Re: Book Tour Overview

This week's book tour will include visits to four cities: Boca Raton, Florida; Atlanta, Georgia; St. Louis, Missouri and St. Paul, Minnesota. Here is a brief overview of the events scheduled in each city:

BOCA RATON (Thursday, May 2nd)

In Boca Raton, you will have an opportunity to highlight the efforts of local police officers who are working to give at-risk adolescents an alternative to gangs and drugs through the CHOICES Youth Program. Your trip will also include a drop-by to the Florence Fuller Child Development Center, a facility that provides subsidized day care to children of low-income families in Boca Raton, followed by a standard bookstore event at Liberties Books (see attached block schedule for times).

ATLANTA (Thursday, May 2nd)

Your trip to Atlanta will be comprised of a book event at the Media Play store in Alpharetta, a suburb of Atlanta, along an interview with the *Parenting Today* show on CNN.

ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI (Friday, May 3rd)

In St. Louis, you will have an opportunity to learn about a program called "Mentor St. Louis," through which local church and synagogue members ~~volunteer to~~ act as mentors to local at-risk children, followed by a bookstore event at the Library, Limited Bookstore. You are also scheduled to do interviews with several local radio and television stations.

ST. PAUL, MINNESOTA (Friday, May 3rd)

Your trip to St. Paul will include a visit to the St. Paul Companies, a Fortune 500 business that has successfully combined family-friendly policies with corporate profitability, followed by a bookstore event at the Hungry Mind bookstore.

BOCA RATON, FLORIDA

Thursday, May 2nd

I. OVERVIEW

Your trip to Boca Raton will have several components: a visit to the CHOICES program, where you will meet police officers who are working to give adolescents an alternative to gangs and drugs; a drop-by to the Florence Fuller Child Development Center, a child care facility that provides subsidized care to children of low-income families in Boca Raton; and a bookstore event at Liberties Books.

II. EVENTS

The Choices Youth Program

Background

CHOICES is a local program sponsored by the Boca Raton Police Department that works to give at-risk adolescents an alternative to gangs and drugs. Your visit to the CHOICES program on Thursday provides an opportunity to emphasize the importance of prevention programs for youth, and to highlight the role that police officers and others can play in supporting children in their communities. This visit also provides an opportunity to highlight the President's commitment to community policing -- as a result of the President's 100,000 cops initiative, the Boca Raton Police Department has five more police officers on the beat.

The underlying premise of the CHOICES program is that if adolescents are presented with positive options to crime and violence, they will make the right choices in life. The program was initiated in 1993, after a study showed that juvenile arrests in the Boca Raton area had increased by nearly 80% in the previous three years. The CHOICES program targets children in the seventh and eighth grade -- before they have gotten into trouble with the juvenile justice system. Participants go through an intensive, semester-long program that features after-school tutoring with police officers, along with training in conflict resolution, anger management and other coping skills; local senior citizens and high school students also serve as volunteer tutors. To help parents deal with the issues they encounter as their children enter adolescence, the CHOICES program offers free parenting classes to families.

Throughout the semester, students work towards the second component of the CHOICES program -- which consists of camping, canoeing and hiking trips designed to build self-esteem and teach skills in survival and self-reliance. Students earn points for good behavior that will help "buy" the equipment they need for a wilderness trip; they lose points for school detentions, suspensions, unexcused absences and any misbehavior at school. The wilderness trips put into practice what the students have learned in the afterschool program -- for instance, skills learned in a classroom lesson on conflict resolution are practiced on a group

canoe trip. Because these trips are so popular, the CHOICES program has a reputation as a fun learning experience, rather than a program for "bad kids."

The CHOICES program has been recognized by the International Association of Chiefs of Police as one of the nation's top youth programs, and is funded by the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice and the Boca Raton Police Department. According to the Boca Raton Chief of Police, the cost of the CHOICES program is minimal when compared to the cost of incarceration. Many of the students who have participated in the CHOICES program have boosted their grade point averages, and have had fewer instances of truancy, disruptive behavior and arrests.

