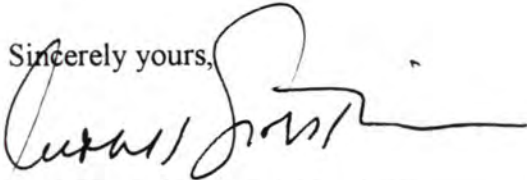

Dear President Clinton,

I am writing to you on behalf of the Patriots of Christian Fellowship Church Schools to request letters of support and financial assistance in our effort to educate and equip America's emerging Patriots.

Slightly over four years ago I began to trace my family lineage. One family member in particular, a Revolutionary War soldier named Jonathan Bozorth, intrigued me. He was a member of the 8th Pennsylvania Regiment, and I soon became immersed in the history of his era.

As I learned about the founding of the United States, I became embarrassed by my ignorance. I became determined to learn more of the suffering, sacrifices, obstacles, and victories our founders experienced. My life has truly been changed. The history class that was incomprehensible for me in high school had transformed into living color.

The patriotic fire now burning in my bones inspired me to join the Sons of the American Revolution. Still desiring to get more involved, and seeing the need for our children to learn the history of our founding fathers, I started an American heritage program in conjunction with the school at my church called "The Patriots."

The group is already active and growing. We will be performing in the Waukegan Independence Day Parade and at the Lake County Fairgrounds in July of 2000. We are also planning to take our Patriots to Colonial Williamsburg, Virginia, in September. If Thomas Paine were alive today and saw the plight of our children, he might say, "These are the times that try Children's souls..." On December 29, 1999, our Patriots will gathered during their Christmas vacation to compose their Declaration of Independence and to declare separation from their enemies: Drugs, Gangs, and Alcohol. This document will be signed by our founding Patriots and used as our charter for the coming years.

My specific goal is to find scholarship donations and other contributions for our ethnically diverse group of children in grades 4th to 6th. We are in need of authentic coats, vests, shirts, hats, knickers, musket replicas, lanterns, tents, and educational books and videos. All items remain property of the church school. For the children in the program to use them, each child must earn Continental Dollars awarded to each Patriot who attends classes, practices the fife or drum, and learns to recite the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence. Discipline is being taught in the form of marching drills, musket handling, and learning to act as a team.

Contributions of any size would greatly help in making these goals become reality, and are completely tax-deductible. Your gift of a one-year scholarship to our school would provide tuition for a new Patriot including books, lunches, and Patriots uniform at the cost of just \$3,500. Any donations not including a full scholarship will go directly into uniform and curriculum items.

Mr. President, It is only through this "hands on" experience can we expect our children, and soon to be adults, to reverence and defend the heritage they will come to appreciate. I am asking that you assist me in this worthwhile effort of raising a Patriot. Though money will provide the necessary items we lack, a letter from you will greatly encourage our Patriots. The children thoroughly enjoy this program today, but they will appreciate it a hundred fold in the years to come. It is vital for our children today to understand the privilege and responsibility of living in a free nation if we expect it to remain so. I hope to instill in them the realization that they can go far beyond their own expectations if they only have the faith to press pass their feelings, pay the price, endure the sacrifice, and enjoy the victory.

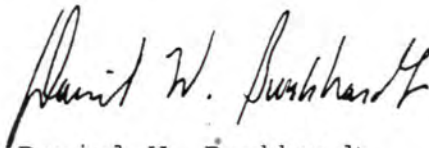

Dear Mr. President,

A long time has passed since we have spoken but both of us have been overloaded in our respective departments.

Thank you for the birthday note. It is hard to imagine that I am five years off the Senior Tour. ☺

I have been following with interest Hillary's entrance into the race for the Senate. Please pass on my very best to her for a successful campaign. No doubt you will be looking forward to having more time to play golf once your time in the White House comes to a close. *AKC*

On a separate issue, I wanted to inform you of a project that I am involved with. During a recent visit to Perth, Western Australia, I had the pleasure of joining the state Governor, Major General Michael Jeffery, in publicly launching a \$3 million project to establish a dedicated memorial to Catalina flying boats and those who flew them in operations against the Japanese in World War II.

