Doom Awaits Selects

As the House prepares to vote tomorrow on a resolution to reauthorize select committees until the end of the year, staffers on those panels — with help from lobbyists — are frantically appealing to Members in a desperate, last-ditch attempt to save their jobs.

But "the writing's on the wall," as one aide to a select committee chair put it. Last week's surprise 237 to 180 vote to kill the Select Committee on Narcotics Abuse and Control appears to have given unstoppable momentum to a bipartisan reform movement intent
