there were some troubles there," Sutton said. ``Who could have guessed?"

Ms. Shabazz and Malcolm X had six daughters. It was not immediately known which daughter was the suspect's mother.

Two of Ms. Shabazz's daughters, Qubilah and Illayasah, were joined at the hospital Sunday by Nation of Islam minister Kevin Mohammad, who said Nation of Islam leader Louis Farrakhan was

``deeply concerned."

Farrakhan later issued a statement Sunday, saying ``Our community stands ready to lend whatever resources to assist the family in this hour. We are all praying for her full and complete recovery."

For 30 years, there was a rift between Ms. Shabazz and Farrakhan, whom Ms. Shabazz said she believed had played a role in her husband's death.

Malcolm X was assassinated Feb. 21, 1965, at the Audubon Ballroom in Harlem. Just a week before, the couple's New York City home was destroyed by a firebomb.

Shortly before Malcolm X died, he had criticized Nation of Islam founder Elijah Muhammad and was labeled a traitor by Farrakhan. Three men with connections to the Nation of Islam later were convicted of the killing.

Farrakhan and Ms. Shabazz publicly reconciled in 1995, shortly after Qubilah Shabazz resolved federal charges that she had plotted to kill Farrakhan, apparently in revenge for her father's death.

The fire did a relatively small amount of damage to Ms. Shabazz's apartment, Troia said.

``That's why it's suspicious. Because we have no idea how it could have done so much damage to her," he said.

Neighbors helped Ms. Shabazz before firefighters arrived, said Beth Fisher, president of the apartment building's co-op board.

``She was able to come to the door," Fisher said. ``She may have been a little delirious. She asked for water. She wanted her purse. She knew she needed an ambulance."

Troia said Ms. Shabazz had recently moved into the apartment in a complex of well-kept buildings. Later Sunday, fire investigators carried out evidence bags from her sixth-floor apartment.

The Rev. Al Sharpton, a New York City civil rights figure and a close friend of Ms. Shabazz, called the fire ``absolutely stunning."

``Clearly the entire city, particularly the African-American community, is at the edge of their seat to see what is behind this and praying for her recovery."

Ms. Shabazz, who works as head of the office of institutional advancement at Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn, is the godmother of two of Sharpton's daughters.

The charges against her daughter, Qubilah, were deferred for two years in a deal that required her to undergo drug treatment and commit no crimes. She signed an affidavit saying she accepted responsibility for her conduct but maintained her innocence.

Qubilah Shabazz, 36, now lives in Texas and works at a radio station. The charges were formally dropped last month by a federal judge in Minneapolis.

Subject: Ethnic Stations Can't Attract Ads

NEW YORK (AP) -- Their listeners are making more money every year and spend more than others on items like women's clothing. But ethnic radio stations persistently have trouble attracting advertisers interested in reaching burgeoning minority audiences.

A recent advertising agency's memo to clients offered a clue: ``Advertisers want prospects, not suspects," it said in proposing ad dollars be spent to reach ``the more important `white' segment of the population."

“This memo puts a lot of things into perspective,” said James L. Winston, executive director of the National Association of Black Owned Broadcasters, composed of 187 commercial radio and television stations nationwide.

Winston took part in a news conference Thursday with black and Latino broadcasters on the Madison Avenue sidewalk in front of Young & Rubicam (NYSE:YNR - news), the world's fifth-largest advertising agency. The group, led by the Rev. Al Sharpton, is demanding greater advertising revenues and is targeting Young & Rubicam, Macy's, PepsiCo Inc. (NYSE:PEP - news) and the Katz Media Group, whose Amcast subsidiary wrote the memo.

Macy's and PepsiCo Inc.'s Pepsi-Cola brand previously said they already advertise in ethnic media. Katz has apologized for the memo. On Thursday, Young & Rubicam called itself “a leader in ethnic media spending” for placing \$150 million in advertising annually in minority-owned media.

The memo that touched a nerve comes from a company that is part of Chancellor Media Corp. (Nasdaq:AMFM - news), whose holdings include black and Latino stations.

The memo fired up the coalition, but its members say it just focused attention on what they view as longtime injustices. The broadcasters promise a long hot summer of picketing and boycotts if advertising companies and large consumer businesses don't do more to promote advertising on ethnic media.

They complain that ethnic stations, no matter how they are ranked,

typically take in less advertising revenue than lower-ranked stations.

In the New York metropolitan area, for instance, ethnic-oriented stations WSKQ-FM, WQHT-FM and WRKS-FM are ranked, respectively, Nos. 2, 3 and 7 in Arbitron's winter ratings.

According to Duncan's Radio Market Guide, their revenues in 1997 were \$21.5 million for No. 2 WSKQ; \$27.6 million for No. 3 WQHT-FM and \$27.5 million for No. 7 WRKS. But the fifth-ranked station, WCBS-FM, took in \$34.8 million and No. 6, WXRK-FM, had revenues of \$37.3 million.

While some lower-rated stations may have audiences with the ages and bankrolls that readily attract advertisers, the coalition argues advertisers who ignore ethnic stations are missing a lucrative market.

While estimates vary, blacks' buying power ranges from \$469 billion to \$600 billion; the consumer power of Asia-Pacific Islanders runs between \$107 billion and \$120 billion, and Latinos generate about \$350 billion.

That puts the upper estimates for their combined consuming power at \$1 trillion.

A recent survey on inner-city spending found an \$85 billion retail market in America's inner cities, an amount nearly 7 percent of total U.S. retail spending.

The survey of white, black and Latino inner-city residents said blacks have the lowest amount of household income, but spend 22 percent more annually on women's apparel than the average U.S. household. Other spending patterns were comparable.

In addition, surveys have shown for years that blacks in particular are brand loyal -- but they remain ignored in niche advertising.

Clyde Allen, who runs his own marketing services firm after nearly two decades with Seagram Co. Ltd., says blacks buy 22 percent of the vodka consumed in this country, 16 percent of the scotch and 58 percent of the cognac.

“These are big numbers in terms of that particular industry,” Allen said, citing a telecommunications study two years ago showing that black households are more likely to use voice communications, especially cellular telephone paging systems, where they had more per household than any other group.

“The whole thing is that there is a burgeoning growth in the ethnic population in this country” that is neglected, Allen said.

Burgeoning indeed. The Census Bureau projects that Latinos, blacks and Asians-Pacific Islanders will be nearly 30 percent of the population in 2005. Already, the United States is the fifth-largest Spanish-speaking country.

Who's making decisions about placing advertising? It's an industry where 5.2 percent of all advertising agency employees are black and less than 1 percent are in management.

Black and Latino stations also are fighting for their survival in the wave of mergers that followed the lifting of federal limits on the number of stations a company may own.

Minorities own but 2.8 percent of the nation's TV and radio stations -- and those numbers are on the decline. Federal Communications Commission Chairman Bill Kennard has urged the broadcasting industry to find ways to reverse the trend.
