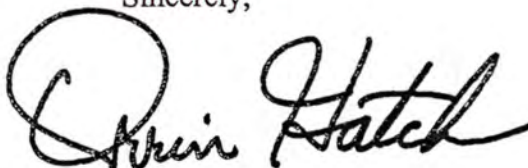

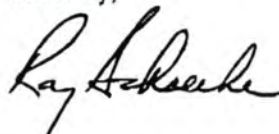

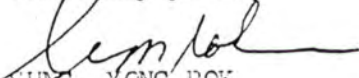

Dear Mr President :

1. The reason that I have decided to write this letter of petition to you is because no one in this whole world may be able to solve this problem besides you. I have long been hesitating before I start to write this petition to you, since you are the busiest person in whole world, both officially and personally. Even though I sincerely hope that you may have a chance to grace this problem, and please show me the way how to solve this problem. As attached letters of recommendation, appreciation, certificate of achievement and officially commended for the outstanding performance of duty, I have previously employed by the United States Army in Korea from August 13, 1951 to September 30, 1976. At present I am 69 years old, and am fighting with cancer, after I had stomach cancer operation at Inha University Hospital, located at Incheon Metropolitan City, Korea in May 1998.

THE BACK GROUNDS FOR WRITING THIS PETITION:

2. After my resignation from the US Army post, I have been engaged in the business of dealing Camera's/Binoculars and other sportic items. During the course of my selling business, as attached written accusation (Complaint) which was submitted to the Police Authority, Mr MIN, Byung Yeup had attempted to purchase my items, producing a bad promissory note, pretending it is a good note. Not noticing that Mr MIN disguised me with the bad note, I sold the items to him. Mr MIN then hurriedly disposed of the items then disappeared. After I found out that the promissory note is a bad one, I had nothing to do but to submit a written accusation to the Pusanjin National Police Station which is within the area of my residential jurisdiction. It was my understanding that

the Police had attempted to summon him several times but the accused had never shown up at the Police authority. The Police authority then put his name in a wanted person list. The accused, Mr MIN was arrested by the police during the course of spot check.

On April 23, 1985, Mr MIN appeared at my office with a friend of his, namely, Mr CHANG, Haeng Chin. At my office Mr MIN produced a Forestry Ledger in which his father owned a part of the land and asked me to withdraw the case, promising that he will discuss with his father to transfer the forestry land to me, leaving me a memorandum note that he will make sure that the forestry land to be transferred to me. I then submitted an agreement to the Police believing his words and then the Police dropped the case.

Mr MIN then disappeared and had never shown up/neighter his friend.

Nothing I could do more for him but to submit the case to the Civil Court. On July 18, 1986, Department of the 3rd Civil Section, Taejon District Court, concluded the case as attached.

A continuous check with the Korean Immigration authority, Mr MIN departed for the United States with a B1B2 visa and returned to Korea on September 8, 1989, then departed for the United States on September 30, 1989. Also a check with an unknown authority, it was disclosed that Mr MIN's address was at 41-4 74th Street, Woodside, Flushing, New York, United States of America. After I have noticed whereabouts of his address I have contacted Mr Marc SCHWARTZ, Attorneys and Counsellors at Law, 16 Court Street, Brooklyn, New York, 11241. The case was filled with the Civil Court of the City of New York, county of Queens and judgement entered on July 13, 1992. Mr SCHWARTZ had attempted to locate this individual but was unable to contact this man. Then Mr MIN moved to somewhere else, and did not leave his whereabouts.

Someday in June 1999, I have contacted his brother's home in Taejon and obtained his home telephone number as 359-0925, and his address was 3635 166th Street, Flushing, New York, 11358, USA. On June 3, 1999 I have written to him, asking him to settle this problem, attaching all evidencing documents, but he has never answered my letter. Someday in June 1999, I have called him on the telephone and an unidentified lady answered the phone but afterwards the phone was cut off. An attempt to find the telephone number from the Telephone Operator in New York, the operator answered "No such number". I asked the Korean Consulate General in New York to help me previously, as attached letter from Mr HEO, Ri Hun, the Korean Consulate General, they had

once contacted Mr MIN and asked Mr MIN to solve this case but after that he has never answered to the Consulate or to me.

