BIOGRAPHY OF FIRST LADY HILLARY RODHAM CLINTON

Hillary Diane Rodham was born in Chicago, Illinois, on October 26, 1947. The daughter of Dorothy Rodham and the late Hugh Rodham, she and her two younger brothers grew up in Park Ridge, Illinois, as part of a close-knit family. After graduating from Wellesley College in 1969, Hillary enrolled in Yale Law School, where she developed a strong concern for protecting the interests of children and families, and met Bill Clinton, a fellow law student.

Hillary married Bill Clinton in 1975. Their daughter, Chelsea, was born in 1980. While her husband served as governor of Arkansas, Hillary founded Arkansas Advocates for Children and Families, introduced Arkansas' Home Instruction Program for Preschool Youth, and worked tirelessly on behalf of children and families, while practicing law in Little Rock. She served on boards of organizations including the Children's Defense Fund and the American Bar Association Commission on Women in the Profession.

Upon taking office in 1993, President Clinton made health care reform one of the highest priorities of his Administration. He asked the First Lady to chair the Task Force on National Health Care Reform, and she continues to be a leading advocate for improving health care quality and providing health insurance for the uninsured and the underinsured. Her deep commitment to children has led the First Lady to champion an ambitious effort to increase immunizations for preschool-age children, push for an expansion of children's health insurance coverage, advocate for innovative prenatal care, and raise awareness of the impact of tobacco on children.

In 1996, the First Lady authored It Takes a Village and Other Lessons Children Teach Us, a national call for all sectors of society to take responsibility for our children. In her book, the First Lady emphasizes that while parents are the most important influence in their children's lives, and have the primary responsibility in raising them, society also plays an important role in rearing our nation's children. She stresses that ultimately children will thrive only if all of society provides for them. In addition, since 1995, the First Lady has penned a weekly syndicated newspaper column, "Talking It Over". In this column, she draws upon her experiences as First Lady and on her observations of women, children, and families she has met across the country and around the world.

In 1997, the First Lady, along with the President, hosted two important conferences on children's issues. The First Lady played a strong role at the *White House Conference on Early Childhood Development and Learning*, where experts emphasized that the success a child has in reaching their full potential is influenced by what they experience during their critical early years. The *White House Conference on Child Care* drew attention to the struggles our nation's working parents face in finding child care they can afford, trust and rely on. This conference played an important role in developing the President's historic child care initiative - - the largest investment in child care in our nation's history - - to make child care better, safer, and more affordable for America's working families.

The First Lady helped create the White House Millennium Council to engage all Americans in marking the millennial milestone. Through such millennium projects as Millennium Evenings at the White House and the Save America's Treasures partnership, the First Lady has encouraged all Americans to "Honor the Past, Imagine the Future" to remind us to preserve our culture and heritage and to enhance life for future generations.

The First Lady has also worked tirelessly to reform our nation's foster care system and promote adoption. Through meetings with adoptive families and children in foster care, writings and speeches, the First Lady has focused on making it easier for children to move from foster care to permanent homes, and on increasing the number of adoptions. The First Lady played an important role in legislative reform, and was central to the passage of the Adoption and Safe Family Act of 1997.

In addition to her work at home, the First Lady serves as a goodwill ambassador for the United States during her visits abroad. From Europe to Asia, Africa to Latin America, the First Lady takes her message of human rights, health care, and economic empowerment for women across the globe. During her trips, the First Lady has advocated for human rights, promoted microcredit as a means to economic self-sufficiency, pushed for equality in education for girls and boys, and spoken of the importance of health care with an emphasis on meeting the critical needs of women and children, including family planning and safe motherhood. She has also been a leading voice for democracy building, for women's rights, and for the developing of a voluntary sector in emerging democracies.

Like her predecessors, First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton brings to the role of First Lady of the United States her own special talents, experience, and interests.

She's a consistent, strong and long-time voice for children, and the kind of leadership she's provided on education in Arkansas has certainly had a national impact," Edelman said from fund headquarters in Washington. " I'm grateful that she is my boss and my friend." Sight unseen, he appointed Hillary Clinton as the commission's first chairman on the recommendations

