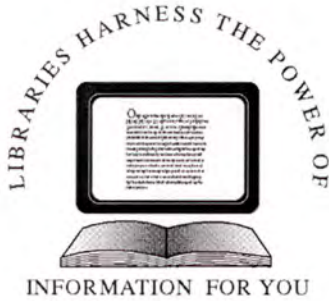

Similarly, the Anti-Defamation League said in a statement yesterday: "**Mrs. Clinton's** public record shows no evidence of anti-Semitism and we do not believe her to hold negative views about Jews."

Still, a wariness of **Mrs. Clinton** lingers. As the Queens rabbi noted, "Many people do not trust her. They really don't know what she thinks about Israel especially. Jews like to know these things. It helps them feel more secure."

Fray, his wife, Mary Lee, and campaign worker Neil McDonald have all told Newsday they heard the remark, but **Hillary Clinton** and President Bill Clinton—who was present when the remark was allegedly made—have denied it. Among other possible discrepancies, author Gail Sheehy, who also investigated the allegation for a **Hillary Clinton** biography, has said McDonald denied it during her research for the book last year.

Hillary Clinton denies using anti-Semitic slur

Hillary Rodham **Clinton** on Sunday firmly denied allegations from a forthcoming book that she used an anti-Semitic slur 26 years ago.

The allegation comes from a book due out this week, "State of a Union: Inside the Complex Marriage of Bill and **Hillary Clinton**," by former National Enquirer reporter Jerry Oppenheimer.

He quotes Paul Fray, who worked for President Bill Clinton's unsuccessful congressional campaign in Arkansas in 1974, as claiming that **Mrs. Clinton** called him a "Jew bastard" after Bill Clinton lost the election.

The Clinton Senate campaign released copies of a handwritten letter from Fray to **Hillary Clinton**, dated July 1, 1997. It states: "I have wronged you. I ask for your forgiveness. ... At one time in my life, I would say things ... without factual foundation. ... I beg your forgiveness."

Hillary Clinton said she was releasing the letter to show that "there's a history of these kinds of charges coming from the people in question. They've been false in the ...
