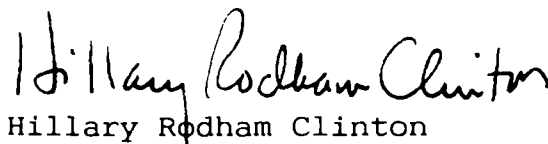
Congresswoman Ros-Lehtinen recently wrote to me about your concern that Puerto Rico be included in national health care reform.

The President supports guaranteed private health insurance for all American citizens, including Puerto Ricans. And, because nine out of ten Americans with private insurance get it through their employers, he believes that reform should build on the tradition of shared responsibility for health care costs between employers and employees.

National health care reform will build on the current health legislation recently passed in Puerto Rico creating the first health insurance administration (PRHIA). Within a national framework guaranteeing coverage and real access to comprehensive, high quality and affordable health care services, health reform will allow Puerto Rico to develop and implement a system best able to meet the needs of its citizens.

This nation now has an historic opportunity to change our health care system to make it work for all of us. The President and I look forward to continuing to work with Congress to make health security a reality for all citizens of this nation.

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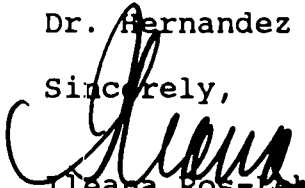
Dear Mrs. Clinton:
