I. PURPOSE

At the invitation of the Kennedy, Freeman and Besette families, YOU are attending the memorial service honoring the memory of John F. Kennedy, Jr. and Carolyn Besette Kennedy.

II. BACKGROUND

As you know, the plane piloted by John F. Kennedy, Jr. and carrying his wife, Carolyn Besette Kennedy, and sister-in-law, Lauren Besette, was reported missing in the early morning hours of Saturday, July 17. Kennedy and his wife were en route to the Kennedy family compound in Hyannis Port for the wedding of Rory Kennedy, John's cousin and the youngest daughter of Robert and Ethel Kennedy. When the plane failed to arrive at the Martha's Vineyard Airport as scheduled, a friend of the Kennedy family contacted the FAA, which began a preliminary search for the aircraft. Once the FAA failed to locate the Kennedy plane, a search and rescue (SAR) effort was launched by the Air Force (USAF) and the Coast Guard (USCG).

Rear Admiral Richard M. Larrabee was assigned to coordinate the SAR effort between the Department of Transportation, FAA, USCG, USAF, and other federal agencies. Once it became evident that there would be no survivors, Chairman Jim Hall and Robert Pearce of the National Transportation Safety Board were called in to head the accident investigation, which is ongoing. On Wednesday, July 21, the remote operated vehicle operated from the USS Grasp located a large portion of the fuselage of the Kennedy aircraft and Navy divers recovered the bodies of the three victims. The location was pinpointed by a coordinated effort and reflected extensive work by scientists at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration at the Commerce Department.

In accordance with a request by Senator Ted Kennedy and the Freeman and Bessette families, the U.S. Navy performed a burial at sea of all three victims this morning from the USS Briscoe. At the same time, an appropriate solemn observance was conducted aboard the aircraft carrier USS John F. Kennedy. The Navy performs burials-at-sea for military personnel, dependents and noteworthy citizens approximately 500 times each year.

The memorial service for John F. Kennedy, Jr. and Carolyn Bessette Kennedy is being held at the St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Manhattan where Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis attended services until she passed away in 1994.

The Freeman and Bessette families will also hold a memorial service at the Greenwich Christ Church on Saturday, July 24.

I. PURPOSE

At the invitation of the Kennedy, Freeman and Besette families, YOU are attending the memorial service honoring the memory of John F. Kennedy, Jr. and Carolyn Besette Kennedy.

II. BACKGROUND

As you know, the plane piloted by John F. Kennedy, Jr. and carrying his wife, Carolyn Besette Kennedy, and sister-in-law, Lauren Besette, was reported missing in the early morning hours of Saturday, July 17. Kennedy and his wife were en route to the Kennedy family compound in Hyannis Port for the wedding of Rory Kennedy, John's cousin and the youngest daughter of Robert and Ethel Kennedy. When the plane failed to arrive at the Martha's Vineyard Airport as scheduled, a friend of the Kennedy family contacted the FAA, which began a preliminary search for the aircraft. Once the FAA failed to locate the Kennedy plane, a search and rescue (SAR) effort was launched by the Air Force (USAF) and the Coast Guard (USCG).

Rear Admiral Richard M. Larrabee was assigned to coordinate the SAR effort between the Department of Transportation, FAA, USCG, USAF, and other federal agencies. Once it became evident that there would be no survivors, Chairman Jim Hall and Robert Pearce of the National Transportation Safety Board were called in to head the accident investigation, which is ongoing. On Wednesday, July 21, the remote operated vehicle operated from the USS Grasp located a large portion of the fuselage of the Kennedy aircraft and Navy divers recovered the bodies of the three victims. The location was pinpointed by a coordinated effort and reflected extensive work by scientists at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration at the Commerce Department.

In accordance with a request by Senator Ted Kennedy and the Freeman and Bessette families, the U.S. Navy performed a burial at sea of all three victims this morning from the USS Briscoe. At the same time, an appropriate solemn observance was conducted aboard the aircraft carrier USS John F. Kennedy. The Navy performs burials-at-sea for military personnel, dependents and noteworthy citizens approximately 500 times each year.

The memorial service for John F. Kennedy, Jr. and Carolyn Bessette Kennedy is being held at the St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Manhattan where Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis attended services until she passed away in 1994.

The Freeman and Bessette families will also hold a memorial service at the Greenwich Christ Church on Saturday, July 24.
