I. PURPOSE

This live 20-minute interview will allow you to discuss the details of the Kosovo peace agreement and the overall success of Operation Allied Force. More than many other television news interviews, this one will let you discuss the military operation and peace plan in front of an audience that is truly interested in substantive public policy issues.

There will be a 45-minute briefing prior to the interview.

II. BACKGROUND

The *NewsHour* with Jim Lehrer is the flagship news program of public television in the United States. The *NewsHour*'s average audience of 4,000,000 each evening is smaller than those of the network evening news broadcasts but rivals those of the Sunday morning public affairs programs. The *NewsHour* allows its interview subjects to state their views without being subjected to "gotcha" style questions. Most importantly, the *NewsHour* is watched carefully by print and broadcast journalists as well as political, community and opinion leaders.

Jim Lehrer became the lead anchor of the show in October, 1995, after the retirement of his co-anchor of many years, Robin MacNeil. Jim Lehrer is widely recognized as being among the fairest broadcast journalists on the air today. Lehrer last interviewed you during the Spring of 1998 on a special program devoted to your Race Initiative.

III. QUESTIONS

Lehrer's questions will be entirely devoted to the operation in Kosovo. His questions may be tough, but they are rarely pointedly personal or in any way disrespectful. He is one of the most prepared interviewers in the news business, often quoting directly from speeches, editorials, and prior interviews.

You will videotape a message to the Kosovar refugees and the people of Albania and Macedonia. This video will allow you to share NATO's success in Kosovo with the Kosovar refugees for whom the conflict was fought; to reassert our commitment to provide for their safe return to Kosovo; to urge the refugees to cooperate with the international security force and caution them on the risks of a hasty return; and to express our gratitude to the people of Macedonia and Albania who hosted the refugees throughout the conflict.

The video message will be made available via the United States Information Agency's WorldNet satellite to television stations in the Balkan region, which are widely viewed by refugees in the camps and internally displaced persons in Kosovo. The message will first be broadcast at approximately 9:00 a.m. local time, Saturday, June 12, and rebroadcast throughout the weekend.

Audio will be made available to Voice of America and Radio Free Europe for radio broadcast. An estimated one in four refugees own radios, and VOA and RFE capture a large audience throughout the region.

In addition, USIA plans to reprint the transcript in a special edition of *Kontakti* newsletter, which circulates in the camps, and carry it via stream audio technology on the USIA website. It will be translated into Albanian, Serbo-Croatian, Bulgarian and other regional languages.

I. PURPOSE

To announce the findings of a Justice Department report showing that, since taking effect in 1994, the Brady Law has blocked over 400,000 illegal gun sales; and to challenge the House of Representatives to pass common-sense gun legislation.

II. BACKGROUND

The Justice Department's Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) will release a study showing that, under the interim provisions of the Brady Law, approximately 312,000 applications to buy handguns were rejected because background checks revealed the purchaser was prohibited by state or federal law from buying a handgun. The interim provisions of the Brady Law, which were in effect from 3/1/94 to 11/29/98, allowed designated state and local law enforcement officials up to five business days to conduct background checks of all prospective handgun purchasers.

The Justice Department will also report today that, during its first six months of operation, the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) blocked an estimated 90,000 illegal gun sales. The NICS, which was mandated by the Brady Law and replaced its interim provisions last November, allows law enforcement officials access to a more inclusive set of records than was previously available, and applies not just to handguns but to all firearms.

You will also call on the House to pass effective gun legislation that:

1. Closes the Gun Show Loophole.
2. Raises the Age of Handgun Ownership From 18 to 21.
3. Includes the Same Common Sense Gun Measures Already Passed by the Senate.

You will especially highlight the impact of gun lobby efforts to reduce the amount of time law enforcement has to complete a Brady background check at gun shows. Although more than 70 percent of background checks are completed within minutes, and nearly 95 percent within a 2-hour period, the remaining 5 percent take longer for a reason: they are much more likely to turn up a problem and result in a denial. If proposals to shorten background checks at gun shows to between 24 and 72 hours were applied to the NICS, the FBI estimates that between 9,000 and 17,000 prohibited persons would have been able to buy guns over the past six months.

ROSE GARDEN, THE WHITE HOUSE
June 15, 1999**

Acknowledgments:

Five and a half years ago, here at the White House, I signed the Brady Bill into law. On that day, I said that the success of the Brady bill "proved once again that democracy can work." The American people—and their grassroots demand for common sense action against gun violence--prevailed over an entrenched and powerful Washington gun lobby.

Now, in the aftermath of the terrible shootings in Littleton, our nation has become even more galvanized to act on every front to reduce violence--especially violence committed by, and against, our children. In recent weeks, we have talked about the need to reduce our childrens' exposure to violence in the media, and I have taken steps to make that happen. We have talked about the need for parents to be more present in their childrens' lives, I have taken new steps to help working parents find the time to do so. But it is also abundantly clear that that we must take new steps to keep guns out of the hands of juveniles, criminals, and others who should not have them.

