I really appreciate you taking the time to get this done for me. It was good to hear your voice earlier, even better to know that you're doing well in the face of everything. Since we talked, Kelly told me about your dinner at our new neighborhood restaurant, the Greenwood; Molly and I have been meaning to try it and now that we've got the thumbs up, we will.

I've attached the congratulatory letter for David McCall, who turns 70 on May 7. Mr. McCall, whom I met working for Mike Dukakis (you remember him?) was my boss when I worked in political consulting in New York. He's a major league Democrat with a heart of gold and a passion for efforts to clear the landmines that are strewn around the world, particularly in Cambodia. He has purposefully put his energies and money to work on clearing existing mines while the vast majority of people and organizations have been working to ban them. Thus the reference to the Demining 2010 project. [For the record, the President could do much worse than to appoint David to the advisory committee for that project.] I don't think the NSC will have a problem with what I wrote, although you never know.

Thanks again for your help. It means a lot to me to be able to get this and I know how much it will mean to David.