3. Dear Mr President!!

As described in above, his wrong done/intentional criminal attitude may never be condoned in this human being societies. This guy should be apprehended and may be punished in accordance with the laws of the United States, I hope. I sincerely hope that this case may be solved somehow before I die. Your sympathetic consideration towards this case will be greatly appreciated by the undersigned.

4. CONTENTS OF COMPLAINT :

The complainant has been operating a Company, namely Kwanghak Sang Sa which is engaged in the business of selling whole or retail sales of Camera and other items at the present address, and the complainant does not have any personal knowledge about accused (1) and (2), but have personal knowledge about accused (3) who has been employed by the complaint as a salesman.

A. The accused (1) unknowing way obtained a promissory note, issued by LEE, Chang Sun, Representing director, Insung Trading Company Ltd., Address : 11-3 Pukchang -dong, Chung-ku, Special City of Seoul; Date of its issue : June 21, 1983, Date of Payment : September 23, 1983,

Place of Payment : Chedong Branch Office of Korea Commercial Bank

In the sum of W6,780,000 which was signed by YIM, Yong Sun, Representing Director, Pungsung Racket Co., located at 56-4 3-ka, Hankang-ro, Yongsan-ku, Special City of Seoul, but the signature was crossed out then the accused himself signed in the opposite. The accused then , in order to swindle money and other valuables, rallied with the accused (2) (3), and then by way of excuse that accused (3) having personal knowledge with the complainant, visited the complainant on July 15, 1983, with accused (3) who had personal knowledge about the complaint by way of excuse to purchase items from the complainant, then produced the promissory note, asked the complainant to give them items, believing the accused (3) pretending that the promissory note will be duly settled on the date indicated. The accused deceived the complainant, as if they obtained the promissory note in a proper way and it will be duly settled on the indicated date; they firstly received KOBICA Camerica/ Binoculars, burners, etc., total valued at W3,226,700 and secondly the accused received items valued at W3,555,100 (paying 1,800 won in cash which was over valued) on July 30th of the same year. The accused then kept those items at the Saeil Sangsa Company, operated by CHOE, Tae Sik non-accused, located at 63-1 Taesa-dong, Chung-kum taejon City, and then pretended that he sold the items to the CHOE, Tae Sik in the sum of W1,234,000 and then prepared a list of buyers employed by Sintanjin Tobacco Company, item valued at W3,206,000. The accused deceived the complainant as it is the true facts, and disposed of other items then made the promissory note to be dishonoured, then ran away. The accused swindled in the sum of W6,780,000 pretending that they were purchasing items from the complainant.

5. Remarks. The owner of Saeil Sangsa Company, CHOE, Tae il (Telephone Number : 22-4493) authorized the accused (1) to utilize a portion of his shop and the accused (1) used his company name as Chinyang Wholesales Co., but to the true facts the accused had no actual business results. The accused was asked where the items have been disposed of, then the accused produced an account slip that he sold items to Mr. CHOE, Tae Sik but it was untrustable. It was found by a check that the accused sold items to the Tobacco Company only in the sum of W900,000 and it was also developed that the list he made as selling the items valued at W3,206,000 was fraud. (It was identified by Mr KANG, at the Labour Union 9-0041)

The accused may be sold the rest of items to the market much cheaper than proper values, but it was unable to be identified.

Considering the surrounding circumstances, it is a joint fraudulent act, by using the accused (3)'s personal knowledge about the complainant, therefore, this complaint is hereby submitted.

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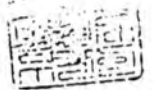
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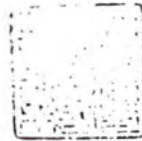

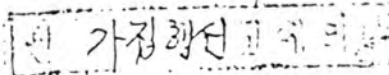

'Blister' Clintons? It's Illegal

Independent counsel Robert Ray is reportedly in the process of writing his final report on the work of his office and that of his predecessor, Kenneth Starr. He faces a critical decision: Will he write the report in such a way as to criticize or suggest wrongdoing by President Clinton or First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton?

During the last year, several leaks from the office of the independent counsel suggested that the final report would be, in the words of one newspaper story, "blistering" in its treatment of the Clintons.

