Dear Mr. President:

Congratulations on your recent trip to China. We in Cleveland closely followed the news of that historic trip, and share the pride you must feel in the diplomatic accomplishments.

Cleveland Browns Hall of Famer Jim Brown and I would be honored if you would participate in our music video titled "Here We Go Again," which will be released on August 21, 1998.

That date celebrates 365 days until we kick off in the new Cleveland Stadium as the Browns return to the NFL following their 1995 relocation to Baltimore.

Browns profits from sale of the video, cassette, and CD go directly to Jim Brown's Amer-I-Can foundation, which teaches at-risk kids lifestyle management. We have been supporting Amer-I-Can with a percentage of our sponsorship sales for two years. The program is also supported by the states of Ohio and New Jersey, among others.

Following are some key points about the music video:

1. Performing talent includes Lou Rawls, the Dramatics, Freda Payne, Bobby Womack, Clarence Clemons (the outstanding saxophonist from the Bruce Springsteen band), and Browns alumni such as Jim Brown, Lou Groza, and Bernie Kosar. There are no performers known for distasteful lyrics.
2. I am enclosing a copy of the lyrics, which celebrates the history of the Browns.
3. I am enclosing a cassette of what is virtually our final mix, so you will understand the flavor.
4. We will premiere the video on August 21, 1998 at noon at Tower City in Cleveland, where we will stage a one-year Countdown Rally.

5. Cleveland's Michael Stanley Band will perform the video live that same night at Gund Arena. There, we will hold a Browns Countdown Reunion. All living Browns Hall of Famers will attend, and we will have Browns highlights performed to themed music from The Cleveland Pops Orchestra.
6. The rally at Tower City, the Reunion at Gund Arena, and the NFL Experience theme park in Cleveland (on August 21 and 22) are all free to the public.
7. We will make history of sorts that night, as the festivities will be shown live on our web site, www.clevelandbrowns.com.

Mr. President, we envision your participation could occur in one of several ways, each of which would be with great dignity. Examples includes:

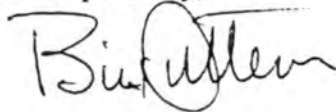
1. In business, or casual, attire you could be filmed saying, in lip-syncs to the music: "Here we go again," which is the chorus line.
2. In casual attire, you could be filmed "air-saxing" on the break to Clarence Clemons' performance.

If protocol does not permit participation in the music or video, even for a not-for-profit foundation, we certainly understand. Perhaps, in that case, we could film a greeting from you to millions of Browns fans. That greeting could be played at both Tower City, and Gund Arena, and possibly even could be included at the beginning of the music video tape.

Jim and I hope you can find a way to participate that is both fun for you as a musician, but comfortable for you as President.

Balaam's Donkey

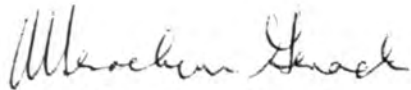
The Midrash comments that God gave speech only to man and not to any of the animals, for had animals been able to speak, no human would survive. The ubiquitous animal, if verbal, would destroy any semblance of privacy. The only animal granted the gift of speech was the donkey of the Prophet Balaam, who revealed Balaam's obtuseness and sins. (Numbers 22: 28-33). Were animals able to speak, they would unmask our foibles, our pettiness, our inevitable failings. Man was created imperfect. Concomitant with his grandeur and majesty is a seamy, ugly side. God, recognizing man's bifurcated nature, protected him and made the beasts mute. Even a great prophet, exposed to total scrutiny would be diminished and ultimately destroyed.

In the Fountainhead, Ayn Rand observed, "Civilization is the process toward a society of privacy. The savage's whole existence is public, ruled by the laws of the tribe. Civilization is the process of setting men free from men."

