DARLENE HOOLEY FOR CONGRESS RECEPTION

Race Summary:

Congresswoman Hooley is running for her third term in Oregon's 5th U.S. house district. Hooley's general election opponent is Salem aviation charter owner Brian Boquist (R) (there are no third party candidates). If Hooley wins she will be the only person to hold this seat for three terms. The outlook is likely Democratic.

Campaign finances. As of June 30, FEC reports showed that Representative Hooley had raised nearly \$600,000 and had \$450,000 cash on hand, while Boquist had raised just \$75,000 and had only \$7,500 cash on hand. Boquist's shortfall can be attributed to his late entry into the race (mid-March), but based on what he has spent on TV and other material, however, it is assumed that his fundraising picked up over the summer.

GOTV and Media activities. Hooley is running a strong GOTV effort in conjunction with the Oregon Coordinated Campaign. Hooley ads will go up on TV on October 18 and will only run 1700 points.

Boquist is running a negative campaign with an eight-page "newspaper" that lambastes Hooley as "slave to special interest cash" and "Hooley funds abortion machine". He has also run some TV ads early, but has been down for three weeks.

Key issues. The key issues in this race are education and tax cuts. Education rates as the priority in Oregon. Boquist is advocating for a limited federal government role in education, and wants to limit it to 5% of the federal education budget and give the money away in block grants. In terms of tax cuts, Hooley supports estate tax relief (there are a lot of farms and small business in the district). She voted for the Republican repeal and for the veto override. While she does not support full repeal she does want relief for family farms and small business in her district.

5th U.S. House District. The 5th CD is a swing district. The Democratic performance of the district is 51.5%. There are more Republicans than Democrats, and 22% non-affiliated voters in this district. In '96, Clinton/Gore won the district with 48.5%, Dole/Kemp with 42.3%, and Perot 9%.
