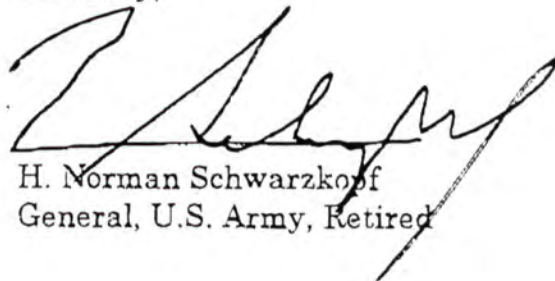
Dear President Clinton:

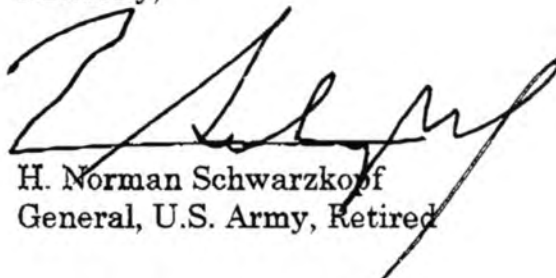
