Pursuant to your request, I hereby submit my resignation as United States Attorney for the Northern District of West Virginia. It is my understanding that the resignation will become effective upon the appointment of an interim successor. Although I have not been advised of any official date, it is my understanding that such an appointment will be made in a relatively short time span. For the following professional and personal reasons, I would respectfully request that such an appointment be delayed for a reasonable time.

On a professional basis, my office is in the midst of resolving several major gambling and public corruption cases either through plea negotiations or trials. These cases were developed through lengthy investigations conducted over the last three and one-half years and several of them are closely related. My personal participation in the investigations familiarized me with the issues and facts of these cases, as well as potential problem areas in which important decisions may need to be made.

Throughout my twelve years as the United States Attorney, I have always been personally involved on a day-to-day basis in the investigation and prosecutions of major cases, especially those involving sensitive issues. My personal involvement is due partially to a small staff which necessitates a more active role in legal matters by the United States Attorney, but mostly to a personal desire to be active in the courtroom. The personal involvement provides the necessary leadership and example to the Assistant United States Attorneys who work with me on these cases. Furthermore, the more familiar I am with the issues and facts of a case, the better prepared I am to make crucial decisions and/or actually try the case.

One of the above-mentioned cases, a major political corruption case, commenced on Tuesday, March 30, 1993. The case involves obstruction of justice and extortion charges against a former County Sheriff and should last approximately two weeks. Although I will not be in the courtroom, my availability to address and resolve certain crucial and sensitive issues could be pivotal. In addition, this case is one in a series of cases involving corruption and gambling activity in the Northern Panhandle area in the Northern District of West Virginia.

One of the major targets in a related case has signed a plea agreement which includes the requirement to testify against the Sheriff. Because of the pending testimony against the Sheriff, the possibility exists that certain provisions of the plea agreement will be renegotiated. Any renegotiations should involve my personal participation since I was intimately involved in the original negotiations leading to the original agreement in that case. It is also significant that the recommended candidate for the United States Attorney position in this district previously represented the individual mentioned in the plea agreement, although at the present time this individual has acquired new counsel and the recommended candidate no longer represents him. Yet another related gambling case involving nine defendants is scheduled for trial on April 26, 1993.

Finally, an unrelated public corruption case involving a former County Assessor who faces multiple charges stemming from various alleged abuses of his office remains to be tried. I had intended to personally try the case. However, no trial date has been set, although the Indictment was returned in May 1992.

In addition to the cases mentioned above, our office is currently in the midst of a major investigation concerning the theft of coal from Peabody Coal Company, the largest coal producing company in the world. Although presently in the investigative stages, several of the major perpetrators in this case have entered plea agreements with this office. As negotiations continue with other potential defendants, it is anticipated that this case will be resolved either through plea negotiations or Indictment within sixty days. The significance of this investigation is the recommended candidate for United States Attorney represents one of the potential major defendants in the case who has not yet entered into an agreement. In my view, this creates a very serious dilemma. If I were to leave office before the new United States Attorney is installed, any prosecution decision would have to be made by the interim United States Attorney who, in all probability, would be someone who is currently in the office and who will remain after the new United States Attorney takes office. This individual would be placed in a position of approving an Indictment of a client of his/her new boss. A decision to decline prosecution would leave everyone open to the possible criticism that favorable treatment was given to this individual because he was represented by the new United States Attorney. Such a dilemma is removed if the decision is made by me since I have nothing to gain or lose regardless of what decision is made. Since I have been intimately involved in this investigation on a long-term basis, I hope to resolve it before a conflict situation could arise with the apparent incoming United States Attorney.

On a personal note, I have contributed approximately twenty-four years of my career to the United States of America having spent the first four years in the military, and the remaining twenty or so years with the United States Attorney's Office. On February 12, 1993, I turned forty-nine years of age. Thus, in approximately ten months at the age of fifty I would have been eligible to collect a substantial annuity under the Civil Service Retirement System contributions. However, directives dictate and futures unfold.

