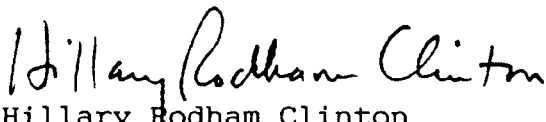
Thank you for writing to share your experiences and your support for our efforts to guarantee health security for all American families. I have heard many too many stories like yours, and each one serves as a reminder of the desperate need for health care reform. Too many Americans struggle to get the long-term care services needed to keep a family member at home. And too many are forced to make the difficult choice to place a spouse or parent in a nursing home, simply because they cannot afford to do otherwise.

The health care reform bills introduced by Senator Mitchell and Congressman Gephardt include a new federally funded long-term care program. Under both the Senate and House versions of the program, states with approved plans will be entitled to federal funds to provide home and community-based services for individuals with disabilities. Within federal guidelines, states will be given flexibility to design their service systems to best meet the needs of their elderly and disabled citizens. This program should provide the medical equipment, nursing services, transportation and respite care needed to keep people (b)(6)
