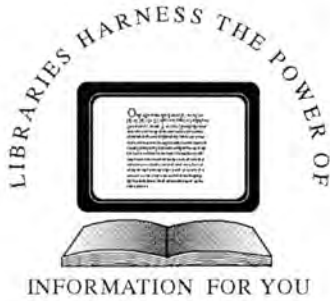

... Lazio told convention delegates with a grin that suggested he wasn't very upset at all, sizing up his opposition in **Mrs. Clinton**. "She comes to New York with the support of every left-wing special interest group, from Washington insiders to the Hollywood elite. But as ...

... planned to run until New York Gov. George Pataki persuaded him to give way to Giuliani last August. But **Mrs. Clinton** clearly had a head start in terms of fund-raising, campaigning and, it seemed, voter sentiment: In a poll taken before Giuliani dropped out, **Mrs. Clinton** led Lazio by 14 points in a hypothetical matchup.

Yet by the time the 400 delegates arrived here Tuesday, Lazio had effectively closed the gap. He and **Mrs. Clinton** now are in a statistical dead heat according to the same pollster, Zogby International.
