Submitted for your consideration is a request to make available \$120.5 million in previously appropriated emergency funds for the Department of Defense (DoD).

P.L. 105-277, the Omnibus Consolidated and Emergency Supplemental Appropriations Act, 1999, provided \$120.5 million in emergency funding to DoD for the procurement of crisis response aviation assets, contingent upon the President submitting a budget request to the Congress and designating the entire amount requested as an emergency requirement.

I recommend that you designate the amount requested as an emergency requirement in accordance with section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended. No further congressional action will be required.

The resources that you are making available will support the procurement of several aviation assets for use by Government agencies tasked with critical national security, law enforcement, and crisis response missions.

I have carefully reviewed this proposal and am satisfied that it is necessary at this time. Therefore, I recommend that you make the requested funds available by signing the enclosed letter to the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

PRIME MINISTER'S MEETING WITH PRESIDENT CLINTON

SPEAKING NOTES

- * Pakistan values its friendship with the US and seeks to rebuild an enduring partnership for peace and development.
- * We value the US renewed focus on South Asia and favour US active engagement for resolving South Asia's security problems especially Kashmir issue, that has become a nuclear flashpoint.
- * We encourage the US to take initiative for facilitating a peaceful solution of this dispute consistent with the wishes of the Kashmiri people and not based on freezing the unjust status-quo.
- * The US may consider appointing a Special Representative for Kashmir.
- * The US must also encourage, support and facilitate Pakistan-India dialogue.
- * The Pakistan-US dialogue on security and nuclear-related issues has progressed satisfactorily. On the four non-proliferation benchmarks set by the US, we have moved forward.
- * We have given a solemn political commitment not to transfer sensitive equipment or technology.
- * On questions relating to weaponization and deployment, we favour mutual restraint by Pakistan and India. The US should help build a Strategic Restraint Regime in South Asia.
- * We will participate in negotiations on Fissile Materials Treaty in the Conference on Disarmament in good faith. However, we cannot accept a unilateral or multilateral moratorium on production.
- * On CTBT, I have made a commitment to adhere by September 1999. This will be facilitated by removal of all sanctions and a substantial economic support package.
- * The IMF package will not be adequate. We request additional bilateral and multilateral assistance. US support for early approval and disbursement of assistance from IMF and IFIs as well as substantial debt relief would also be appreciated.
- * Removal of all sanctions particularly the Pakistan-specific Pressler Law is essential for evolving a mutually beneficial cooperative relationship and also putting an end to the atmosphere of coercion and pressure.
- * The US should consider removal of restrictions on transfer of technology to Pakistan.
- * The F-16s issue should be quickly settled. The US should help Pakistan upgrade its conventional capabilities. A list of our priority requirements is being handed over to Secretary Cohen.
- * We hope the US will not accord any preferential treatment to India in terms of status or incentives. (Security Council's permanent membership, high technology etc.)

ECONOMIC ISSUES

- 1) An earliest possible settlement in Paris Club. Your positive word to G-7 on this issue would be a great help. Paris Club may favourably consider due debt relief, longer grace period, concessional terms and extended repayment schedule.
- 2) US may consider extra debt relief in addition to the Paris Club settlement.
- 3) Quick and front-loaded disbursement by World Bank and Asian Development Bank.
- 4) An additional front-loaded disbursement by IMF under the ESAF and EFF, within our quota ceilings.
- 5) Due to export and remittances shortfall, IMF's support against our entitlement of US \$600 million under Compensatory Contingency Financial Facility (CCFF).
- 6) To eradicate poverty, World Bank may allocate atleast US 1.5 billion for Pakistan.
- 7) World Bank may consider Pakistan's access to new Emergency Facility recently created for countries in South East Asia and others.
- 8) Pakistan produces about 12% of world's cotton but our share of export earnings from cotton and textiles is less than 1% of world's earnings from cotton products. Extremely low export quantities of value added items at the time of textile quota fixation has unduly restricted Pakistan's access to U.S. market. I would request Mr. President, that our existing textile quotas of value added items may be doubled.