If Ray does this, however, he will be violating the independent counsel law. The expert on this subject is none other than the former Senate majority leader and 1996 Republican presidential nominee, Bob Dole.

On Nov. 18, 1993, Dole rose to the Senate floor to propose an amendment to the Independent Counsel Act, limiting the scope of what the independent counsel could state in his final report. The act had been allowed to expire earlier in the year, in large part because of Dole's unhappiness with the broad Iran-Contra inquiry conducted by independent counsel Lawrence Walsh.

In particular, Dole was angry with Walsh for statements suggesting wrongdoing by individuals, including allegations of a coverup by Reagan administration officials, even though Walsh had chosen not to indict these individuals.

Section 594(h)(1)(B) of the expired act seemed to permit this. It provided that the final report could include not only a description of why people had been indicted, but also the "reasons for not prosecuting any matter within the prosecutorial discretion of such independent counsel." Dole moved to delete this latter provision, saying, "This language would have been an open invitation to independent counsels to editorialize on cases that they, for whatever reason, chose not to bring, smearing hard-earned reputations in the process."

Presciently, he went on: "In the last administration, it was

Republicans, in this administration it can be Democrats. I do not think it ought to happen to anybody, regardless of party, if they have not committed any crime or if they are not indicted for some criminal activity."

The Dole amendment deleting this language was passed that day by an overwhelming margin (as was the renewed Independent Counsel Act, which, in its final form, Dole opposed). After the deletion, Section 594(h)(1)(B) allowed the independent counsel in his final report only to set forth "fully and completely a description of the work of the independent counsel, including the disposition of all cases brought."

A full and complete "description" of the "work" of the independent counsel can only mean a factual description of the indictments brought and the convictions obtained. It cannot mean editorial comments about "possible" wrongdoing by those who were never indicted. Nor should Ray describe investigative reports or allegations that use innuendo as a surrogate for fact and evidence.

In fact, a fair reading of Section 594(h)(1)(B) and its legislative history should persuade Ray not to address matters or allegations that never led to an indictment for the very reason that they can be used to suggest wrongdoing without due process, exactly the grievance that led Dole to his limiting amendment.

The ultimate irony, of course, would be if Ray besmirches his brief tenure as the successor to Kenneth Starr by violating the law at the same time he has been opining on national television about the importance of upholding the law.

I would hope and expect that if Ray repeats the sins of Walsh in this regard, Dole will be ready to denounce him and defend the presumption of innocence of the Clintons — just as he denounced Lawrence Walsh and did the same for President George Bush.

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In the matter of deception One interesting question remains

Any alert viewer of TV police dramas knows that deception is often used to solve crimes.

We've all seen the clever sleuths on "Homicide" or "NYPD Blue" trick perps into confessing by pretending that their accomplices have given them up.

But what if investigators also take it upon themselves to lie to reporters? It's not illegal, you know. And what if highly publicized allegations never do come to trial? Isn't there a danger that innocent persons will be smeared?

You'd think the authors of a book entitled "Truth at Any Cost" would be very careful to prevent such a thing from happening, wouldn't you? If those authors were named Susan Schmidt and Michael Weisskopf, you'd be wrong.

Of course, you'd also think that the authors of what comes advertised as the definitive book on Kenneth Starr's probe of President Clinton would anticipate controversy and be prepared to stand their ground. You'd be wrong about that, too.

Criticized here and by Joe Conason in the *New York Observer* for factual inaccuracy, Schmidt and Weisskopf now whine that it's "unseemly" and "unethical" for the authors of a rival book to comment about their work.

What an amazing idea.

Somebody needs to teach these birds the distinction between book reviews and opinion columns. The thin-skinned duo had no answer for the content of those criticisms, merely for our bad manners. The *New York Post* reports that they have "declared war." It'll be interesting to see what form their offensive takes. Meanwhile, our motto remains "Bring it on."

But back to zealous prosecutors whispering falsehoods to gullible reporters. Starr's Office of Independent Counsel kept its moribund Whitewater investigation alive from May 1996 onward, and later hyped the Monica Lewinsky affair, by doing just that.

Some of the OIC's choicest tall tales are recycled almost unchanged in "Truth at Any Cost." Two examples should suffice.