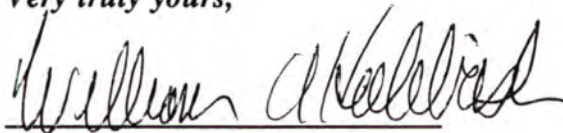

The collection of the annuity is available only to Presidentially appointed United States Attorneys who meet the age and/or service requirements and who are involuntarily separated. I will meet the age requirement in ten months. Yet despite my twenty-four years of service, my immediate future means leaving an office ten months short of collecting a well-earned retirement. I challenge not the System to which I have dedicated years of service, rather I respectfully urge your consideration of this personal matter when arriving at your decision concerning my replacement.

Additionally, I was recently advised that my wife has a relatively serious health problem. Diagnosed as having a herniated disk in her neck, I was advised that surgery is the cure. Unfortunately, the treating physician was unable to schedule an appointment with the neurosurgeon until July 26, 1993. Should I leave office, my health insurance would expire within thirty-one days. As such, we are trying to expedite an appointment because the only health insurance coverage that my family has is the health coverage provided by my position as United States Attorney. I regret that I cannot give you a specified time period as to how soon my wife's medical problem can be treated. Hopefully, it can be treated within thirty to sixty days. I sincerely hope that you will give due consideration to my wife's health problem so that my health insurance can cover the costs.

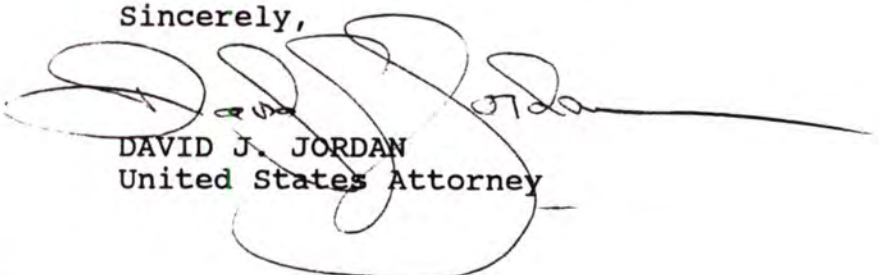

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with your request, I hereby submit my resignation from the Office of United States Attorney for the District of Wyoming but ask that my resignation not become effective until the appointment of an Interim United States Attorney.

I ask that the Interim not be appointed for at least three or four months for the following reasons:

1. I am currently involved in an ongoing investigation involving a major defense contractor (Boeing Aerospace, Inc.) who we believe failed to live up to its quality assurance obligations to the United States Air Force with respect to the installation of our nation's MX missile force near Cheyenne. In addition, we believe that Boeing allowed substandard materials to be used in the construction of MX silos and that they lied, repeatedly, to the United States Air Force about it. The investigation in this complex multi-million dollar fraud case is already two years old and is approaching a critical point. It will take time to bring someone else up to speed on this case.

2. I am involved in a multi-million dollar telemarketing and mail fraud case (World Fidelity Bank) involving hundreds of victims nationwide. The defendants, who have already been indicted who and have connections to ultra right wing religious groups, have used their religious connections to defraud investors of approximately \$5.2 million. I would like to see this one through.

Finally, unlike United States Attorneys in very large districts, I am a true "hands on" United States Attorney. I am presently intensively supervising at least 50 significant criminal cases, and a number of civil ones. It will take a few months to

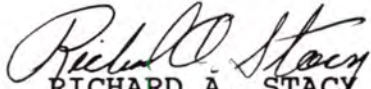

get "pulled out" of these cases and make sure that everything is on track.

It is with great reluctance and a heavy heart that I submit my resignation. The United States Department of Justice has been my home for 15 years. With 12 years as United States Attorney, I believe that I am the second longest serving United States Attorney in America. If you will check, with Governor Mike Sullivan, one of your earliest supporters in the West, you will find that I have been extremely effective and absolutely non-political. It would be a great pleasure for me to continue to serve you and Attorney General Reno for as long as you will permit me to do so.

