We became the number one school in all fifty states during the 1998-1999 school year by raising \$43,067.

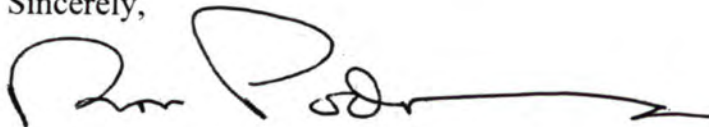

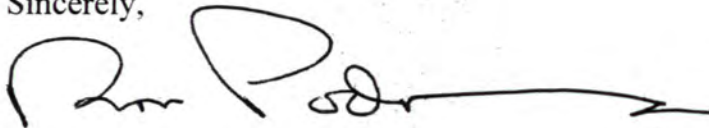