Format

During your visit to Boca Raton Middle School, you will have an opportunity to meet several CHOICES students and police officers, along with high school students and senior citizens who act as volunteer tutors. After a brief visit, there will be a discussion with students, police officers, and parents on the importance of providing adolescents with positive role models like police officers, and afterschool activities that give them alternatives to violence and crime. This event also provides an opportunity to highlight the changing roles of police officers in meeting the needs of children in their communities. (List of discussion participants is attached.)

Liberties Fine Books, Music & Cafe

Your visit to Liberties Books will follow the standard receiving line format of past bookstore events; approximately 2,000 people are expected to attend. Located in a Boca Raton shopping center, Liberties is an upscale, independent bookstore that attracts many high-profile authors -- Dan Quayle was at Liberties last Friday, signing copies of his new book, *The American Family*. Liberties plans to donate a portion of its proceeds from this event to the Pediatric Center at West Boca Medical Center.

Upon departure, you will have an opportunity to briefly greet several parents and children from the Boca Raton HIPPIY program. The group plans to present you with a quilt that the children made for you.

The Florence Fuller Child Development Center

After the bookstore event, you are scheduled to drop-by the Florence Fuller Center, a child care facility that provides day care to children of low-income families in south Palm Beach County. The center subsidizes the cost of care to make it affordable for low-income families, but requires that all parents are either working, in job training, or in school. The center demonstrates the importance of providing working parents with access to quality, affordable child care. The center is funded by a variety of grants, individual donations and federal funds, including xx.

Your brief visit to the Florence Fuller Center will consist of a drop-by to a Head Start class.

The drop-by will be closed to the press.

ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI

Friday, May 3rd

I. OVERVIEW

Your trip to St. Louis will include a visit to the Mentor St. Louis program, where you will meet members of local churches and synagogues who are acting as mentors to at-risk children; a bookstore event at the Library, Limited Bookstore; and interviews with local radio and television stations.

II. EVENTS

"Mentor St. Louis" Program

Background

Your visit to the "Mentor St. Louis" program on Friday provides an opportunity to highlight the efforts of churches and synagogues in the St. Louis area that are expanding their traditional roles and reaching out to help at-risk children in the community. This event also provides an opportunity to reiterate your message about religious tolerance and...

"Mentor St. Louis" is a collaborative effort between 16 local churches and synagogues and the St. Louis public school system that works to give children a good start in school through individualized, personal contact with an adult mentor. Through this program, church and synagogue members volunteer to act as mentors to kindergarten students -- they participate in school activities with their mentees at least once a month, sit in on teacher-parent conferences, attend school plays and sports events, and participate in a variety of other activities designed to build self-esteem and promote positive attitudes about school. The mentors are paired with their mentees in kindergarten, and usually make a commitment to stay with them through the elementary school grades.

Through the Mentor St. Louis program, which was initiated last year, more than 250 church and synagogue members mentor students at four public elementary schools. Unlike some mentoring programs, which target only a few children in each class, the Mentor St. Louis program assigns mentors to every kindergartner at each of the four participating schools. Mentor St. Louis advocates a holistic approach to learning -- in addition to the academic aspects of the program, the mentors also work closely with parents to address the physical and social needs of their mentees to help assure a successful school experience.

In addition to helping students, the program also brings together people from different faith communities -- one elementary school, for instance, is served by volunteers from an all-black Baptist church, a synagogue, and a primarily white Presbyterian church. Many of the volunteers are also bringing their houses of worship together for other projects as well -- for example, one synagogue and church recently sponsored joint worship services for Martin

Luther King, Jr. Day.

Mentor St. Louis is a privately funded, non-profit program administered by the St. Louis public school system. The program depends heavily on donations from the community, particularly local businesses, which donate everything from carpets to camp scholarships.

Format

You are scheduled to visit a mentoring program at Clark Accelerated Academy, one of the four public elementary schools that participate in the Mentor St. Louis program. Upon arrival, you will be escorted on a brief tour of the program with the school principal, the minister of xx, and Linda Riekes (rye-kiss), the school district official who administers the Mentor St. Louis program. During the tour, you will meet mentors and students who will be working on a variety of activities, including arts and crafts, reading, and computer training on computers that were recently donated by a local bank.