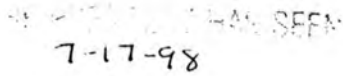
Justice Louis Brandeis, dissenting in *Olmstead v. United States*, declared the right of privacy as the most fundamental right of civilization. "The makers of our constitution undertook to secure conditions favorable to the pursuit of happiness. They sought to protect Americans in their beliefs, their thoughts, their emotions and their sensations. They conferred as against the government, the right to be left alone - the most comprehensive of rights and the right most valued by civilized man."

The Midrash's point, goes even beyond that of Ayn Rand and Justice Brandeis, who saw the rights of privacy as inherent to civilization. The Midrash saw these rights of privacy not only as a constitutional endowment or social right, but as an existential need related to the nature of man; built into creation, even predating the development of civilization.

The Talmud points out that man was created alone, for the universe was created for the individual. The Biblical story of the creation of Adam affirms the Jeffersonian notion that the individual is preeminent and superior to the rights of society. The right of privacy flows from creation of man alone.

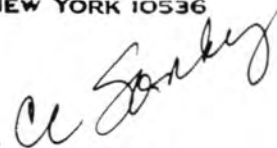

Instead, the United States is joining some of the most retrograde States (in human rights terms) by calling for a regime based on a general expression of consent of the State of nationality and of the State on whose territory the crime is committed. A court operating under such restrictions would never be able to prosecute Saddam Hussein for poison gas attacks against the Kurds, for example, because the State of Iraq would never consent to Court jurisdiction over offenses in which Hussein might be implicated.

The net effect of the United States position would be to allow States to ratify the Court's statute, and at the same time insulate their nationals from any prosecution but the rare charge of genocide. The compromise proposal offered by the government of Korea, that would allow a prosecution on the basis of the consent of only one interested State (including the State of custody), would ensure that at least some of these heinous offenses are punished. Even this compromise falls far short of the ideal.

The United States also continues to oppose vesting in the prosecutor any independent investigative authority, despite being opposed in this position, as in the one described above, by a solid majority of States that have expressed a view on the issue.

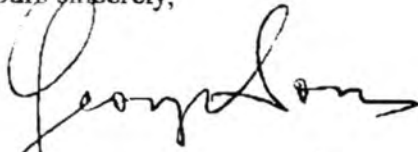

The United States has a legitimate national interest in insuring that its military is not unjustly subject to a politicized court. However, this interest is amply protected by the several stringent requirements of complementarity in the Court's statute, which the United States has played a key role in constructing.

It is especially disturbing that the head of the United States delegation promised to "actively oppose" the creation of the Court should the majority of nations that support effective powers for this historic tribunal not accede to American demands to weaken its jurisdiction and powers. In the course of your Administration, it appears that United States policy has gone from active support for the notion of international justice for serious violations of humanitarian law (in the case of Rwanda and the former Yugoslavia) to active obstruction of this goal.

If the United States cannot be a leader in this effort, it should get out of the way. You should instruct the United States delegation to allow the clear majority of States who demand more than cosmetic justice to produce a meaningful institution.

One of their children and eight of their grandchildren are U.S. citizens (I think they all live in California), and ten more of his family members - children and grandchildren - are U.S. permanent residents. Most or all of them live in California as well.

I came to know the Jhunjhnuwala family when I served as Ambassador to Singapore during the period 1994-1997.

I will fly to California to be at their fiftieth wedding anniversary celebration on July 17. If it were at all possible to generate the letter and get it to me in Washington on or before July 15, I would handcarry it and read it publicly at the celebratory dinner. Mr. Jhunjhnuwala, a selfmade multimillionaire, is very pro-American. His early background was in Myanmar (Burma), where he was jailed for his opposition to a totalitarian regime and eventually banished. He came to rest in Singapore, and built a successful hotel and manufacturing conglomerate that includes operations in Singapore, Hong Kong and New Zealand.

To the best of my knowledge, the Jhunjhnuwala family has not been involved, implicated or mentioned in connection with any of the investigated campaign financing activities.
