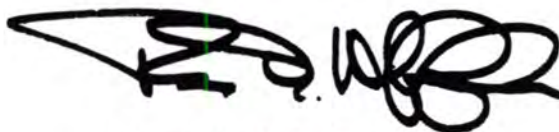
Dear Mr. President:

On October 21, 1998, the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) was reauthorized for five years (P.L. 105-277). As part of our continuing responsibilities, ONDCP must annually prepare a five-year drug budget recommendation to implement the *National Drug Control Strategy*. Enclosed is the first five-year proposal prepared under the new statute, covering FY 2000 to FY 2004. It highlights ONDCP's recommendations for over 30 drug funding priorities provided to the Cabinet earlier this year. This plan integrates the drug budget with the goals, objectives and targets of ONDCP's *Performance Measures of Effectiveness* (PME) system. It is designed to protect our young people, provide treatment to those most in need, reduce crime, secure our borders from drug traffickers, and target drug production in source countries.

ONDCP is further required to certify as to the adequacy of each Department's drug budget proposal to implement the *Strategy*. ONDCP has determined that the drug budgets of all departments and agencies have been certified for FY 2000. The enclosed plan includes a summary of ONDCP's budget certifications and highlights specific funding recommendations by program for each department.

The five-year drug budget is a comprehensive planning document that outlines the funding and programs needed in order for the *Strategy* to be successful. It will be updated annually to reflect the needs of all federal drug control programs. This plan ensures that sufficient resources are available for our efforts to reduce illegal drug use and its consequences in America. Your personal involvement and leadership has produced a strong, national response to the problem of drug use and trafficking. We can look forward to continued success on this issue.