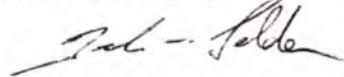
Please note that I am interested in serving until my successor has been confirmed by the United States Senate. I believe this to be in the best interest of this office. Nevertheless, I will abide by your determination of when this resignation will become effective and will work toward an orderly transition. I would appreciate three weeks advance notice of the effective date of my resignation, which I believe to be the minimum amount of time necessary to ensure a responsible and orderly transition. Consequently, I consider that my resignation is not effective prior to April 16, and indeed, absent advice to the contrary, not until my successor is named. There are numerous important matters and initiatives pending which have received my personal attention and which I believe would benefit from my continued presence in this position.

The opportunity to serve my country as United States Attorney for the Northern District of Alabama has been the greatest honor and privilege ever bestowed upon me. I took office one year ago this month and immediately sought to address the legal issues which I believed to be the most critical facing our nation: drugs and violent crime; enforcement of civil rights; the fight against government fraud, both by criminal prosecution and affirmative civil enforcement, and the continued improvement of state, local and federal law enforcement coordination. While my tenure has been brief, I believe that I have had a positive impact on law enforcement in this district.

Pursuant to your request, I hereby submit my resignation as United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Kentucky. Because of extremely sensitive pending matters in my district, I hereby request that you delay acceptance of my resignation until my successor has been appointed.

For the past eighteen months, the United States Attorney for the Western District of Kentucky and I have been directing a joint investigation of corruption in Kentucky state government. As a result of our investigation, nine legislators and lobbyists have pled guilty to public corruption charges. On March 22, 1993, a former high ranking state official, who is the nephew of a former governor, was convicted of conspiracy to commit extortion. Presently, we are preparing for the April, 19, 1993 public corruption trial of Donald Blandford. Until recently, Mr. Blandford served as the Speaker of the House of Representatives for the Commonwealth of Kentucky. As you may know, our continuing investigation has drawn intense public interest and our record of success has instilled public confidence in the office of the United States Attorney. Therefore, a smooth and orderly transition will preserve both the integrity of our investigation and the public's confidence in the office of the United States Attorney.

I would be honored if you will allow me to remain in office until the new United States Attorney is appointed. I am interested not only in protecting the continuity and integrity of pending matters, but also in doing everything within my power to assist in a smooth, efficient and successful transition.

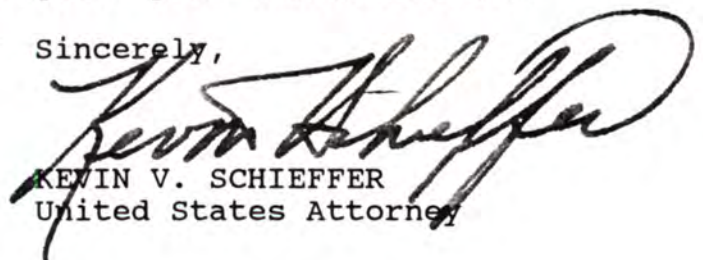

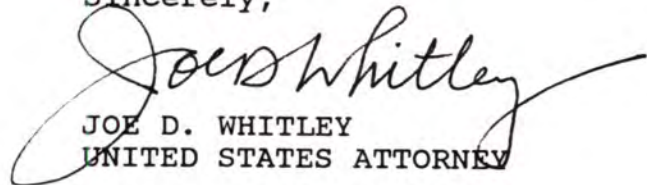

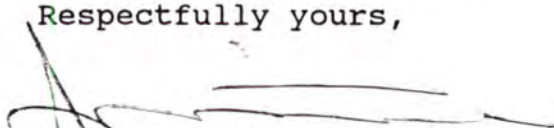
Pursuant to your request, communicated through the Attorney General, I hereby submit my letter of resignation effective on a date to be determined by you.