I thought you might like to know the background to the project, which I believe provide an excellent opportunity to perpetuate public awareness of Australian - American cooperation.

The project, which I lent my name to about two years ago, is based on a restored former US Navy Catalina, due to be handed over to the Western Australia Government at a ceremony in Texas in March.

Perth, as you may know, was the US Navy's first operational Catalina base in Australia after the Japanese destroyed all but three of Patrol Wing 10's 45 aircraft in the Philippines. The wing was the US Navy's only aviation unit available to fight the

Japanese in the early weeks of the war and several US destroyers have been named after its pilots and enlisted men.

The memorial is to be established on the Swan River where the remnants of Patrol wing 10 and other US Navy Catalinas operated for three years in the only permanent operational US Catalina base in Australia. It also was the base for 30-hour non-stop "double sunrise" Catalina flights by Qantas and RAAF aircrews to Ceylon to maintain links with Britain after the fall of Singapore.

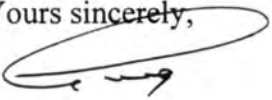
The memorial therefore will tell an excellent story of cooperation and pass on to future generations what can be achieved through qualities such as loyalty, dedications and cooperation. The US Navy Catalina will carry United States markings, of course. Prime Minister Howard intends asking the Australian Ambassador in Washington to attend the handover in Texas.

As patron I am pleased the Commander United States Seventh Fleet, Vice Admiral Doran, has asked US Navy staff in Singapore to look into oplit opportunities to transport the aircraft to Perth from the US West Coast. I shall also mention the matter to Admiral Fargo, Commander in Chief United States Pacific Fleet with the hope he can facilitate the West Coast oplit.

[It would give the project a huge lift if somehow we could have the Catalina delivered to Perth, Western Australia via the cooperation of the Seventh Fleet and any assistance from our office would be greatly appreciated.]

Thank you for your consideration. I look forward to hearing from you.

Dear Mr. President,

The Reverend Gardner C. Taylor is universally recognized as one of our nation's greatest assets. Distinguished religious leader and preacher, civic leader, and inspiration to millions, he is the living embodiment of the Black Church's role.

It is therefore fitting that this great American be awarded the Medal of Freedom.

A native of Baton Rouge, Louisiana in 1918, Dr. Taylor is a graduate of Leland College and the Oberlin Graduate School of Theology. After ministering to Baptist churches in Elyria, Ohio and New Orleans, he was called to The Concord Baptist Church of Christ in Brooklyn, New York in 1948, where he served until his retirement in 1990.

Dr. Taylor's remarkable ministry at Concord Baptist exemplifies the Church's historic role of community builder, organizer, educational, and social service institution. Under his guidance, membership tripled and thanks to Dr. Taylor's renowned preaching and his civic and social leadership, Concord became esteemed as the most prestigious black church in the nation.

His many accomplishments at Concord include establishment of a fully accredited elementary school, a 121-bed nursing home, a credit union, a seniors residence, a clothing exchange, and The Concord Church Christfund, an endowment for community uplift. After a 1952 fire destroyed the church, Dr. Taylor mobilized his low-and-moderate income congregation, raised \$1.7 million, and rebuilt the church.

Dr. Taylor is recognized as one of the greatest preachers in our history. In 1980, Time Magazine called him "the Dean of the Nation's black preachers" and similar admiring assessments of his extraordinary pulpit abilities and his theological eminence have been made by civic and religious leaders of all races and denominations. He has served as a

member of the General Council of the American Baptist Convention and is a founder and past president of the Progressive National Baptist Convention.

Dr. Taylor has preached on five continents to members of various denominations and his sermons have been broadcast nationwide, including his Inaugural Sermon at Washington Cathedral in January 1993, on the occasion of your first inauguration.

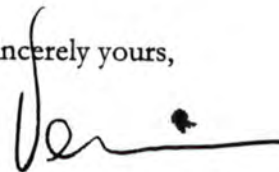
He is the author of four books, including a collection of his Lyman Beecher Lectures at Yale University, and his articles and sermons have been published widely. He has lectured on preaching at over a dozen universities and seminaries, including the Harvard and Yale Divinity Schools. Dr. Taylor's published and taped sermons are studied by students and preachers throughout the world and have influenced generations of scholars and religious leaders.

