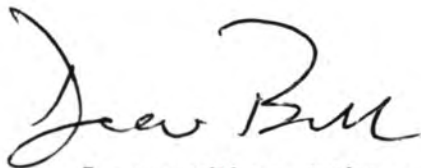

I am writing at the suggestion of Dr Jean Houston who has been visiting New Zealand. Jean mentioned that my name had come up in a recent conversation with you and when I mentioned to her that I had been thinking for some time of trying to make contact, she suggested I write direct.

I am inspired to write for several reasons; first, to renew an old, if fleeting acquaintance from those marvelously carefree days at Oxford. Secondly, I have admired the way that you and Al Gore have spelled out the essential agenda for a world community for the 21st century and feel that you should know that there is enormous support for that in this part of the world. Thirdly, I want to make a proposal designed to generate positive publicity for you in this region. I am currently a writer and media commentator here in New Zealand, having earlier had a career in diplomacy and politics, and I would like to prepare an in-depth profile of you and your presidency for the media in this part of the world prior to your visit to New Zealand next year for the APEC summit.

My objective would be to focus on the broader foreign, economic and environmental policy initiatives you have taken and on the many impressive ways that you have reached out to people all over the world. A key objective would be to enable you to outline your global

view and your personal vision for the 21st century. A profile of this kind would, I believe, help to set a very positive tone in the run-up to the conference.

I plan to visit Washington at some point in the first half of next year and would be delighted to have an opportunity to meet you and discuss the content of the profile. Ideally, I would like to do an interview on camera for Television New Zealand along with a more in-depth profile for the print media. The interview could be as formal or informal as you wish. Being a New Zealander I prefer informality but that would be a matter for you to decide.

I would welcome an indication as to whether you will agree to this and when it might best be scheduled, bearing in mind your many commitments.

She will be speaking at our California kick-off in Half Moon Bay, California that is sponsored by NASE and the California Center for Self-Esteem.

We are delighted to learn that a national conference is being held in October to look at school safety and the violence that is occurring as children perpetrate violence against one another. We wrote to the White House Office earlier to offer the services of the National Association for Self-Esteem in this important endeavor, and I am enclosing a copy of that letter. We believe we have important research to share and services to offer to help our children build a peaceful bridge to the Twenty First Century.

Mr. Robert Reasoner, President of the International Council for Self-Esteem, has researched the connection between violence and self-esteem and would like the opportunity to share his information at the conference. Mr. Tom Myers, president of the National Association for Self-Esteem, has developed the *Imagine Program*, on alternatives to violence that has been successfully used in schools in the Denver area and throughout the country. He is willing to offer it free to teachers and others at the national conference to give them a program they can use with their students in their efforts to offer interventions and alternatives to violence. The conference presents a wonderful opportunity to describe this program and make this offer.

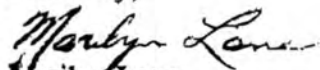
Dear Mr. Cerda,

It has come to my attention that President Clinton will be hosting a national conference on violence on October 15, 1998. As president of the California Center for Self-Esteem and vice-president of the National Association for Self-Esteem, I am most interested in information about the conference and sending a representative from our organizations.

Our focus has always been providing information and support to parents, educators, and counselors so children would grow up with healthy self-esteem and a sense of personal and social responsibility. We have become increasingly alarmed by children using violence against other children. Rather than focus on punishment, we are interested in commonalities in these children to learn how we, as a people, can provide esteeming environments and early intervention. Children who have been perpetrators of violence against other children have expressed feelings of inadequacy, humiliation and isolation, all symptoms of low self-esteem. The California Task Force on Self-Esteem and Personal and Social Responsibility provided a body of research to help us define ways for caregivers to promote healthy self-esteem in children. Recently, Mr. Robert Reasoner, currently president of the International Council for Self-Esteem and author of Building Self-Esteem, presented the results of his research on the connection between self-esteem and violence.

On October 9, 1998, we will be hosting an evening in Half Moon Bay about alternatives to violence. We hope it will be a prelude to a state and national campaign for Children Against Violence. We would, therefore, like to be a part of your national conference and support President Clinton in this important work.

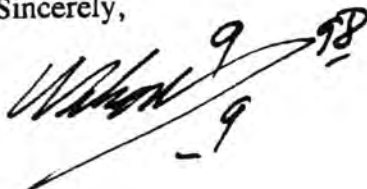