In short, it is time to strengthen the Brady Law. Congress has a chance to do so this week. Once again, the gun lobby is resisting with all its might. And once again, we are battling not just for the safety of our families, but for the soundness of our democracy.

Support for strengthen the Brady law is as broad as America. Teachers, doctors, law enforcement officials, even gun manufacturers support it. About the only ones against it are the NRA and its allies in Congress, and they are throwing up the kind of rhetorical smokescreen they did six years ago. Back then, the gun lobby said the Brady bill threatened the right of citizens to own firearms. Today, we know that the Second Amendment is alive and well. The gun lobby said gun violence would not be reduced. In fact, gun crimes have fallen by over 25 percent since 1993, and police chiefs across America believe the Brady law was vital to their efforts. The gun lobby said that requiring background checks at gun stores wouldn't keep guns out of the hands of criminals because criminals don't buy guns at stores. That claim has now been disproved hundreds of thousands of times.

Periodically, the Justice Department estimates how effective the Brady Law has been in keeping guns out of the hands of those who should not have them. Today, I am pleased to announce the latest figures. Since it went into effect in 1994, the Brady law has blocked over 400,000 illegal gun sales. Two-thirds of those sales were to people indicted or convicted of felony crimes. Most of the rest had records of domestic violence, drug abuse, or mental illness. We have stopped over 400,000

dangerous gun sales since 1994 because Congress listened not to the NRA, but to the American people, and passed the Brady bill. This week, Congress has another choice: to strengthen the Brady bill or weaken it.

The Brady Law has worked. It has worked so well, in fact, that criminals now have to buy their weapons at places not covered by the law, such as gun shows. Earlier this year, I sent Congress measures to close this loophole by extending Brady background checks to gun shows and flea markets, when guns are sold along with other items. Last month, the Senate passed these measures, thanks to a tie-breaking vote by the Vice President, and despite efforts by the gun lobby to shoot new loopholes in the Brady law.

The Senate did the right thing. Now, the House must do the right thing. It must vote to strengthen the Brady law, and reject measures that would weaken it, as bills ghost written by the gun lobby would surely do. The gun lobby's bills would exempt flea markets from Brady checks, thus inviting felons, fugitives, and stalkers to buy their weapons at flea markets. The gun lobby's bills would narrow the time allowed for background checks, giving thousands of criminals a year the ability to slip through the system. They would let gun dealers ship weapons directly to unlicensed buyers across state lines, opening up the mother of all loopholes. I call on the House to reject these bills, and pass legislation that will strengthen, not weaken, the Brady law.

I also call on the House to take further action to reduce gun violence, especially among the young. Yesterday, the Vice President announced a new government study showing that young people age 18 through 20, who make up just four percent of America's population, commit 24 percent of all gun murders. We could save lives by raising the legal age of handgun possession from 18 to 21, and I ask the House to do so. I also call on the House to mandate child safety locks be sold with all new handguns, as the Senate has done.

I. PURPOSE

To award the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor to Rosa Parks in recognition of her contributions to the Nation.

II. BACKGROUND

On May 4, 1999, you signed into law, S. 531, a bill to authorize you to award the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor to Mrs. Rosa Parks. The bill, which was sponsored by Senator Spencer Abraham (R-MI) in the Senate and Representative Julia Carson (D-IN) in the House, passed overwhelmingly in both Houses with wide, bipartisan support.

Please note that the medal has not yet been through the final approval process which is controlled by the U.S. Mint. But it was the wish of Mrs. Parks and her representatives to have the ceremony as soon as could be reasonably scheduled. So you will be presenting Mrs. Parks with a "gold line" copy of the resolution, not the medal. You will need to be extremely careful after you present the resolution to Mrs. Parks to refer everyone's attention to a "design which has been submitted for approval," but which has not actually been approved. This design will be off the stage to your left and when you gesture toward it, it will be unveiled by a local group of D.C. students.

As you know, Rosa Parks was arrested on December 1955, in Montgomery, Alabama, for refusing to give up her seat on a bus to a white man, and her stand for equal rights became legendary. News of Rosa Parks' arrest resulted in 42,000 African Americans boycotting Montgomery buses for 381 days, beginning on December 5, 1955, until the bus segregation laws were changed on December 21, 1956. Rosa Parks is honored as the 'First Lady of civil rights' and the 'Mother of the Freedom Movement', and her quiet dignity ignited one of the most significant social movements in the history of the United States.

Rosa Parks is the recipient of many awards and accolades for her efforts on behalf of racial harmony, including the Springarn Award, the NAACP's highest honor for civil rights contributions, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the Nation's highest civilian honor, and

the first International Freedom Conductor Award from the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center. Mrs. Parks currently resides in Detroit, Michigan.

