First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton Joins Northwestern Memorial at Dedication of the Hospital of the Future in Chicago

(CHICAGO) -- First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton helped Northwestern Memorial launch a new era in healthcare today at the dedication of its state-of-the-art hospital. The First Lady delivered the keynote address and cut the ribbon along with Chicago Mayor Richard M. Daley, Gary Mecklenburg, the hospital's president and chief executive officer, and Kathleen Murray, executive vice president and chief operating officer, in front of an audience of dignitaries and friends of Northwestern Memorial.

Mayor Daley, long a proponent of world-class healthcare for all Chicagoans, introduced the First Lady at the dedication ceremony and praised Northwestern Memorial's commitment to patients and community service.

"Construction of the new Northwestern Memorial has been a boon for the city of Chicago. The decade-long project has contributed some 5,000 new jobs and given more than \$100 million in contracts to women- and minority-owned businesses," Daley said. "This new hospital is a model of 21st century patient care and we are proud to have it in the heart of Chicago." (Quote pending approval from Mayor's Office)

The \$580 million, 2-million-square-foot hospital, located at 251 E. Huron St., is designed to serve a growing trend in outpatient care while providing inpatients with superior treatment and comfort. An 8-floor base of shared facilities connects the 22-story Galter Outpatient Pavilion and the 17-story Feinberg Inpatient Pavilion.

"Our vision to create one of the most advanced academic medical centers in the world has become a reality, and we are honored that the First Lady, a passionate voice for improving the country's healthcare system, has joined us to dedicate our new facility," said Mecklenburg.

"Every aspect of the new building reflects the efforts of thousands of people who are dedicated to providing patients with superior care well into the future," he said.

"After more than a decade of planning, design and construction, we are proud that the dedication day for our new hospital has arrived and that the First Lady has joined us to celebrate its successful completion," said James Denny, chairman of the Northwestern Memorial board. "The care with which this work was carried out ensures that our new building will continue to embody the 'Patients First' philosophy into the 21st century."

The layout, look and feel of the new Northwestern Memorial can be credited to many people.

"More than 100 user groups -- made up of patients and their family members, nurses, doctors and a variety of hospital employees -- joined the planning team," said Murray. "The groups made many design suggestions based on their real-life experience. As a result, the new hospital is focused on the patient: care is that is more efficient, supportive and comfortable for the patient."

In the Feinberg Inpatient Pavilion, each of the 492 patient rooms is private. All 400 regular patient rooms include a pullout bed to accommodate a family member's overnight stay and large, low windows. Each of the 92 intensive care rooms also boasts large windows -- a rarity in such units. Among the other patient- and family-friendly innovations:

- A new system enables registration prior to admission or at the point of care.
- Separate public and patient areas promote privacy.
- Bi-lingual signage and floor plans make the new hospital easy to navigate.
- A comprehensive infection control program includes sophisticated filtered airflow throughout the facility, as well as separate sinks in each room for caregivers to facilitate frequent hand washing. Northwestern Memorial is a national leader on controlling infectious diseases within the hospital. The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention designated Northwestern Memorial as a Center for Excellence in Health Care Epidemiology and Infection Control (EpiCenter).
- Waiting rooms are spacious and window-filled, providing family members and friends with a pleasant and comfortable environment.

- More than 1,800 pieces of artwork carefully selected to promote healing have been mounted in patient rooms, corridors, treatment areas and waiting rooms.

The Galter Outpatient Pavilion has clinical space for 600 physicians. The top seven floors are owned by the Northwestern Medical Faculty Foundation, the hospital's largest affiliated physicians group and a partner in the project. Nearly 200 private Northwestern Memorial physicians also will be located in the Galter Outpatient Pavilion. Ambulatory services occupy most of the tower, so a visiting patient can see a physician, complete tests, even undergo an outpatient surgical procedure without leaving the building.

Technology Advances Patient Care

Cutting-edge technology and a sophisticated communications system will accommodate scientific and medical advances well into the 21st century.

The new hospital has 32 high-tech operating rooms, an expanded Emergency Department and filmless, digital technology in the Radiology Department.

State-of-the-art technology is the centerpiece of all the new operating rooms. Video monitors, "telemedicine" cameras and movable power and anesthesia booms make operating rooms more flexible and put important equipment closer to surgeons' fingertips. A few floors down in the Emergency Department, space has been doubled to handle more than 55,000 patient visits a year. The new emergency area features an on-site computed tomography (CT) scanner and three radiology rooms for more efficient care.

Northwestern Memorial is the primary teaching hospital of Northwestern University Medical School, a member of the Northwestern Healthcare Network and is widely recognized as one of the nation's pre-eminent medical centers.

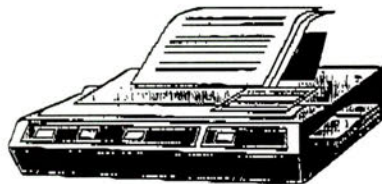
