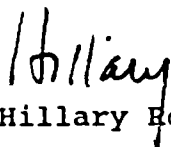

The Health Security Act proposed by the President integrates workers' compensation health care benefits into the national health care system. Under the Act, injured workers will receive medical care through their health plans. Current workers' compensation carriers will retain financial responsibility and reimburse health plans for the services they provide to injured workers. Health plans will be required to demonstrate their ability to provide care for work-related injuries and meet new standards for quality and efficiency.

A federal commission will develop a detailed strategy to integrate fully the financing of workers' compensation benefits. This will result in cost savings and higher quality care. The commission will study the most difficult issues involved in integration and determine whether we should continue to experience rate workers' compensation premiums and establish uniform benefit and eligibility standards.

I look forward to working with you in the coming weeks and months as Congress considers the Health Security Act.
