WASHINGTON - President **Clinton** and his wife, **Hillary**, claimed vindication Wednesday as the six-year Whitewater investigation ended with an announcement that there was not enough evidence to indict them.

... a year ago, wrote that "the evidence was insufficient to prove to a jury beyond a reasonable doubt that either President or **Mrs. Clinton** knowingly participated in any criminal conduct . . . " in Whitewater-related matters.

The terse assessment closed a \$ 52 ...

... covering up his sexual relationship with White House intern Monica Lewinsky.

But Wednesday's announcement was viewed by both **Clintons** with relief - **Hillary** Rodham **Clinton** because findings of wrongdoing could have torpedoed her Senate run in New York and her husband because nothing in the announcement stains his legacy.

"I'm just glad that this is finally over," **Hillary Clinton** said at an afternoon news conference a few hours after the release. "Most New Yorkers and Americans ...
