Dear Mr. President:

Thank you for your recent note responding to my letter on debt relief and the Hunger Relief Act. I appreciate your efforts, and was thankful for the work done on the budget. Hopefully, the effort will continue this next year.

I wanted to bring another issue to your attention that I believe would be an excellent initiative for your Administration in 2000 -- a G.I. Bill for National Service. The Panetta Institute has been involved in studies on the issue of public service, and just completed an interesting nationwide poll by the Mellman Group on this issue. The results establish that, while students are turned off by politics, they are turned on by community service. The poll found that 75 percent would not choose a career in politics, but 73 percent were involved in voluntary efforts at the community level. Nearly three-quarters have volunteered, most more than once, and most intend to get engaged at the local level. Contrary to public perception, they are not cynical or alienated by government, they simply find work at the local level to be more relevant to their lives.

In addition, while a clear majority oppose a national service, a clear majority support some form of student loan relief in exchange.

The fact is that there is an amazing reservoir of commitment with the right incentives. Obviously, you have led the nation in commitment to volunteerism. To seal this legacy, a proposal for a set period of service to the nation, similar to the G.I. Bill. Students are overwhelmed by student loan obligations and are looking for high-paying jobs. But deep down, they understand the importance of national service. An approach that provides full tuition or forgiveness of student loan obligations. A national service would renew a sense of duty to this nation.

Dear President Clinton,

We are acquainted, but it has been a long time since our last meeting. You and Hillary know me as Ginger Crane. I was privileged to visit with Hillary at the White House in October 1998. I feel so honored that on very short notice she made time for me in her busy schedule. It was delightful to have a private meeting with her and reminisce about the Arkansas days. My hometown is Paris, Arkansas. You and Hillary have enjoyed the famous home cooking of Betty Hardwick when you visited Mort and Betty in their home in Paris. I am Mort Hardwick's niece. You were so kind to send roses and to call Betty when Mort died. It is difficult to adequately express the extent of gratitude felt by our entire family for your expression of sorrow and of friendship. You have never forgotten a friend even though your path in life led you to the exclusivity of the White House.

You may remember that I am a pediatric nurse practitioner who worked with Bob Fiser, MD, and Bob Arrington, MD, at Arkansas Children's Hospital. Bob Arrington and I were present when Chelsea was born at Baptist Medical Center. I recall sitting on the floor with you in Hillary's room while she cuddled a very jaundiced baby and you perused a children's book about ducks that was given to Chelsea by Fitz Mondale. I remember thinking what a wonderful and privileged life that precious baby would have with you and Hillary as her loving and intellectually gifted parents. Every child should be so blessed.

I was prompted to seek your assistance when I learned of your intent to allocate additional funding for family planning programs. I applied to the Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) for federal grant money designated as Title Ten funding for nurse practitioner (NP) training and certification in Women's Health/Family Planning. My request was denied. I am asking for your assistance in reversing this denial. I am presently employed by the ADH as a registered nurse practitioner (RNP) in Women's Health. I have a master's degree in Maternal/Child Health Nursing and I am nationally board certified in pediatrics. **I AM NOT BOARD CERTIFIED AS A Women's Health Nurse Practitioner.** I desire the opportunity to achieve this certification through Title Ten funding. The ADH is the only agency in Arkansas to receive Title Ten funding. In the past the ADH has sent public health nurses (not NP's) to a nurse practitioner certification program in Dallas, Texas. These nurses are now ADH nurse practitioners certified in the speciality area of Women's Health. I submitted a request (to ADH) to attend a nurse practitioner certification program in Women's Health through the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing which is affiliated with Planned Parenthood Federation of America Inc. This program is a forty-six week distance learning tract requiring only four weeks in Philadelphia. **The session beginning April 3, 2000 is the last opportunity I have to attend a certification program using Title Ten funds as this funding expires April 10, 2000.** Without this grant, a nurse would pay \$10,000 in tuition alone to attend this program.

