**THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. CLINTON HOST DINNER IN
CELEBRATION OF THOMAS JEFFERSON**

WASHINGTON, DC -- The President and Mrs. Clinton are hosting a formal dinner tonight culminating the 250th birth year of Thomas Jefferson, the third President of the United States. The black tie dinner will be held at the United States Department of State's Diplomatic Reception Rooms. Guests will begin arriving at the State Department's main entrance at 7:15 PM.

The President and Mrs. Clinton will receive guests in the John Quincy Adams Drawing Room. During the receiving line guests will be entertained by musical selections from the Jefferson Library.

The 180 guests will be seated in the Department of State's Benjamin Franklin State Dining Room. The tables will be set with the official State Department China on floral and striped table clothes. The floral center pieces include Candia Roses, Peach Peonies and Oceania Roses.

Following dinner guests will be entertained by Clay Jenkinson the co-founder of the modern humanities Chautauqua movement, in which scholars portray historical characters. Mr. Jenkinson will present guests with his in-character portrayal of Thomas Jefferson.

"The genius of Thomas Jefferson was his ability to get the most out of today while never taking his eye off tomorrow, so think big while enjoying the little things of daily life. Perhaps most important, he understood that in order for us to preserve our timeless values, people have to change... For in the end, Thomas Jefferson understood that no politician, no government, no piece of paper could do for the American people what they would have to do for themselves. He understood better perhaps than any of his colleagues that the people of this country would always have to be not only the protectors of their own liberty but the agents of their own transformation."