Mrs. Parks was the first woman to join the Montgomery chapter of the NAACP, was an active volunteer for the Montgomery Voters League, and in 1987, co-founded the Rosa and Raymond Parks Institute for Self-Development.

In fewer than 200 days, the world will celebrate a new milestone – the conclusion of yet another century. Decades ago, it was said that the 20th Century would be an American Century. At century's end, it is not too difficult to see how that prophecy has come true.

The triumph of America is fundamentally the triumph of freedom in our century – of democracy over dictatorship, of free enterprise over state socialism, of tolerance over bigotry. The fight for freedom was waged on the beaches of Normandy and the South Pacific, at Checkpoint Charlie, and in the classrooms, lunch counters, and public buses of the segregated South. At stake was one simple, yet revolutionary, American ideal -- that we are all created equal, endowed with the inalienable right to govern ourselves and live free.

On that fateful evening, on that fateful city bus in Montgomery, Alabama 44 years ago, Rosa Parks reminded all of us that America still lived far short of these most cherished ideals. Her dignified, yet defiant "No," to that bus driver reminded us that, for millions of Americans, through hundreds of weary years, this sweet land of liberty yielded only bitter fruit and silent tears. She reminded us that the ugly shackles of racism kept America's house divided, separate and unequal, denying African-American men and women the opportunity to elect their own leaders, to educate their children, to succeed according to their own talents and abilities. As Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. would later explain, Rosa Parks "was anchored to that seat by the accumulated indignities of days gone by and the countless aspirations of generations yet unborn." Her simple act of dignity set off an earthquake of change, clearing the way for a new America where all are judged not by the color of our skin, but by the content of our character.

For two centuries, America has been defined by our struggle to live closer to our ideals. We are a great nation because every time our ideals have been threatened or ignored, courageous Americans have stepped forward to defend and inspire all of us to honor them. Rosa Parks stepped forward to honor America on that day in 1955. And in so doing, she helped make this 20th Century, the American Century.

Mrs. Parks has said that she "did not get on that bus to get arrested. I got on the bus to go home." In so many ways, Rosa Parks brought America back to our one true home – one built on a foundation of respect and tolerance, of justice and equality for all. Mrs. Parks, your place is already assured in the pantheon of American heroes. And we are all in your debt. I am honored to present this Congressional Gold Medal as a small token of thanks from the American people, of our sincere gratitude for your unfailing courage and dignity.

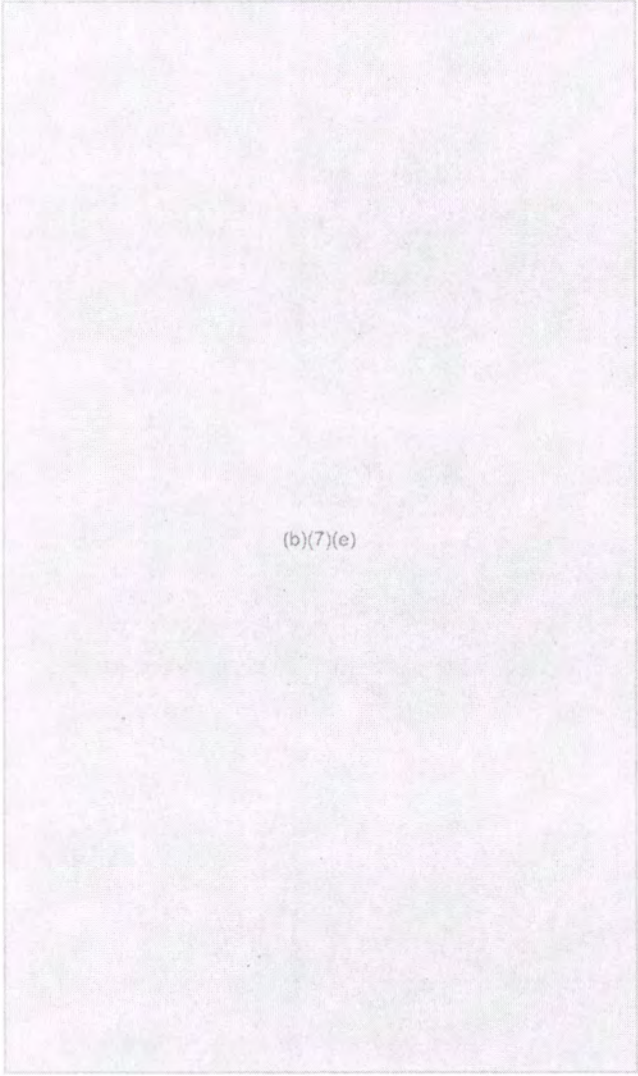