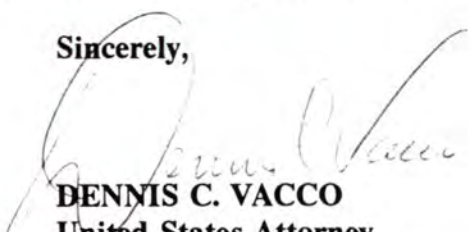

I am scheduled to personally present an indictment to the federal grand jury on April 8, 1993, dealing with one of the largest and most successful crack dealing youth gangs in Southeast Texas. The gang is known as the "5/9 Hoover Crips." These individuals are not abusers or users of crack cocaine but are entrepreneurs who are simply attempting to make as much money from the sale of drugs as possible. Most members of the gang have an extensive history of violent criminal offenses. Aggravated assaults upon peace officers, prior drug charges, attempted murder are among the charges against members of this gang. One 17-year-old ninth grader was charged with assault on his high school teacher.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation, along with the Jefferson County Narcotics Task Force, has just completed a long-term investigation and covert undercover operation under my personal supervision. Our office needs to move immediately to indict all individuals not only for the protection of our case but also for the welfare of our community. These individuals are known collectively to distribute a large quantity of crack cocaine in Southeast Texas. Many of the victims of these drug dealers are residents of federally funded housing projects and the youths that are in our parks and playgrounds. Several members of this gang are held in high regard and esteem by the youth that are contemplating joining gangs. It is important that these individuals be prosecuted quickly and swiftly so that the vulnerable individuals that are considering joining gangs will see firsthand that gang membership and drug dealing is a losing proposition.

Since December, 1992, our office has lost four criminal prosecutors -- Lou Guirola, lead OCEDFT attorney; Dan Smith; Sheryl Falk; and Pat Black -- and now we are extremely shorthanded. If I do not continue handling this case, it simply will not be prosecuted at this time. A long delay in the prosecution of a drug dealing gang is the wrong message to give to law enforcement and to the local community. In the 11 plus years that I have been the United States Attorney, I have always handled a large volume of cases and have often handled the largest in the office.

Another issue that complicates this investigation and prosecution is that we are also going to be asking for four to six juveniles to be transferred to adult status and be prosecuted along with the other gang members. I have extensive experience in the certification and prosecution of juveniles, for I have done it many times in the past.

This case will be presented to the grand jury on April 8, 1993, and all trials should be completed not later than mid to late August, 1993. I am respectfully requesting that my resignation not be accepted until after the completion of this prosecution.

Pursuant to your request, I hereby submit my resignation as United States Attorney for the Northern District of West Virginia. It is my understanding that the resignation will become effective upon the appointment of an interim successor. Although I have not been advised of any official date, it is my understanding that such an appointment will be made in a relatively short time span. For the following professional and personal reasons, I would respectfully request that such an appointment be delayed for a reasonable time.

On a professional basis, my office is in the midst of resolving several major gambling and public corruption cases either through plea negotiations or trials. These cases were developed through lengthy investigations conducted over the last three and one-half years and several of them are closely related. My personal participation in the investigations familiarized me with the issues and facts of these cases, as well as potential problem areas in which important decisions may need to be made.

Throughout my twelve years as the United States Attorney, I have always been personally involved on a day-to-day basis in the investigation and prosecutions of major cases, especially those involving sensitive issues. My personal involvement is due partially to a small staff which necessitates a more active role in legal matters by the United States Attorney, but mostly to a personal desire to be active in the courtroom. The personal involvement provides the necessary leadership and example to the Assistant United States Attorneys who work with me on these cases. Furthermore, the more familiar I am with the issues and facts of a case, the better prepared I am to make crucial decisions and/or actually try the case.

One of the above-mentioned cases, a major political corruption case, commenced on Tuesday, March 30, 1993. The case involves obstruction of justice and extortion charges against a former County Sheriff and should last approximately two weeks. Although I will not be in the courtroom, my availability to address and resolve certain crucial and sensitive issues could be pivotal. In addition, this case is one in a series of cases involving corruption and gambling activity in the Northern Panhandle area in the Northern District of West Virginia.