As important is Dr. Taylor's constructive influence on America's struggle to achieve racial equality. He was an early supporter of the civil rights movement in the 1950s and 1960s, advising and raising funds for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., in his campaigns against segregation, serving in numerous community posts including the New York City Board of Education and the New York Urban League, and leading the struggle for equal job opportunities in New York's construction industry.

Dr. Taylor's eminence has been recognized with many awards and honors, including honorary degrees and citations from over a dozen prestigious colleges and universities. In 1999, Atlanta's Interdenominational Theological Center established the Gardner C. Taylor Preaching Archive and Listening Room to keep alive the great tradition of black preaching. And a major thoroughfare in Brooklyn, Rev. Dr. Gardner C. Taylor Boulevard, is named in his honor.

Mr. President, I urge you to award The Medal of Freedom to Dr. Gardner C. Taylor, a great American whose contributions to our national life richly deserve such recognition.

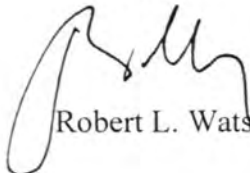

Dear Mr. President:

It was a pleasure to meet you the other evening when I attended the reception at Pamela Harriman's. As we discussed, the Longhorn Partners Pipeline project, once operational, will bring competitively priced, clean fuels to the growing communities of west Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona, benefiting many of the constituencies that are of critical importance to your Administration. This letter responds to your request for additional information on the project and highlights our remaining challenges.

The situation is this: My company intends to convert an existing pipeline from crude oil service to carry refined products, instead. Our plan is to deliver gasoline and other fuels from Houston-area refineries to El Paso, Texas, and the cities of New Mexico and Arizona. As soon as we begin deliveries to those markets, gasoline prices will become highly competitive, benefiting consumers. Gulf coast refineries produce modern, reformulated fuels that burn cleaner than fuels currently available in those areas. The economic and environmental benefits of our project are so sure and so significant that we have the strong support of the Congressional Hispanic Caucus and others representing the often-poor Hispanic communities along our southwestern border.

While other pipelines around the country have made similar conversions of their lines without interference, we and the United States Government were sued in litigation instigated and funded by a commercial competitor. The plaintiffs alleged that federal agencies had a legal duty to prepare a full environmental review of our proposed change-of-use.

Along with our co-defendant, the United States, we settled the litigation by agreeing to perform the review sought by the plaintiffs. Even though we and the United States strongly disagree with the plaintiffs' legal theory (which, among other things, raises the specter that the federal government will have to review every private business decision to reconfigure energy transportation infrastructure), we believed that in the interest of time it made sense to avoid further litigation. We were also prepared to subject our project to environmental review, since it has always been our intention to operate a project that meets the highest environmental and public safety standards. For almost a year now, the EPA and Department of Transportation have been performing the first-ever environmental review of a pipeline conversion. The review is being coordinated with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, as well.

We have agreed to implement an extraordinary range of protective measures that go well beyond the requirements of federal or state law. Our project represents a case study of

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how economic development can be harmonized with environmental protection. Not only will the fuels we supply help clean the air over southwestern cities, but we are investing literally million of dollars to benefit animals and plants and protect water supplies.

Your agencies issued a draft report late last year that found that our project would have no adverse impacts on the environment or public safety. The draft report was subjected to five public hearings. The project's opponents have resorted to numerous tactics to try to delay the agencies' decision making, and unfortunately they have had some success in this regard. We are literally months behind the schedule to which we originally agreed with the United States and the plaintiffs. We are, in fact, so far behind schedule that we now have the right to terminate the settlement agreement due to delay. The analysis was to be completed last year, but the agencies are now due to release the final report in mid-March, and they have begun to suggest that the date may slip further.

