SUBJECT: Simple Senate Resolutions Received

We have today received the attached simple Senate Resolution, S.Res. 237, concerning the political and economic situation in Indonesia (copy attached).

We will retain the original resolution and suggest that a copy be sent to the NSC.

In the Senate of the United States

July 10, 1998

Whereas recent political turmoil and economic failure in Indonesia have endangered the people of that country and fomented instability in the region;

Whereas President Suharto has properly responded to this crisis by resigning, after 32 years in office, the presidency of Indonesia in accordance with Indonesia's constitutional processes;

Whereas Indonesia is now embarking on a new era that is ripe for political and economic reform;

Whereas in 1975 Indonesia invaded, and since that time has illegally occupied, East Timor claiming the lives of approximately 200,000 East Timorese;

Whereas Indonesia has systematically committed human rights abuses against the people of East Timor through arbitrary arrests, torture, disappearances, extra-judicial executions, and general political repression;

Whereas 8 United Nations General Assembly and 2 United Nations Security Council resolutions have reaffirmed the right of the people of East Timor to self-determination;

Whereas Bishop Carlos Filipe Ximenes Belo and Jose Ramos Horta, who were awarded the 1996 Nobel Peace Prize for their courageous contribution to the East Timorese struggle, have called for a United Nations-sponsored referendum on self-determination of the East Timorese;

Whereas President Clinton in a letter dated December 27, 1996, expressed interest in the idea of a United Nations-sponsored referendum on self-determination in East Timor;

Whereas the United States cosponsored a 1997 United Nations Human Rights Commission Resolution calling for Indonesia to comply with the directives of existing United Nations resolutions regarding East Timor; and

Whereas present circumstances provide a unique opportunity for a resolution of the East Timor question: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That it is the sense of the Senate that the President should—

(1) encourage the new political leadership in Indonesia to institute genuine democratic and economic reforms, including the establishment of an independent judiciary, civilian control of the military, and the release of political prisoners;

(2) encourage the new political leadership in Indonesia to promote and protect the human rights and fundamental freedoms of all the people of Indonesia and East Timor; and

(3) work actively, through the United Nations and with United States allies, to carry out the directives of existing United Nations resolutions on East Timor and to support an internationally supervised referendum on self-determination.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Senate shall transmit a copy of this resolution to the President.

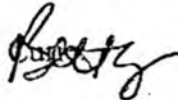

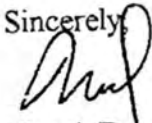

Since I know you probably will be reviewing the latest draft of the International Criminal Court statute this weekend, I wanted to share with you my thoughts on the major remaining issues.

As I stressed in my earlier letters, I continue to feel that U.S. leadership is vital for any meaningful international criminal court to be established. That leadership has helped the Rome debates to make some useful progress. But some of the positions expressed by the U.S. delegation on July 9 may endanger both the effectiveness of the court and the role of our nation as a leader in the protection of basic human rights.

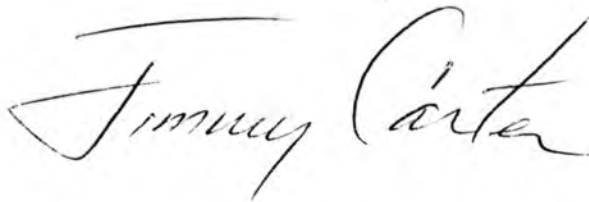
Let me outline briefly the key remaining issues concerning jurisdiction and the definition of crimes to be covered.

Our nation's current position is that the ICC could have jurisdiction over genocide, but not war crimes and crimes against humanity. Our insistence is that accused perpetrators of these two crimes could not be prosecuted unless their country is a signatory of the treaty or grants consent to a trial. This means that if Saddam Hussein refuses to become a party to the treaty, then he must approve the prosecutor's action before any Iraqi citizen could be prosecuted. A similar exclusion would permit Khadafi to protect the Libyans now accused of the Lockerbie tragedy.

We don't want individual American citizens to be prosecuted by the ICC for crimes such as that at Mi Lai, but protection can be obtained by definition of war crimes and crimes against humanity to include their being part of "a plan or policy or as part of a large scale commission of such crimes." As you know, a meeting is scheduled this fall for crimes to be fully defined.

The deliberations will continue Monday after delegates receive further instruction, and will conclude on July 17th. My hope is that our country will help to achieve a positive and effective result, with an adequately strong and independent prosecutor, built-in protection for suspects from responsible nations, but with maximum deterrence and likely punishment for perpetrators of the most grievous crimes.
