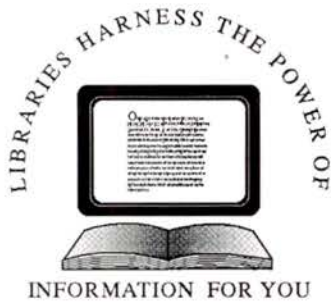

American ship in Yemen. The call criticized **Mrs. Clinton** for campaign contributions from a group that "openly brags about its support for a Mideast terrorism group - the same kind of terrorism that killed our sailors on USS Cole."

Mrs. Clinton's campaign returned \$ 50,000 collected at a fund-raiser with members of the American Muslim Alliance, some of whom support Palestinian ...

... raiser, even though she thanked one of the members in an Aug. 8 letter on White House stationery. **Mrs. Clinton** said she never saw that letter, which she described as a pro-forma response to a gift she received at the event.
