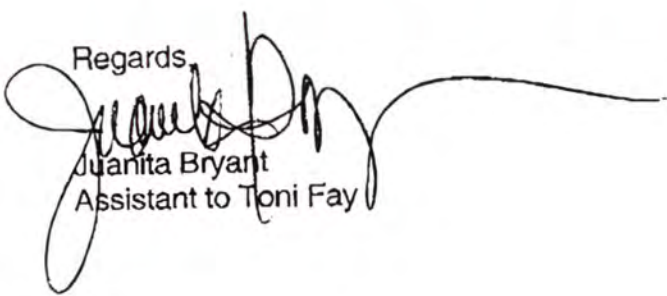

We're pleased she has agreed to continue in an advisory capacity to continue shepherding our work with the Apollo Theater and selected other projects.

As much as we regret Toni's departure, we know the legacy of achievement she leaves will continue to be a significant part of this company. In her nearly 20 years of service, Toni has been the architect and inspiration behind a range of important initiatives that have enhanced Time Warner's reputation as one of America's leading corporate citizens. Thanks to Toni's leadership, for example, Time to Read has developed into the country's largest and most successful corporate-sponsored volunteer literacy program. Toni was the prime mover in the creation of the Andrew Heiskell Community Service Awards, which have highlighted the impressive community contributions of people throughout the company and encouraged others to take part.

Toni has also taken the lead role in creating award-winning multi-media projects that have helped advance the national dialogue over racial and ethnic diversity, including the highly popular "Songs of My People" and "Americanos." In addition, Toni has instituted the Minority Business Development Program throughout the company and the biennial Social Responsibility Report, which provides a valuable overview of the depth and breadth of Time Warner's civic, educational and cultural commitments. She will be sorely missed, and we wish her well as she moves into this new phase of her life.

Biography

TONI FAY

Toni Fay is Vice President of Community Relations for Time Warner Inc., the world's largest media and entertainment company. She was elected a corporate officer in April 1993. She is responsible for the Company's community responsibility activities and the management of programs that integrate business objectives with societal issues.

Over the years, Toni executed several multimedia projects including: *Listen Up: the Lives of Quincy Jones*; *Songs of My People*; *Americanos -- Latino Life in the US*; *It's Us -- A Celebration of Who We Are in America Today*; and *Time To Read*, the nation's largest corporate-sponsored volunteer literacy program. Additionally, Ms. Fay is responsible for the company's minority business development and employee volunteerism programs.

Prior to joining Time Inc. in 1982, Toni held positions as a social worker in the New York City Department of Welfare (South Bronx); Director, PBA Halfway House; Regional Commissioner, Governor's Council on Drug and Alcohol Abuse (Commonwealth of Pennsylvania); Director of Planning and Development, National Council of Negro Women; and Executive Vice President, D. Park Gibson Associates.

She maintains an active interest and involvement in civic affairs and serves on the Boards of the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute; the NAACP Legal Defense Fund; the United States Committee for UNICEF; US Capitol Historical Society; The Congressional Black Caucus Foundation; The Apollo Theater Foundation and The United Way of Bergen County.

In 1996, she was appointed by President Clinton to the Board of the National Institute for Literacy.

Ms. Fay, a native New Yorker, attended public schools in both New York City and Teaneck, New Jersey. She received her B.A. from Duquesne University and her M.S.W. and M.Ed. from the University of Pittsburgh.
