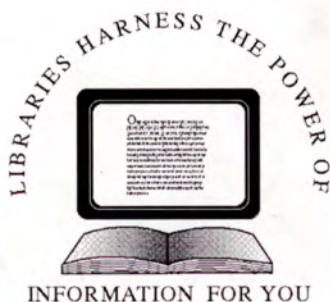

He said that despite **Mrs. Clinton's** role as disclosed by the investigation: "The evidence was insufficient to prove to a jury beyond a reasonable doubt that any of **Mrs. Clinton's** statements and testimony regarding her involvement in the travel office firings were knowingly false. Accordingly, the independent counsel has declined prosecution of **Mrs. Clinton.**"

The report filed with the special three-judge panel contains a fuller narrative of **Mrs. Clinton's** involvement in the firings and the testimony of several other witnesses, including Mr. Watkins.

The report will be kept under seal by the judicial panel for at least three months while **Mrs. Clinton**, Mr. Watkins and others mentioned in it are given a chance to review portions about them and respond if they choose. Its contents might then be disclosed in the final weeks of **Mrs. Clinton's** Senate campaign in New York.

Mr. Ray said that his office had also declined to prosecute Mr. Watkins for any false statements to investigators, particularly those in which he said that he had been pressured by **Mrs. Clinton** to dismiss the employees.
