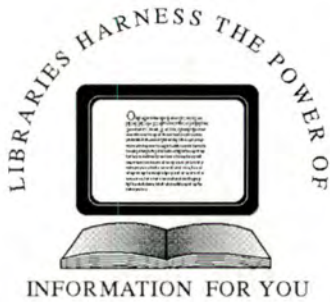

Albany, N.Y. --- It's official.

It was just before 9:30 p.m. Tuesday when first lady **Hillary Rodham Clinton** formally accepted the nomination of New York's state Democratic party as its candidate for the U.S. Senate.

Bathed in frequent applause by President Clinton and 11,500 others at the party's annual convention, **Mrs. Clinton** completed a journey that had begun nearly 11 months ago. She eventually reached into all 62 counties in New ...

"This is the chance of a lifetime," **Mrs. Clinton** said near the end of a 40-minute speech that touched on such grand themes as the need to unite all Americans ...

... any Republican opponent," she said, pausing slightly for emphasis. "It's about the people of New York and our common mission."

Mrs. Clinton may be breaking ground as the first first lady to run for national elective office, but she still got the traditional ...

... felt unprecedented, starting with the candidate herself and the singleminded determination of nearly everyone present to unite in support of her candidacy.

While **Mrs. Clinton's** nomination was never in doubt --- a party official who jokingly, yet traditionally, asked for the names of other ...

... tribute to her frequently embattled husband.

"I am delighted the president is here this evening and I am so grateful for his support," **Mrs. Clinton** said as Schumer and Moynihan came to their feet, almost pulling the president up with them. "I would not be standing here tonight if it were not ...

... Drum Corps presented the colors at 5:30 p.m., Giuliani's campaign e-



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mailed reporters a statement accusing **Mrs. Clinton** of trying to "reinvent" herself.

"There is still only one candidate in this race with the record of success and follow-through that has improved the lives of ...

But for the delegates here, this day was all about **Mrs. Clinton**.