One was dissected by University of Iowa journalism professor Gilbert Cranberg in Harvard's *Nieman Reports*: the imaginary "\$50,000 benefit" to the Clintons' investment from an illegal loan to Susan McDougal.

Schmidt and Weisskopf seek to justify the OIC's abusive treatment of Susan McDougal by emphasizing how crucial it was to learn "whether Bill Clinton had lied" when he denied pressuring Hale to lend \$300,000 to the McDougals.

"Some of that money," the authors assure us, "had gone to the benefit of the Whitewater Development Corporation, jointly owned by the Clintons and the McDougals."

That allegation was itself false. As Cranberg showed, the first Associated Press wire story that went out after closing arguments in the Tucker-McDougal trial stressed that OIC prosecutors had rested

"without showing how Clinton benefited from a \$300,000 loan as another witness [David Hale] had claimed."

The AP even quoted prosecutor Ray Jahn explaining that proving Hale's claim was unnecessary to his case. Indeed, Jahn's closing argument stressed that Jim McDougal had deceived the Clintons and cheated them. Overnight, however, little gremlins persuaded *The New York Times* to alter the AP story anonymously to include the make-believe \$50,000.

Cranberg dissected FBI agent Michael Patkus' testimony to show that, as the Pillsbury Report had previously shown, Jim McDougal had used the loan in a manner adverse to the Clintons' interests. Yet over the next two years, the imaginary \$50,000 was the centerpiece of countless accusatory Whitewater stories.

In a follow-up article in the Fall 1999 issue of *Nieman Reports*, Cranberg, former editor of the *Des Moines Register* editorial page, documented that the sources of the phony story had been OIC prosecutors. He wrung an admission out of an OIC spokesman that the story was not accurate and used the episode as an object lesson in the perils of anonymous sourcing, arguing that reporters had no obligation to protect the confidentiality of sources who deceived them.

Example No. 2 is Schmidt and Weisskopf's treatment of one of the most ballyhooed bits of disinformation from the Lewinsky extravaganza, the infamous "talking points." At issue was a crude document entitled "Points to make in affidavit" handed to Linda Tripp by Lewinsky as she drove her home from her Pentagon job on the afternoon of Jan. 14, 1998--that is, during the one-day interval between the OIC's surreptitious taping of their luncheon conversation and their grabbing Monica up at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel on the following day.

For months, the leaked talking points were held up as the "smoking-gun" evidence of an overt White House conspiracy to obstruct justice. Pundits like William Safire wrote columns speculating upon the high-ranking author's identity.

Even now, Schmidt and Weisskopf say the document's significance lay in its being "a script for altering Tripp's account, reported in *Newsweek* the previous August, of what had happened between Kathleen Willey and Clinton. . . . It looked like live evidence of witness tampering and subornation of perjury by Lewinsky."

Problem is, this was shown to be absolute rubbish by Congress' release of Starr's investigative file in the mistaken belief that it would doom Clinton. Instead, it increased sympathy for the humiliated president and exposed the machinations of Tripp and the OIC.

See, Lewinsky herself had written the talking points at Tripp's urging. Far from coaching Tripp to lie, their purpose was to help her avoid testifying in *Jones vs. Clinton* by filing a truthful affidavit stating that Willey was a deceitful gold digger who'd pursued the president aggressively and lied about the Oval Office "grope." If Tripp could avoid testifying, then nobody would ask her about Monica's secrets.

But did Tripp really fear testifying? She'd been in contact with the Jones lawyers for months. She wasn't lying about her bad opinion of Willey, which she'd expressed many times. She'd told *Newsweek's* Michael Isikoff that Willey lied. At Monica's urging, she'd written *Newsweek* a letter to that effect which the magazine published much later. (Isikoff's own book says he forgot about it in all the excitement.) She and Monica discussed Willey's treachery many times during their tape-recorded phone conversations. Tripp even testified about her dim view of Willey to Starr's grand jury.

Almost none of that information appears in "Truth at Any Cost."