One of the major targets in a related case has signed a plea agreement which includes the requirement to testify against the Sheriff. Because of the pending testimony against the Sheriff, the possibility exists that certain provisions of the plea agreement will be renegotiated. Any renegotiations should involve my personal participation since I was intimately involved in the original negotiations leading to the original agreement in that case. It is also significant that the recommended candidate for the United States Attorney position in this district previously represented the individual mentioned in the plea agreement, although at the present time this individual has acquired new counsel and the recommended candidate no longer represents him. Yet another related gambling case involving nine defendants is scheduled for trial on April 20, 1993.

Finally, an unrelated public corruption case involving a former County Assessor who faces multiple charges stemming from various alleged abuses of his office remains to be tried. I had intended to personally try the case. However, no trial date has been set, although the Indictment was returned in May 1992.

In addition to the cases mentioned above, our office is currently in the midst of a major investigation concerning the theft of coal from Peabody Coal Company, the largest coal producing company in the world. Although presently in the investigative stages, several of the major perpetrators in this case have entered plea agreements with this office. As negotiations continue with other potential defendants, it is anticipated that this case will be resolved either through plea negotiations or Indictment within sixty days. The significance of this investigation is the recommended candidate for United States Attorney represents one of the potential major defendants in the case who has not yet entered into an agreement. In my view, this creates a very serious dilemma. If I were to leave office before the new United States Attorney is installed, any prosecution decision would have to be made by the interim United States Attorney who, in all probability, would be someone who is currently in the office and who will remain after the new United States Attorney takes office. This individual would be placed in a position of approving an Indictment of a client of his/her new boss. A decision to decline prosecution would leave everyone open to the possible criticism that favorable treatment was given to this individual because he was represented by the new United States Attorney. Such a dilemma is removed if the decision is made by me since I have nothing to gain or lose regardless of what decision is made. Since I have been intimately involved in this investigation on a long-term basis, I hope to resolve it before a conflict situation could arise with the apparent incoming United States Attorney.

On a personal note, I have contributed approximately twenty-four years of my career to the United States of America having spent the first four years in the military, and the remaining twenty or so years with the United States Attorney's Office. On February 12, 1993, I turned forty-nine years of age. Thus, in approximately ten months at the age of fifty I would have been eligible to collect a substantial annuity under the Civil Service Retirement System contributions. However, directives dictate and futures unfold.

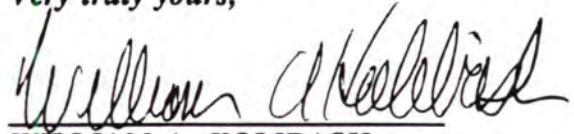

The collection of the annuity is available only to Presidentially appointed United States Attorneys who meet the age and/or service requirements and who are involuntarily separated. I will meet the age requirement in ten months. Yet despite my twenty-four years of service, my immediate future means leaving an office ten months short of collecting a well-earned retirement. I challenge not the System to which I have dedicated years of service, rather I respectfully urge your consideration of this personal matter when arriving at your decision concerning my replacement.

Additionally, I was recently advised that my wife has a relatively serious health problem. Diagnosed as having a herniated disk in her neck, I was advised that surgery is the cure. Unfortunately, the treating physician was unable to schedule an appointment with the neurosurgeon until July 26, 1993. Should I leave office, my health insurance would expire within thirty-one days. As such, we are trying to expedite an appointment because the only health insurance coverage that my family has is the health coverage provided by my position as United States Attorney. I regret that I cannot give you a specified time period as to how soon my wife's medical problem can be treated. Hopefully, it can be treated within thirty to sixty days. I sincerely hope that you will give due consideration to my wife's health problem so that my health insurance can cover the costs.

I received Attorney General Janet Reno's request from you that I immediately submit this letter. It has been a privilege to serve as the United States Attorney for the District of Alaska and address the complex, unique problems facing this great State and its citizens.

On November 10, within a week of your becoming President, I held a Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee (LECC) Resource Protection Subcommittee meeting which was attended by over 50 federal, state and local law enforcement leaders in Alaska. The conference addressed the unique issues facing Alaska and my introduction addressed (enclosed) "Alaska's Challenge for America's Domestic and International Success":

As our Nation addresses its citizens' responsibility to support our new President, Alaskans must stress the importance of our great State to our Country's resource development and domestic and international leadership....

