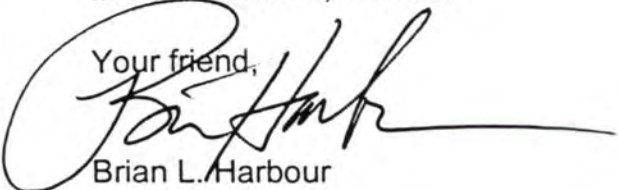

Thinking about our conversation last week, here is some follow-up:

- The French are not going to help us get Karadzic. The US military can overcome that, but only if you instruct them to do it, since there are strong forces in our military who do not want to. The same forces that undermined Wes Clark have for years undermined your goals of apprehending Karadzic, Mladic, and, ultimately, Milosevic. If you instruct the Pentagon to pick up Karadzic, it could be done almost immediately. My information is that he is still living 18 miles from Sarajevo. His support and protection are low. Our troops can move much more freely in the country than previously. There might be some broken china with the French. So what? It would be mended.
- The French are internally divided re. the war criminals. There is some indication that Chirac would be pleased to get some credit for this operation. As in our country, he is opposed by the French defense establishment, who consider apprehending war criminals penny ante and not worth the effort or risk. As you know, that thinking is ironically defeating. Without a sense of justice, the state remains in turmoil, and the troops must remain.
- Please forgive my directedness, but I believe you owe it to Wes to let him to pick up Karadzic before he's relieved of his duty next month. There are very few other things you can do to ameliorate the disgrace of his being relieved early. Frankly, giving him an award doesn't go very far, although it's better than nothing. Letting him do the job you sent him to do would mean much more.
- I would hate to think of these war criminals outlasting your two terms. That would be a travesty. Apprehending Karadzic would send a direct message to Milosovic, turning up the heat, and making it more likely that he will leave, or that someone will take up the offer about which and I spoke. Please finish the job in the Balkans to which you have devoted so much time and effort – and devoted so much of your self. Your team can do this, if you tell them to.

I will help any way I can.

An additional two thoughts:

- I expect you'll be in New York for the UN Millenium meeting in September. I hope you'll come to the State of the World Forum (founded by Gorbachev), which will be going on a few blocks away, to take credit for Women Waging Peace and the other women's initiatives you have supported over the years. (Interagency Council on Beijing Follow Up; Vital Voices: Women in Democracy; Bosnian Women's Initiative and other iterations in East Timor, Rwanda, etc.) I will talk with your scheduler, but as you know, it makes a big difference if you indicate to him/her some interest. (By the way, Marion Wright Edelman was the chair of the Forum a couple of years ago. You can think of it as a Davos that isn't focused on economics as much as overall world well-being. There are usually a string of Nobel Laureates speaking, and there will be several heads of state during the course of the week. They will schedule around your availability.)

• Harvard's Memorial Church (Peter Gomes) would like you to deliver their Peabody Address in April. I hope you can come. That would also be a fine occasion for you to mention Women Waging Peace, which is a Kennedy School initiative (although primarily funded by my private foundation).