An example is the Home Instruction Program for Preschool Youngsters (HIPPO), started in 1985. The first lady was behind the program, which gives pre-school children an educational boost by teaching mothers to teach their 4- and 5-year-olds at home. By last March, about 1,600 disadvantaged children were enrolled in 19 HIPPO projects around the state, which now is funded by federal and school district money. The Clintons tried to get \$10 million from the General Assembly last year to enroll 8,000 disadvantaged children in HIPPO projects and similar programs, but had no luck and vow to try again in 1991. "Without her, we wouldn't have been able to put the HIPPO program together," the governor said. "She's been able to focus on one or two issues that she cares about while I deal with a whole range of other things." What critics say Along the way, Hillary Clinton has earned a reputation as demanding and impatient and, in the heat of political battle, she has been described as pushy, cold and domineering. The criticism intensified in May when she crashed a news conference called by Tom Mc Rae, her husband's principal opponent for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination. She accused Mc Rae of slamming the governor at a time when he was out of state. And she was angered by Mc Rae's display of a caricature of her husband without clothes. Occasionally leafing through documents she'd brought with her, she pointed out contradictions in Mc Rae's positions and expressed general disappointment in his campaign. Mc Rae said then and again recently that the incident gave his campaign publicity and credibility that had been in short supply until that point. He said he admires the first lady. U. S. Rep. Tommy Robinson, R-Ark., who unsuccessfully sought the Republican nomination, wasn't as charitable about the Mc Rae/Clinton confrontation. He suggested at the time that the first lady had been the real governor for 10 years. As director of public safety during the governor's first term, he said, he "had to put up with her tirades before." But Robinson's attitude has since softened. Recently, he praised the first lady for her toughness, intelligence and debating skills. He said she would be a strong candidate if she ever decided to run for public office. "As someone who worked in the governor's first administration," Robinson said, "I know of times when Mrs. Clinton made the tough decisions that others did not have the courage to make." Hillary Clinton is not bothered by those who say she should stand 369564369563369565601280 who yvtnhb Y':#back and let her husband fight his own battles. "If it were a man," she said, "they would probably say what a great, strong person this fellow is, how commanding he is and all the rest. ... I'm not reluctant to say what's on my mind, and if some people interpret that one way instead of another, I can't help that." Sacrifice Being the governor's wife hasn't come without sacrifices and concessions to the nature of politics. She took her husband's surname out of fear of offending voters. On two occasions, Hillary Clinton dropped her legal practice altogether once to help with her husband's comeback after the 1980 defeat and again in 1983 to work on the school standards. "In 1982 and again in 1983, I had no time to practice law and that's also been a financial disadvantage," she said. "But in both instances, I really believed in what I was doing." She won't reveal her full-time salary, but said it's in the six-figure range. Her husband annual salary is \$35,000, the lowest among the nation's governors. That has given rise to derisive jokes that Hillary Clinton's lucrative salary allows her husband to massage his political ego. Both have heard the jokes and dismiss them. "She's made a lot of sacrifices for me to be in public life," the governor said. "But neither one of us ever cared about getting rich." Her activism also cuts into her billable hours as a lawyer, but Webb Hubbell, a close friend who is also a senior partner at the Rose Law Firm, says nobody there minds. "It's difficult in that there are so many demands on her time that she has to narrow the number and types of cases she works on," said Hubbell, who joined Clinton last year on the list of the state's best litigation attorneys. "But her visibility is a tremendous asset because once people meet her, they want to hire her." Trade-offs Hillary Clinton has little time for a social life. But at least one friend said the first lady is far from a wallflower. "She's witty, she's funny and real easy-going," said Susan Fleming. Fleming's daughter, Elizabeth, is the best friend of the

Clintons' only child, Chelsea, 10. The mothers and daughters often get together." We go to the movies, on trips and we have an annual lunch at the end of the summer, just a lot of the kinds of things that mothers and daughters do," Fleming said, adding that the first lady's devotion as a parent is overshadowed by other activities." That's a side of her that I don't think a lot of people know, but she's a truly great mother," Fleming said. " She relates to kids in a different way than a lot of adults I know. She doesn't talk down to them, and, as a result, she can have some incredible conversations with kids." Both Clintons said they would love to have more children." My view is if it happens, it happens," Hillary Clinton said. " We both would like to have more but it just hasn't happened." What does the future hold for Hillary Clinton?" I just kind of wait and see what a happens and make the best of what I'm doing at the time, and that's always worked for me," she said. Any decision on a race for elective office will come only after her husband's political career runs its course." If he made the decision not to do it, then I might think about it," she said. " But I really don't have any future plans. In this political business, you can't really plan, anyway."

While parents have the primary responsibility for raising their children, we all have a role in helping our nation's young people to achieve their full potential. Mrs. Clinton has used her voice as First Lady to remind Americans of our responsibility for helping our children, particularly those who are most vulnerable.

As the Administration's most prominent advocate on foster care and adoption, Mrs. Clinton has worked on behalf of the over 500,000 children who live in foster care because of abuse or neglect. She has promoted the adoption of children living in foster care and worked for passage of the Adoption and Safe Families Act of 1997, landmark legislation which reformed our nation's child welfare system by putting considerations of children's health and safety first.

Mrs. Clinton has also taken a special interest in educating Americans about the importance of children's earliest experiences to their future development. In 1997, she hosted the White House Conference on Early Childhood Development and Learning: What New Research on the Brain Tells Us About Our Youngest Children. She has worked for Head Start expansion and quality improvements and successfully advocated for increased funding for programs serving young children. In 1997, the First Lady launched the Prescription for Reading Partnership in which pediatricians and other health professionals "prescribe" reading to new parents as an activity that will enhance children's development.

Mrs. Clinton has also directed her attention to our nation's youth, encouraging the development of positive opportunities for young people and ways to help them avoid substance abuse, teen pregnancy and delinquency. She helped to launch the National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy and hosted the 1998 White House Conference on School Safety: Causes and Prevention of Youth Violence and participated in the recent White House Strategy Meeting on Children, Violence and Responsibility. The First Lady was also instrumental in the development of the AmeriCorps National Service Program through which young people may perform a year of full-time service in exchange for scholarships or student loan forgiveness.

Advancing Women's Economic Security and Empowerment

Today more women than ever work outside the home and contribute to the economic security of their families. Yet, women can face significant challenges in the workplace -- they are more likely to rely on minimum wage work; they too often are paid less than men for the same work; they may have difficulty gaining access to credit to start small businesses; and, while they live longer than men, they reach retirement with smaller pensions and other assets.

As First Lady, Mrs. Clinton has championed efforts to help ensure the economic security of women and their families. For example, she has advocated access to microcredit -- small loans made to non-traditional borrowers -- to enable thousands of American women to start their own small businesses. Mrs. Clinton also has supported the Administration's efforts to increase the minimum wage, promote equal pay laws, and fund legal services for low-income families. She has worked to ensure that bankruptcy reform does not adversely impact women and families, particularly in terms of child support collection. In the Social Security debate she has focused her attention on ensuring that the features of Social Security that are important to women are preserved and strengthened.
