No change in number of poor and poverty rate

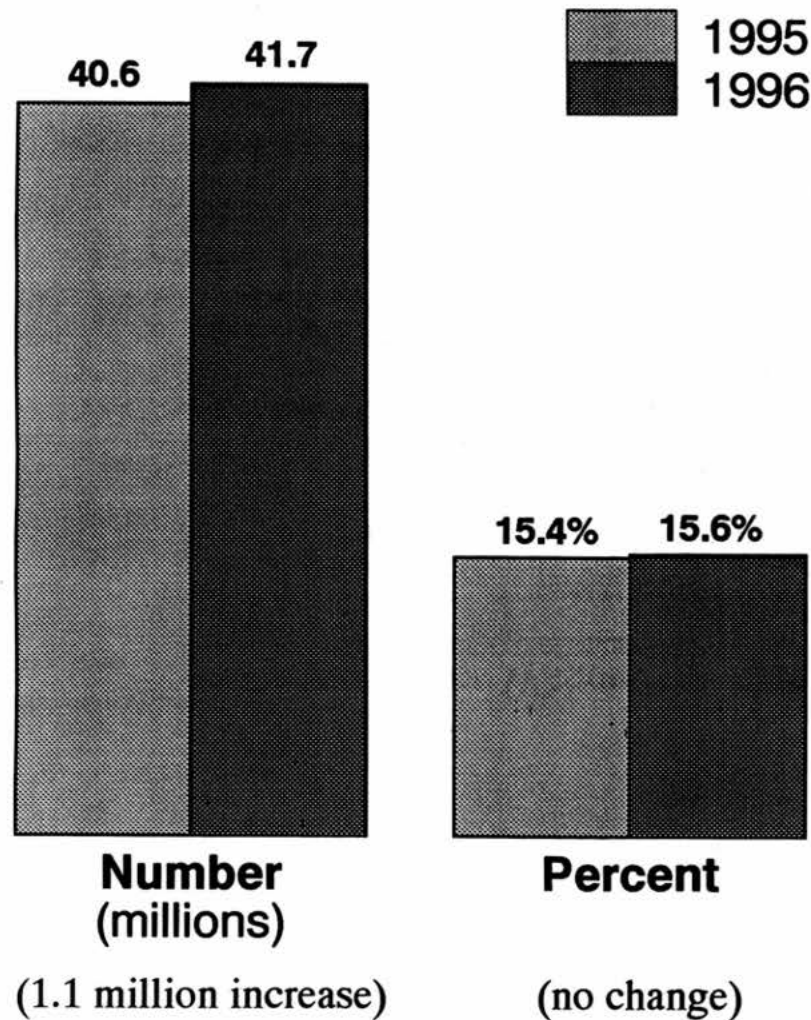
- 36.5 million poor

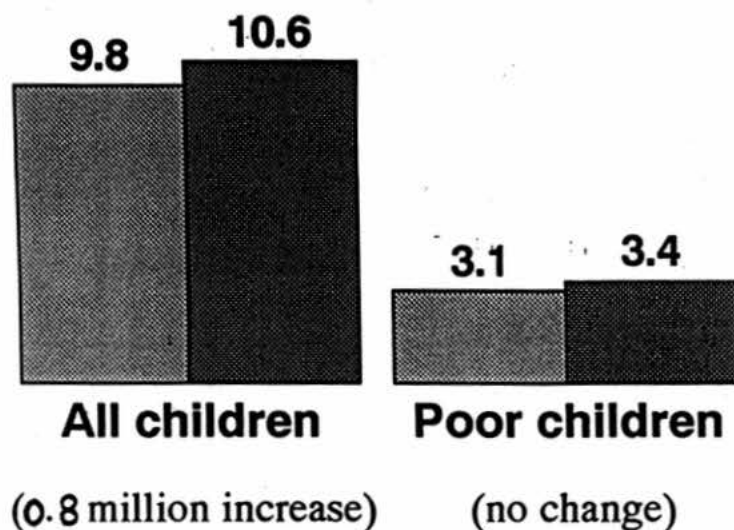

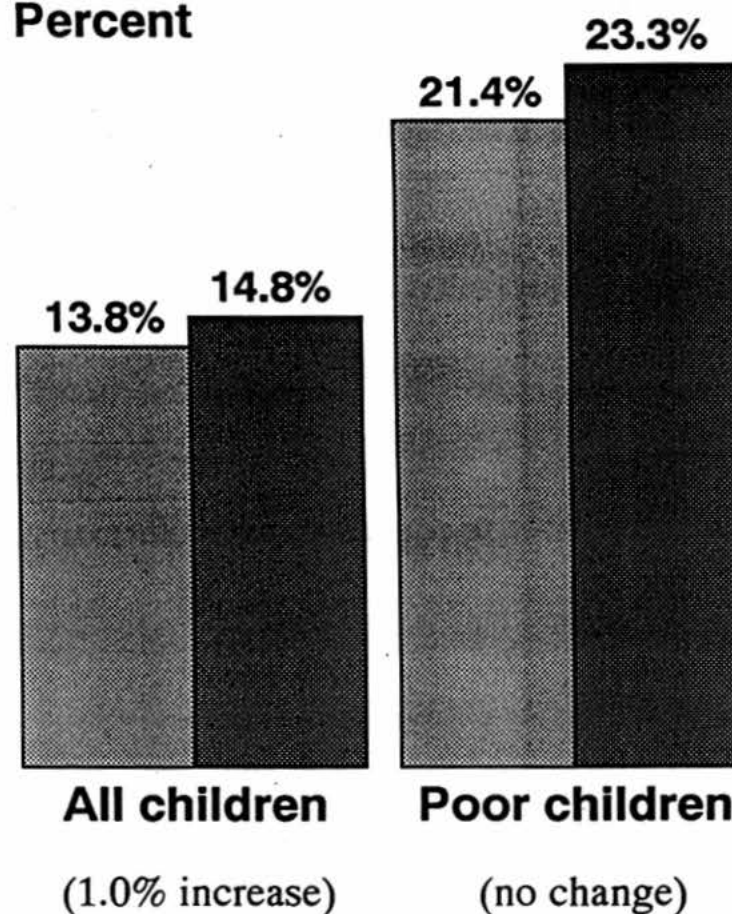
Children Without Health Insurance Coverage: 1995 and 1996