The Native people of Alaska are proud and diverse with unique individual ethnic heritage backgrounds....

Alaska's strategic location between our close friend, Canada, and the emerging Russian States, requires a sensitivity...

Alaska is one-fifth the size of the Continental United States...

Alaska's resources are virtually untapped....

Alaska's resources may be developed in an ecologically-safe manner, while still preserving our wilderness and our resources for our children and future generations.

As the United States Attorney, I have provided leadership for federal, state and local prosecutors and law enforcement throughout Alaska over the past two and one-half years. Due to the State of Alaska's weak criminal laws, most particularly lack of a "conspiracy" statute, it is difficult for the State to address complex criminal matters which are a priority for me as the United States Attorney. In addition to leading the LECC, I am Chairman of the Alaska Bar Association's Criminal Prosecution Committee.

On August 3, 1992, I set forth Alaska's Law Enforcement Plan. (enclosed) That Plan's key priorities are:

Environmental Crime

Fraud and White Collar Crime

Illicit Drugs and Resulting Violent Crime

I state on page 11:

The United States Attorney will continue to provide leadership for federal, state and local law enforcement and press for changes in Alaska State Laws to adequately address Alaska's increasing criminal element.

The Plan specifically addresses the Assessment, Law Enforcement Priority, and LECC Goals for Alaska's attack on: drugs, violent crime, white collar crime, organized crime (gangs), smuggling and environmental crimes. The Plan also addresses my involvement as the United States Attorney in Project North Star, a Joint Canadian-United States Bi-National Law Enforcement Cooperative effort.

Also enclosed is my Project North Star Briefing Paper for Attorney General Janet Reno dated March 18, 1993. This Project North Star Briefing Paper sets forth my concern regarding the Project North Star's duplication of counter-narcotics intelligence and missions. I emphasize that our Nation's aggressive attack on drugs should look to Canada's Strategy which highlights and should be our theme:

It makes much more sense to nurture a child than to rehabilitate an adult.

As a Co-Chairman of Project North Star and member of the Executive Committee, as well as the Training Committee, I am more familiar with Project North Star than anyone in the Department of Justice. I will be happy to make myself available to Attorney General Janet Reno at any time to emphasize my concern over allocation and waste, as well as the "over-involvement" of military in our Nation's anti-drug efforts. It is vitally important that you and Attorney General Janet Reno draw a distinction between the military's support role in our drug enforcement effort and the combined efforts of federal, state and local law enforcement agencies in addressing our Nation's drug problem.

It is my understanding that the military's anti-drug efforts are funded in the amount of \$1.9 billion and combined funding for the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to attack our drug problem is less than 50% of the military's budget. I understand our military is searching for new roles. However, law enforcement is vastly different at federal, state and local levels, than the military. We must not allow the military to assume more than a "support role" to federal, state and local law enforcement.

I have one of the few federal "death penalty" cases against Raymond D. Cheely. Mr. Cheely and one of the other co-conspirators engineered and directed a "mail bomb killing" and "maiming" from inside two separate prisons in Alaska. Since I was the individual who requested permission from then Attorney General Bill Barr, to seek the "ultimate penalty," I feel very responsible for the successful conclusion of the case. To date, three co-conspirators have pled guilty and the litigation is proceeding against Mr. Cheely and a fifth co-conspirator.

Oral argument on the "death penalty" has not been set before the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. I had anticipated, personally, participating in the prosecution of Mr. Cheely since I am the individual responsible for the recommendation of the "penalty of death."

In addition, there are a number of other complex investigations and prosecutions proceeding for which I feel personally responsible in a leadership capacity.

Our Nation's citizens demanded a change and I certainly anticipate that you, as President, and Janet Reno as the Attorney General, will provide excellent leadership. However, I certainly will be

happy to assist you and Attorney General Janet Reno if you decide that it would be beneficial to the United States Attorney's Office in Alaska, the Department of Justice, and the citizens of the State of Alaska.