The reasons given by ADH for denial of my request are as follows: (1) funding is not available, (2) the expansion of my scope of practice through certification will not alter my job description. The needs of the ADH can be presently met by employing RNP's who are not board certified, but by law can practice as Women's Health Nurse Practitioners, (3) the NP certification program

requires one or two MD's or NP's to serve as clinical supervisors during the clinical portion of the program, (4) the ADH does not guarantee employment forty-six weeks in advance. Title Ten funding requires a letter of intent to hire from a Title Ten Agency before funding can be given to an individual for NP training and certification through an approved University based NP program. This letter was given to the nurses who attended the Dallas program. In response to "reason for denial" number (1), I did not request any financial support other than the federal grant money (Title Ten funding). I only requested a leave of absence, a letter of "intent to hire" after successful completion of the NP certification program, and allocation of time for supervision by MD or NP during the clinical portion of the program. I expressed my intent to pay for any expenses not covered under Title Ten. I did not request a continuation of my salary during the forty-six week program. The nurses who participated in the nine month NP certification program in Dallas received their regular salary and total funding for travel, food, housing and books. Tuition was paid by Title Ten funds administered through the ADH. "Reason for denial" number (2) is complex and requires an understanding of "Scope of Practice" as defined by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. In Arkansas, a registered nurse practitioner (RNP) may practice in a speciality area, i.e. Women's Health or Pediatrics, without national board certification if he or she works under the supervision of a medical doctor and follows written protocols outlining the scope of patient care which includes patient education, evaluation, diagnosis and treatment/RX. In other States, NP's must successfully complete a certification program in order to practice and to be eligible to take a national board certification examination. Arkansas will eventually adopt the same standards.

I restate that I AM NOT BOARD CERTIFIED as a Women's Health Nurse Practitioner. **ONLY NP's with certification from approved University based certification programs may qualify to take a national board certification examination. Advanced Practice Status is granted ONLY to Nationally Board Certified Nurse Practitioners. Prescriptive authority is granted ONLY to Advanced Practice Nurse Practitioners.** Prescriptive Authority is essential in rural practice settings. Employers are increasingly requiring prescriptive authority as a condition of employment.

**How does the ADH benefit from my acquisition of national board certification?** The answer is obvious from a medical-legal view. In this litigious society, documentation of competency through the attainment of the highest level of education, certification and registration, must be the aspiration of any agency providing health care. Apparently this view is not considered a compelling argument for NP certification in Arkansas. The contention of the ADH is that, as a non board certified RNP, I practice within the law and within my scope of practice as described in protocols established by the ADH. The American Nurse's Association and all State Boards of Nursing are constantly elevating educational requirements and standards of practice for NP's. I have no doubt that National Board Certification will be required for NP's in Arkansas before I retire. Will federal grant funds be available when this occurs? **Title Ten funding expires April 10, 2000.**

Are you still with me Bill? To summarize, I have no support from the ADH to use allocated federal funds to advance my education, competency or scope of practice. The minimum support I require from the ADH is a letter of "intent to hire". A letter of "intent to hire" is required for Title Ten funding. Does another avenue exist for me to access Title Ten funding for NP

certification? Is the ADH my only access to this federal grant money?

I realize that compared to "Matters of State", my situation is of little importance. However, it is important to provide medical services, **specifically Family Planning Services**, to medically under served and economically challenged citizens of Arkansas. It is equally important to advance the scope of practice of nurse practitioners who frequently provide the only available medical care in rural areas of our State and Country.

It is my hope that you will be inclined to use your influence, regarding federal funding to a State agency, to advance my goal of achieving National Board Certification, Advanced Practice Status and Prescriptive Authority. I have requested to personally discuss this matter with the Director of ADH, Dr. Faye Boozman, but I was denied access to the Director. He is not aware of my request. A conversation with THE PRESIDENT may evoke his interest in this matter. I may be chastised for circumventing "proper" channels, but sometimes one must face adversity to achieve one's goals and support one's personal/professional standards. It is my strong conviction that the classification of NURSE PRACTITIONER be exclusively reserved for masters prepared nurses who achieve National Board Certification as a Nurse Practitioners. Our patients/clients deserve no less.

On a personal note, I continue to have great respect and admiration for you and Hillary. I have been and will continue to be a staunch supporter. Shared political views and philosophies represent reasons for support. Remembrance of old friends, expressions of kindness, deep commitment to the betterment of one's fellowman and Country represent reasons for respect and admiration. Mr. President, you are supported, respected and admired.

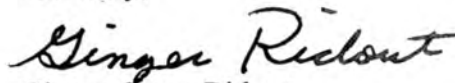

Classes begin April 3, 2000. Title Ten funds expire April 10, 2000.**

I would greatly appreciate a written response. I just became a grandmother and I know my son and grandson will cherish this (letter from President Bill Clinton) as a family heirloom to be preserved and passed from generation to generation.

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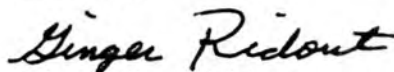
