Dear Mr. Engskov:

The purpose of my letter is to share with you information about an exhibit I am working on. As you know, the President's aircraft is the finest in the world, known as Air Force One. Every Air Force One aircraft since the one used by President John F. Kennedy has been manufactured and assembled in Kansas. I am trying to coordinate a display on Air Force One and its history for an aviation museum here in Kansas. The display will contain photographs, personal stories by Air Force One crew members, items given by Presidents to guests aboard Air Force One, and other items. The most important part of this display is individual notes by the remaining living Presidents (excluding President Reagan), written on individual sheets of Air Force One memo pad, provided to us by the Presidential Pilot's Office. SUBJECT: NATO 50th Anniversary Summit Site

Purpose

To obtain your approval of the primary venue for the 1999 NATO Summit working meetings.

Background

Planning for the 1999 NATO Summit is well advanced. The Interagency Summit Planning staff, housed at the State Department, has launched intensive efforts with all relevant agencies and municipal authorities, and is working in close consultation with the White House. Before further work can proceed, however, we require your approval of our proposed primary venue, the Mellon Auditorium, to be used for plenaries on both days of the Summit, April 24 and 25.

Mellon Auditorium was the site of the signing of the North Atlantic Treaty in 1949. It offers a beautiful, ornate space large enough for the meetings, both among allies and the 44 members of the Euro-Atlantic Partnership Council, and it is conveniently located downtown in the Federal Triangle. The buildings that make up the Federal Triangle also offer space for other requirements, including press, international delegation offices, and working lunches, all within walking distance.

RECOMMENDATION

That you approve Mellon Auditorium as the primary summit venue.

I am attaching the invitation and confirmed VIP list for your review and to perhaps see if the event is being considered for attendance or a stop by.

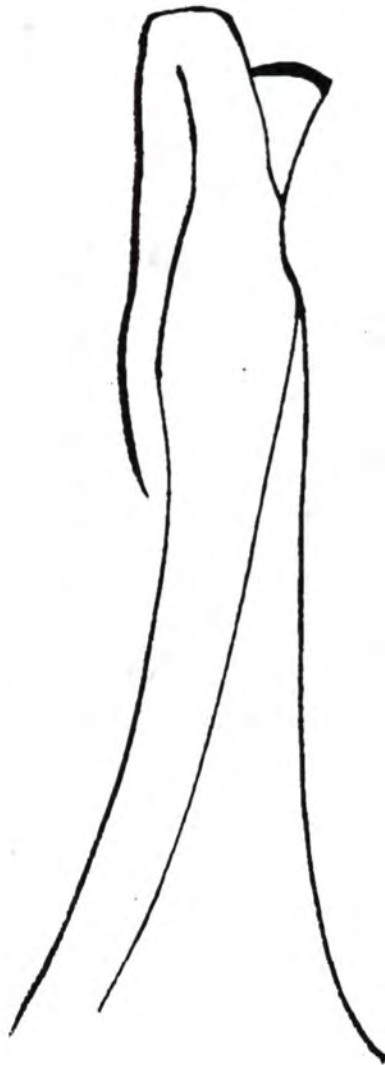
We have sent books "Dressing Diana" to both Mrs. Clinton and Mrs. Gore as of two weeks ago in addition to invitations many months ago.

Reply to a Letter from Ernie Green

Purpose

To reply to a letter from Ernie Green.

Background

Ernie Green wrote to you about his concerns that commitments made on your trip to Africa are not being fulfilled. He specifically mentioned that there is a perception that there has not been a vigorous effort to increase assistance levels, or even to defend current levels against proposed cuts. (The House and Senate budget resolutions and appropriation allocations to the Foreign Operations appropriations subcommittees would require significant reductions (possibly up to \$1 billion) to your FY99 request for foreign assistance and related programs. This cut could jeopardize many of the initiatives you announced in Africa and other priority assistance programs worldwide).

Your response reassures Ernie of your commitment to increased aid for, and more trade with, Africa.

RECOMMENDATION

That you sign the attached letter to Ernie Green.

Dear Ernie:

Thank you for your thoughtful letter. I want to reassure you that I am committed to maintaining the momentum and energy created by my trip to Africa, and to fulfill the promises we made. As you know, I have already begun to work for increased assistance for Africa. Specifically, I requested an additional \$70 million in assistance and a further \$30 million for debt relief for Africa in FY99. My Administration has been working with Congress in the context of funding for bilateral and multilateral debt relief and our overall foreign assistance budget to ensure that these increases are maintained.

There are, of course, those in Congress who believe that foreign policy and assistance should not be priorities for the United States. As we have done in the past, my Administration will fight such thinking. We will continue to work to ensure that we have the resources needed to maintain our leadership, and to build partnerships for a safer, more peaceful and more prosperous world.

I appreciate your continued support and very much value your views. As you know, we will face many challenges as we work to ensure that Africa receives the assistance and the trade it needs. I am glad we can count on you to help us overcome those difficulties.

Dear President Clinton,

I am writing you again regarding your trip to Africa. It was rich in symbolism and substance. You defined a new framework and a new philosophy. And, you promised new relationships and more resources to assist Africa's political, social, and economic development. Unfortunately, there are forces at work, I believe, that are quickly deflating the euphoria and dimming the hope that you created, Mr. President, and this is a source of great concern to me.

Last week, I met with the Chairman of the House Appropriations/Foreign Operations Subcommittee. Despite our large budget surplus, Mr. Callahan expects to cut foreign assistance appropriations next year. Not only does he doubt there will be funding available to meet the promises you made during the trip to increase overall funding to Africa, he even thought the small \$14 million FY 1999 request for the African Development Foundation would be reduced! Unfortunately, since the trip, there does not seem to have been sufficient follow-up consultations with the Congress or strong advocacy for your new initiatives by concerned agencies, nor do I see any plans underway for funding assistance to Africa at the higher level you announced.

It is critical, Mr. President, that we maintain the optimism and momentum of your historic trip. We need to reassure people, as you assured Mr. Mandela, that we will not sacrifice aid for trade. We need a clear commitment of additional financial resources and a strong commitment of political will to advocate for your new initiatives and increased funding. I am concerned that we ensure your credibility, here and abroad. After years of neglecting Africa, we finally got it right -- we know we have clear national interests and national values that require us to be engaged with this magnificent continent and her wonderful people. We must not lose this opportunity to take concrete actions and *do* what is right.

As always, Mr. President, you can count on my assistance and support in advancing your goals.