In concluding, I would like to state I was ashamed of the reception you received aboard the aircraft carrier approximately two weeks ago. As the Commander-in-Chief, you should not be subjected to such conduct regardless of perceptions of the past. At 23, when you were a Rhodes Scholar, I was flying combat missions off the U.S. Ranger in A-6 Intruders with targets primarily in the Hanoi-Haiphong area of North Vietnam. Despite apparently vastly different approaches to our responsibilities 25 years ago, I have the highest regard for you as President.

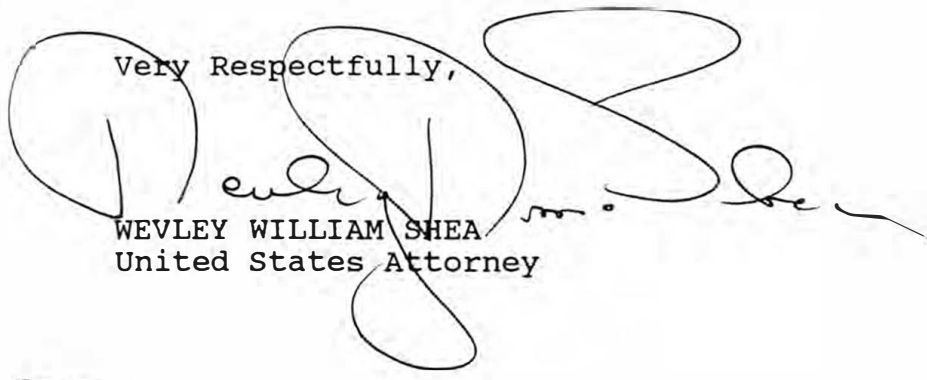
I will be happy to be of assistance to you and Attorney General Janet Reno to assure the smooth transition of leadership in the United States Attorney's Office in Alaska. Unfortunately, it is my opinion and the opinion of others in the law enforcement prosecution and judicial community that there is no one presently in this office who has the sufficient background, experience and leadership capacity to assume the responsibility as United States Attorney for the District of Alaska.

However, should a recommendation be needed for an Assistant U.S. Attorney to assume leadership of this office, I would recommend James E. Torgerson, Chief, Criminal Division.

Please accept this letter as my tender of resignation, effective as of whatever date you determine to be in the best interest of the Department of Justice. I have been honored by the opportunity to serve the Eastern District of Missouri in this important position and consider it the highlight of my legal career.

I do want to bring to your attention two factors, however, which might favor a short delay in the effective date of this resignation.

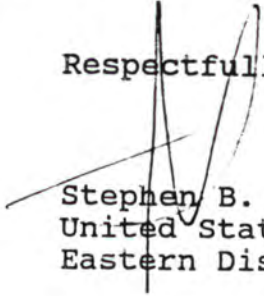
First, I have been integrally involved in the investigation of U.S. v. Kessler, et.al., a much-publicized and politically sensitive case involving widespread abuses in Missouri's Workers' Compensation system. The U.S. District Judge to whom the case is assigned has given it a firm and final trial setting of June 7, 1993. Given my role as lead counsel, my active and personal involvement in preparing for the trial of this complex and significant case and the fact that the Assistant U.S. Attorneys assisting me will be in another trial this May on a related matter, I believe that removing me from the case at this point, immediately prior to its trial, will have a substantially negative impact on this pending matter. I would, of course, be prepared to leave immediately upon the trial's expected close in late June.

Second, I have been asked by Congressman Richard Gephardt to serve on a citizens' commission to aid him in making recommendations to you regarding the appointment of a new United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Missouri. This process is expected to begin formally this Friday, and I have been told that it should take several months to complete. I believe that here, too, a short delay in an immediate departure from this position will facilitate the selection process and the transition to new leadership.

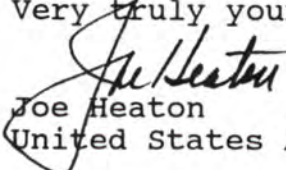