Dear Mr. President:

It is my understanding that you will be meeting with the Prime Minister of Pakistan during the first week of December. I have no doubt that you are thoroughly up to date on the serious problems independent power producers ("IPPs") are having with the Pakistani government, which has reneged on IPP agreements made under the previous Pakistani administration. However, I did want to make sure you are aware of Entergy's involvement in one such power development and our experiences to date. In 1994 Entergy Power Group joined a group of international investors in the \$1.6 billion Hub River Power Project. The Hub River Project is the largest foreign investment in the history of Pakistan and promises to provide the people of Pakistan with reliable, market-priced power well into the 21st century. The Project entered full commercial operation in 1997, and since then, has been reliably providing as much as 15 percent of the electrical generation needs of the country. With the Hub River Project in stable operation, Pakistan has been able to reduce the effects of acute power shortages that have plagued the country for the last decade and significantly reduced economic growth. In all aspects, the Project has been a splendid example of the beneficial effects of private infrastructure investment and World Bank support in the developing world.

Earlier this year, for reasons still unknown to the investors and managers of Hub River, the Government of Pakistan began a series of coordinated attacks against the Project and individuals associated with the Project. These actions include a unilateral reduction of the power price by the Lahore High Court, harassment of site personnel, detention without cause of former employees, raiding of the company offices by the Federal Investigative Agency and public allegations by senior members of the Government of corruption on the part of the Project. Unfortunately, this campaign has taken place without the Government of Pakistan providing a single piece of evidence to support its claims and has resulted in a significant economic loss for the investors of the Project.

Despite the failure to pay the full power price and other actions of the Government, the Project continues to operate according to the original contractual agreements. As an active member of Hub River's Board of Directors, Entergy is committed to the World Bank's "orderly framework" concept and will continue to support the management of the

Project according to the terms and conditions of the Project Agreements. We ask that the Government of Pakistan make the same commitment. At a time when Pakistan desperately needs international and IMF support, the actions of the last six months are unfair, unwarranted, and, while jeopardizing our Hub River Project, will ultimately create a very unfavorable climate for foreign investment within Pakistan.

We ask for your support explaining our position to the Government of Pakistan and in helping bring resolution to this important pressing issue. If any additional information on this subject is required, please feel free to call upon me. I look forward to seeing you again soon.

Dear President Clinton,

As its Chairman and as an African American, I am deeply disturbed by the threats to the well-being of the African Development Foundation. ADF is doing innovative work in creating jobs and growth through micro-enterprise development, improving community-based environmental management, and strengthening democratic values and institutions at the grassroots. The Foundation's philosophy of African-led development and its new trade and investment program directly support your Africa initiative. Moreover, ADF is doing the very type of work that you and the First Lady heralded during your historic trips to Africa, and it is doing it very well.

Nonetheless, the African Development Foundation is under fierce attack from the Congress and is suffering from benign neglect within the Administration.

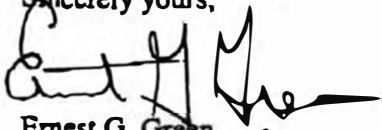
The Foundation's FY 1999 budget was slashed by Congress, and there are certain key staff members who are now set on abolishing ADF. As the *only* USG agency focussed solely on Africa, this is an unsubtle attack on the priority you have attached to Africa, Mr. President. It is also an affront to a valuable constituency who made the difference for our party in the recent elections. Thus, it is critical that the Administration sends a strong message of support for this small but unique and valuable agency.

Unfortunately, OMB's passback for FY 2000 - 20 percent less than our modest request - is, at best, a lukewarm endorsement of the excellent work ADF is doing in Africa, and it certainly does not seem consistent with your own policy priorities. Although budgets are tight, the \$18.0 million requested by the Foundation can be easily accommodated in a foreign affairs budget of more than \$20 billion.

We urgently need your support, Mr. President, for full funding of the African Development Foundation's fiscal year 2000 budget request.

As always, you can count on my assistance and support in advancing your goals.

Re: Radio Address—November 28, 1998

Thank you for mentioning The Salvation Army in your Radio Address last Saturday. We are glad for the opportunity to work with the government in seeking to alleviate human suffering.

As you would know, we are presently engaged in a very intensive time of raising funds to make it possible for us to serve more than 7 million people across America between Thanksgiving and Christmas. Last year we served just over 30 million people (one in 10 Americans) throughout the year.

I cannot believe that you are aware of this situation. However, it has reached the point of embarrassment for us to raise the issue, so we assume the matter is dead.

Having expressed my disappointment, let me just assure you that I continue to pray for you, Hillary, and Chelsea each morning.
