Part One -- NIH

Claim:

"Under the Clinton Administration, NIH's biomedical research has grown by 20%. This is \$2 billion over the 1993 level, and is the largest dollar increase over four years ever" *troubling breast cancer stuff.*

Source: NIH grew by \$2.05 billion over FY93-97, or 20%
NIH grew by \$1.8 billion over FY90-93, or 22% *NGM*

Part Two -- Breast Cancer Research

NIH breast cancer research funding increased from \$229 million in FY93 to \$410 in the FY97 Budget, a 79% increase over 4 years.

DoD breast cancer research funding moved from \$206 million in FY93 to \$0 in the FY97 Budget.

Total Federal breast cancer research funding therefore moved from \$436 million in FY93 to \$410 in the FY97 Budget, a decline of \$26 million.

Comparing FY93-FY96, total Federal breast cancer research rose from \$436 million to \$478 million, an increase of \$42 million (10%).
