But the independent counsel's final report, issued three weeks before an election in which **Mrs. Clinton** is vying for a New York Senate seat, concluded that she played a role in the firings and that her statements to the contrary were " ...

"Despite that conclusion, the independent counsel believes that the evidence is insufficient to establish that **Mrs. Clinton's** statements regarding her role or input in the decision were knowingly false," the report said. "Accordingly, the independent counsel has exercised his discretion to decline prosecution."

Campaigning in New York, **Mrs. Clinton** welcomed a decision reached after "many millions of dollars, and many years later."

"The report recognizes that **Mrs. Clinton** was rightfully concerned about the financial improprieties in the travel office, and it begrudgingly acknowledges that she did not intend to influence the firing ...
