... for me for the next 24 hours, I will go to the Senate and fight for you for the next six years," **Mrs. Clinton** promised, as the crowd roared its approval, and reporters from as far away as Sweden and Germany and as near as Yeshiva University strained to see Moynihan and **Chelsea Clinton** nodding vehemently.

Lazio broke with tradition, campaigning right through Election Day, up to and including a rush-hour ...

... said Martin, a research institute administrator who moved from Minnesota seven years ago and planned to vote for **Mrs. Clinton** because of her intelligence and toughness. "Everybody comes to New York. Because everybody watches New York."

Whether it was a matter of who was watching or ...

... campaigning on upstate and the suburbs (hence the Grand Central Station appearance, to catch all those commuters), where it was crucial he do well to offset **Mrs. Clinton's** advantage in New York City.



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The relatively unknown fourth-term congressman from Long Island became a candidate ...

... Rudolph Giuliani dropped out due to prostate cancer and marital woes. No matter. Lazio immediately drew even with **Mrs. Clinton** in polls, and quickly raised nearly \$ 30 million from contributors around the country, many of them attracted by his simple direct-mail message: "I'm running against **Hillary Clinton.**"
