Chinese to earn from L.R. LIST

Expatriate entrepreneur invites delegation

The People's Republic of China is sending seven national and 14 state-level economic development ministers to Los Angeles, Washington, New York — and Little Rock.

The group's host, Daihatsu International Trading Inc., has confirmed the group's planned arrival in Little Rock on July 31 for a two-week stay. The visitors are honoring an invitation to Arkansas by Little Rock resident Yah Lin "Charlie" Trie,

Daihatsu's founder.

The group wants to see how a large, industrialized nation "manages its fiscal and monetary policy. They want to take a look at the county and local levels, not just on the national level," said Jody Webb, a spokesman for Daihatsu, based in Little Rock.

Tentative meetings are planned with city, county and state finance directors and visits to the Arkansas Industrial Development Commission and other agencies, Webb said.

Delegation leader is Cui Yuliang, director general of the People's Republic's Department of Fiscal and Monetary Policy's State Economic and Trade Commission. Also attending are Tian Ruixin, assistant director of the national Bureau of Foreign Exports, and economic development representatives from 12 of China's 28 provinces.

"They could have gone anywhere in the U.S. They chose here because there is a lot of interest in Arkansas because of

President Clinton, and because Mr. Trie extended an invitation here," Webb said.

Trie, former owner of Fu Lin's restaurant in west Little Rock, spends three out of every four weeks in China since opening a Daihatsu office there in late 1992, Webb said.

Daihatsu led a joint venture of Chinese businessmen that bid for the Camelot Hotel in downtown Little Rock. Trie's partners in that offer were Ng Lap Seng, a casino resort investor in Macao on the Chinese coast, and Mana Han Xiao, a Beijing restaurant owner.

Daihatsu International Trading was set up to find import-export and investment opportunities for businessmen in both countries, Webb said.

Trie's letter of congratulations and best wishes from the president of the United States hasn't hurt in prestige-conscious China, Webb said.

President-elect Clinton sent a letter dated Nov. 10, 1992, to Trie, addressing the Little Rock restaurateur as "Dear Charlie." The letter read, in part, "I am pleased to hear that you are establishing a branch of your company, Daihatsu International, in the People's Republic of China. ... I wish you success in your new venture, and I appreciate your efforts for our state. Please let me know about your progress."

That letter filled for Trie one

of the two prerequisites for doing business in China — standing, or distinction, some proof that when someone is dealing with Trie, he is dealing with a person of significance, Webb explained. In Chinese culture, he said, one's status matters more than how much money one makes. The original letter now hangs framed in Daihatsu's headquarters in the Lafayette building beside pictures of Trie with Clinton in the Oval Office at the White House.

The second requirement for doing business in China is family connections, which Trie re-established after his immediate family fled the People's Republic in 1970.

A relative of Trie's is a Chinese government official in Chanchung, China, Webb said. After Trie opened Daihatsu, Chanchung and Little Rock became "sister cities" in an economic, cultural and social exchange program designed to help set up business contacts and friendly relations between citizens of different countries.

Daihatsu paid in part for Mayor Jim Dailey's visit to China last year, a trip that included Chanchung, city records show. Chanchung Mayor Mi Feng Jun visited Little Rock in early June. Gov. Jim Guy Tucker conducted the signing of the sister city agreement on June 3 at the Governor's Mansion.

Chanchung is capital city of a province of north China that borders North Korea, along the Yalu River, in the region of China known as Manchuria.