Why not? Well, I'm not a mind reader. But real significance of the talking-points episode is that OIC prosecutors simply had to know, or strongly suspect, the document's actual purpose from the beginning. During the Jan. 13 lunch conversation the FBI surreptitiously taped, Monica returned to the topic obsessively, beseeching her supposed friend to protect her secret affair with Clinton by telling the truth about Willey. Their discussions often parallel the talking points word for word.

Yet after the document was leaked, prosecutors clearly encouraged reporters to see it as hard evidence of a White House conspiracy. Their purpose, as Jeffrey Toobin's book "A Vast Conspiracy" points out, was "to persuade official Washington . . . that Starr had a strong case" when all he really had was "that most cliché of dilemmas--a menopausal man having an affair with a young woman from the office."

The only interesting question about the talking points is whether they also were used to deceive the Department of Justice into expanding Starr's probe. That's not one we'd expect Schmidt and Weisskopf to answer.

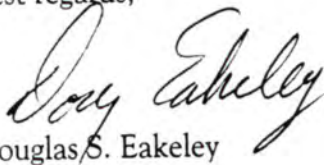

Dear Mr. President:

On June 9, 2000, you proclaimed the Ironwoods Forest National Monument in Arizona and cited the Antiquities Act of 1906 (16 U.S.C. 431) as the statutory authority for this proclamation. The Antiquities Act authorizes you, as President of the United States, to declare as national monuments landmarks, structures, and objects "that are situated upon the lands owned or controlled by the Government of the United States".

As you know, the boundaries of the Ironwoods Forest National Monument include 54,697 acres of land owned by the Arizona State Public School Trust and 6,012 acres of land owned by private individuals in addition to 129,022 acres of federal land. I am writing to inquire into the legal basis for the inclusion of lands which are not owned or controlled by the Government of the United States within the boundaries of the national monument.

Please provide me with citations to the specific legal authority for the inclusion of these lands within ten days. Thank you for your attention to this request.

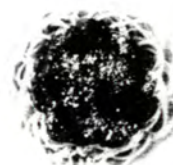

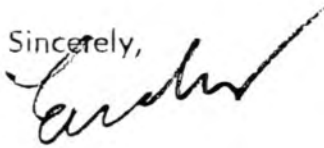

I thank you for your forbearance and understanding which you have shown to me during this morning's conversation.

Fritz and Paula Reuter devoted 40 years of their lives in rebuilding the history of the Jews in Germany. Though not of the Jewish faith, they consistently worked toward Germany's postwar understanding of the enormous contribution of the Jewish community since the 10th Century. The Presidents of France, Germany, Israel and the Trustees of Yad Vashem have honored Mr. & Mrs. Reuter by bestowing upon them their highest honors. During a U.S. lecture tour of the U.S. in 1989, Senator Lautenberg, received Mr. & Mrs. Reuter in his senate chambers; that same year, Mr. Reuter was invited to speak at the Jewish Theological Seminary in New York and at Gratz University in Philadelphia. **In 1987, Mr. & Mrs. Reuter hosted the then Governor & Mrs., now President & Mrs. Clinton, at the Raschi Museum in Worms. (News clipping enclosed).** Mr. Reuter was the driving force in bringing the museum to reality.

Mr. Reuter, an author and historian with many books to his credit on the subject of the Jewish Trinity Cities of Worms, Mainz and Speyer as well as on Martin Luther, the Reformation and the role of Wormatia (Worms) in the Holy Roman Empire. Recently, and days before his wife's passing, Mr. Reuter organized a protest against a gathering of European Neo-nazi in Worms.

The City of Worms, in addition to the 1034-built Raschi Synagogue, has within its original Roman walls, one of the largest and oldest Catholic cathedrals, built that same year by the same architect as the synagogue. 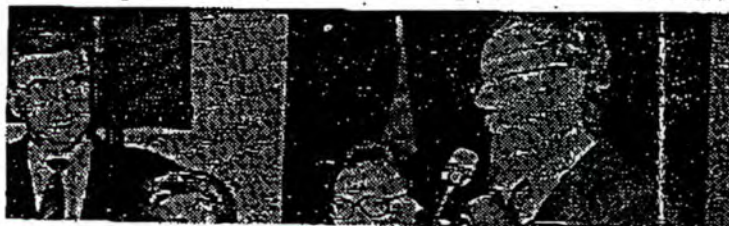