To restate what I told you when we spoke, as a businessman I have been extremely impressed by the efforts of a number of your appointees to help the Longhorn project move through the federal review process in a timely, sensible way. Your Council on Environmental Quality deserves particular credit for bringing leadership to a complex, multi-agency process. The Environmental Protection Agency's Regional Administrator in Dallas, Greg Cooke, and the head of the Transportation Department's Office of Pipeline Safety, Richard Felder and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Regional Administrator, David Frederick, have all done yeoman's work and deserve your strong support. Their good efforts have not been enough, however, to prevent extremely costly and unwarranted delays to the process.

You asked how you could help build on your Administration's already-significant achievements with regard to the Longhorn environmental review process. I have two requests for you. First, please instruct your agencies to do all they can to bring the environmental review to conclusion now. This process simply cannot drag on week-after-week without souring every bit of progress – for the environment and the economy – that's been made so far. Second, please instruct the Attorney General to defend your agencies with the best attorneys she can deploy when, as we expect, the agencies' decision is challenged in court in yet another bid to delay our project.

Again, thank you for speaking with me about this matter and for your consideration of my request for help.

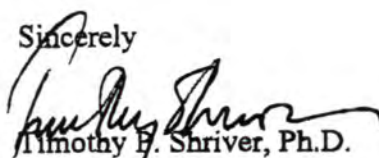
On behalf of Special Olympics athletes and families worldwide, I am writing you a thank you for all you have done for the Special Olympics movement and ask you for a small favor.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS CHINA MILLENNIUM MARCH

Over the past two years Special Olympics China has become one of the most active programs in Special Olympics. In celebration of the new millennium, Special Olympics, Inc. and Special Olympics China will launch their growth campaign for the 21st century with a new public commitment to enlist 500,000 persons with mental retardation into the Special Olympics Program within China by 2004. Clearly, this campaign will mark an open door for Special Olympics growth in China and mark one of the most ambitious outreach goals ever undertaken within the Special Olympics movement.

In celebration of this commitment, Special Olympics China is planning a series of special events during May 18-22, 2000 to recognize the achievements of Special Olympics athletes within China and around the world. In support of Special Olympics China's efforts, world-renowned actor Arnold Schwarzenegger has pledged his support and participation in the activities along with a host of high government and corporate leaders. The activities planned include a Law Enforcement Torch Run® along and around the Great Wall of China; Gala dinners at the Great Hall of People in Beijing and at The Portman Ritz-Carlton in Shanghai; Special Olympics competition in both cities; and an Arnold Schwarzenegger film festival.

The Torch Run will signify the first of its kind along the Great Wall and will represent an unprecedented, cooperative effort between Law enforcement agencies, Special Olympics China, Special Olympics, Inc., multi-national and China businesses, diplomatic missions, and government leaders in China. Participating in the May 20th run at the newly refurbished Juyong Pass will be approximately 4,000 runners, including: Chinese law enforcement officers from the military, customs, corrections and municipal police departments; Special Olympics athletes; Olympic athletes; high government officials and corporate leaders.

A Film Festival featuring Arnold Schwarzenegger films is being planned during the week to raise additional funds and awareness. Specific films and festival locations will be announced at a later date.

Beijing and Shanghai also will host a gala dinner celebration on Saturday, May 20th and Sunday, May 21st, respectively. The dinners will feature a night of Chinese headliner entertainment, an auction and specially produced vignettes on athletes from Special Olympics China. Guests will include government officials, Arnold

Schwarzenegger, The Honorable Sargent Shriver and Timothy P. Shriver of Special Olympics, Inc., corporate leaders, ambassadors, Olympic athletes and Special Olympics athletes and their families. Both evenings will commemorate the movement's first 30 years of heroes and celebrate the anticipation of a new generation of athlete heroes bringing the movement forward into the next century.

The Millennium March will offer Special Olympics China the opportunity to raise its level of awareness and profile within China and to raise significant funds to assist its exciting plans to dramatically introduce the Special Olympics program to thousands of new athletes throughout the country.

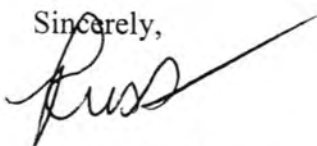
