Estimates are slightly different from those presented by GAO in "Health Insurance Portability", September, 1995, GAO/HEHS-95-257 in the following manner:

- GAO uses March 1994 CPS, above table uses March 1995 CPS.
- GAO reported 18.2 million persons: 11.5 million with health insurance who changed jobs, and 6.7 million dependents. Above table shows 17.2 million persons: 9.2 million policy holders who changed jobs and 8.0 million covered dependents.
- Of the 11.5 million individuals with health insurance who change jobs in the GAO report, the report does not specify whether the job changers are employer sponsored insurance (ESI) policy holders or dependents.
- Above table shows 9.2 million working adults who are ESI policy holders (coverage in own name) and this includes the self-employed and persons 65+.
- GAO reported 6.7 million dependents of individuals with health insurance who change jobs, but does not specify whether these dependents are covered by ESI (either as policy holders or dependents) or not.
- Above table shows 8.0 million covered dependents of the 9.2 million policy holders.
- Excluded from the above counts are dependent spouses who changed jobs when head of family did not change jobs.
- GAO also estimated as many as 3.6 million persons would benefit from a reduction in "job lock", and 1.8 to 2.3 million who have exhausted COBRA coverage, or did not have COBRA coverage, would benefit from guaranteed access to the individual market. These estimates could not be broken down on a state level.
- "Working ESI Policy Holders who Changed Jobs" is from CPS question "Number of jobs last year", with instructions that more than one job held at the same time should be counted as one job.
