But **Mrs. Clinton** and her aides said they do not take the Nov. 7 election for granted. Neither does her Republican opponent, who squared off ...

... Friday in the final and most contentious of their three debates.

Mr. Lazio and supporters continue to predict a backlash against **Mrs. Clinton's** decision just last year to move to New York state and run for the Senate.

"We're going to win it," ...

... toward the dozens of Democrats who had just endorsed his candidacy, he said: "I think this is the right poll."

Other polls give **Mrs. Clinton** a more significant edge. A recent survey by Quinnipiac University gives the first lady a lead of ...

... University Polling Institute. "She's not moving either - but she's at 50."

Another recent poll by Newsday gave **Mrs. Clinton** a lead of 51 percent to 45 percent, with a margin of error of 4 percentage points. But Lazio supporters ...

... showed a 10-point gap last month. They were also heartened last week by a Zogby poll that showed **Mrs. Clinton** leading by only a point, well within the 4.5-percentage point margin of error.