Following the tour, you will have move into a substantive discussion with a small group of people who are involved in the Mentor St. Louis program, including congregation leaders, mentors, parents, teachers, and a representative from the business community. This discussion will provide an opportunity to highlight not only the outreach efforts of the religious community, but all of the adults in the village -- businesspeople, parents, teachers, volunteers and others -- who are working together to make this program work for children. The Library, Limited Bookstore

Your visit to the Library, Limited Bookstore in St. Louis will follow the standard receiving line format of past bookstore events; approximately 2,000 people are expected to attend. According to Simon & Schuster, the Library, Limited is one of the largest and best independent bookstores in the country, and the premier bookseller in St. Louis. The store plans to donate a portion of its proceeds from this event to the Bob Costas Cancer Center at Cardinal Glennon Children's Hospital in St. Louis.

On Friday morning, you will have an opportunity to do interviews with several local radio stations before your visit to the Mentor St. Louis program. You are also scheduled for an interview with a local television station at the event (briefings to be forwarded by Sue Vogelsinger).

ST. PAUL, MINNESOTA

I. OVERVIEW

Your trip to St. Paul will include a visit to the St. Paul Companies, where you will have an opportunity to highlight the efforts of a socially responsible business, followed by a book event at the Hungry Mind bookstore.

II. EVENTS

The St. Paul Companies

Background

Your visit to the St. Paul Companies on Friday provides an opportunity to highlight a business that has successfully combined family-friendly policies with corporate profitability. The St. Paul Companies, a Fortune 500 business that specializes in property-casualty insurance underwriting, is very progressive in terms of the family-friendly benefits and policies it offers to employees.

Women account for more than 66% of the 9,000 workers at the St. Paul Companies, and the company has made a commitment to helping its employees balance work and family life. Last year, the company was recognized by Working Mother magazine as one of the top 100 companies in America for working mothers. One important component of the company's family-friendly efforts is its onsite, state-of-the-art day care center staffed by child care professionals with degrees in early childhood development. The center offers a developmental curriculum for children from ages zero to six, an array of age-appropriate toys and equipment, and allows employees to stay in close contact with their children throughout the day -- parents can even receive periodic updates on their children via e-mail.

The St. Paul Companies' other family-friendly policies include job sharing, flexible work hours, telecommuting, a two-month paid maternity leave policy (along with an unpaid paternity leave policy), an elder care referral service, and a full-time work/family coordinator. The company has established an in-house "women's network" that works to develop new ways to make the company a better workplace for women, and provide women employees with more opportunities for advancement within the company. The St. Paul Companies has pledged to join the Women's Bureau "honor roll," which recognizes company that has pledged to join the honor role of the Women's Bureau at the Labor Department honor -- participated in an event highlighting the honor role last OC

The St. Paul Companies views these business practices as a necessary response to the

changing profile of the American family and workforce -- according to the Census Bureau, more than half of all mothers with children under six work outside the home. Moreover, officials at the St. Paul Companies say that these family-friendly policies have translated into more productive employees who are more committed to the company.

Format

Upon arrival at the St. Paul Companies, you will be escorted on a tour of the company's onsite day care center by CEO Doug Leatherdale, Karen Himley, vice president of communications, and Diane Cushman, the company's work and family coordinator. After visiting with several parents, children and child care providers at the center, you will move into a discussion with Doug Leatherdale, Karen Himley, and several employees who will tell you how their employers' family-friendly policies have enabled them to be both good parents and good employees. This discussion provides an opportunity to reiterate the message that companies can do good business and do right by their employees. (List of discussion participants is attached).

Hungry Mind Bookstore

Your visit to Hungry Mind Bookstore in St. Paul will follow the standard receiving line format of past bookstore events; approximately 2,000 people are expected to attend. Hungry Mind plans to donate a portion of its proceeds from this event to Gillette Children's Hospital in St. Paul.
