NEW YORK - Senate candidate **Hillary** Rodham **Clinton** said Friday that she made a mistake in using a government list of White House party guests to solicit political contributions.

"This was my error, absolutely my error," and not that of a campaign staffer, **Mrs. Clinton** said at a Manhattan campaign event.

Mrs. Clinton said the names were from a list of guests invited to a holiday party thrown by the Democratic National Committee at the ...

... party, but the invitation list is regarded as government property. It is considered improper to use the list for political purposes.

Mrs. Clinton's Senate opponent, Rep. Rick Lazio, has repeatedly criticized her fund-raising practices, accusing **Mrs. Clinton** of rewarding political contributors with invitations to stay in the Lincoln bedroom of the White House, and with using government resources for inappropriate ...

... wallowing in a new web of illegal fund-raising tactics and deception," a Lazio campaign statement said.

Mrs. Clinton said the names were inadvertently included with a list of people slated to receive fund-raising letters signed by the president.

" ...

... people who have been involved in political activities from events I have attended and events the president has attended, and there was a mix-up," **Mrs. Clinton** said. "That list of names was included in what I passed on to the campaign."

Mrs. Clinton said that once the campaign realized the mistake, it immediately moved to rectify the situation. "The practical effect was that five people made ...

... spokesman told the newspaper several weeks ago "that the White House social office had investigated and found no mingling of its lists with **Hillary Clinton's** fund-raising appeals." But the newspaper said one Post reporter received a fund-raising letter with his name misspelled in exactly the way it had been for an invitation to a White House party.

Mrs. Clinton said that the details of the mix-up show that it was not done intentionally.

"No campaign would deliberately solicit the press with any hope of any kind of return," she said.

On Friday, a new Marist poll showed **Mrs. Clinton** and Mr. Lazio in a statistical dead heat. The poll showed **Mrs. Clinton** at 47 percent to Mr. Lazio's 43 percent among registered voters, which falls within the poll's margin of error of plus or minus 4 percentage points.

A survey out last week from the Quinnipiac University Polling Institute had **Mrs. Clinton** leading Mr. Lazio, 50 percent to 43 percent, among likely voters.
